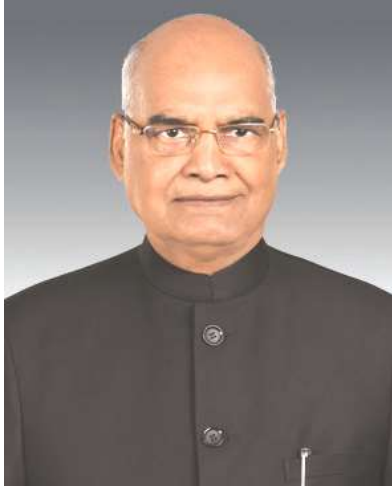
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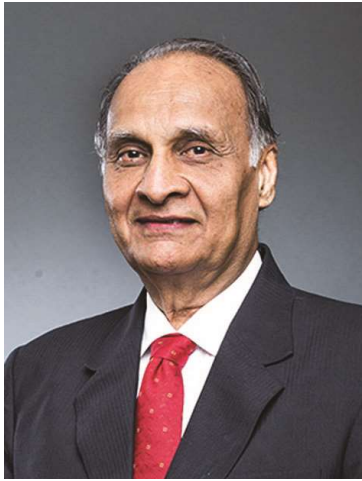

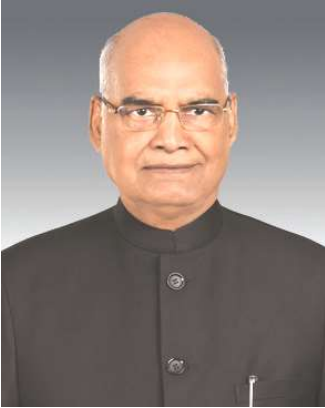

A lawyer, veteran political representative, and long-time advocate of egalitarianism and integrity in Indian public life and society, Shri Ram Nath Kovind was born on October 1, 1945, in Paraunkh, near Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh. His parents were ShriMaikuLal and SmtKalawati.

Before assuming charge of the office of the 14th President of India on July 25, 2017, Shri Kovind served as the 36th Governor of the state of Bihar from August 16, 2015, to June 20, 2017.

Educational and Professional Background

Shri Kovind completed his school education in Kanpur and obtained the degrees of B.Com and L.L.B. from Kanpur University. In 1971, he enrolled as an Advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi.

Shri Kovind was Union Government Advocate in the Delhi High Court from 1977 to 1979 and Union Government Standing Counsel in the Supreme Court from 1980 to 1993. He became Advocate-on-Record of the Supreme Court of India in 1978. He practiced at the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court for 16 years till 1993.

Parliamentary and Public Life

Shri Kovind was elected as a member of the Rajya Sabha from Uttar Pradesh in April 1994. He served for two consecutive terms of six years each till March 2006. Shri Kovind served on various Parliamentary Committees like Parliamentary Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes/Tribes; Parliamentary Committee on Home Affairs; Parliamentary Committee on Petroleum and Natural Gas; Parliamentary Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment; and Parliamentary Committee on Law and Justice. He was Chairman of the Rajya Sabha House Committee.

Shri Kovind also served as Member of the Board of Management of the Dr. B.R Ambedkar University, Lucknow, and Member of the Board of Governors of the Indian Institute of Management, Kolkata. He was part of the Indian delegation at the United Nations and addressed the United Nations General Assembly in October 2002.

From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk

Hello everyone!

I feel very happy to present before you the annual report of the University of Allahabad for the academic year 2019-20. The report provides the profile of the various departments/units of the University, such as outline of courses, data related with student's enrolment, activities performed by them and the achievements made by the staff and the students.

When, like all other years, on the night of 31st December 2019, we were ringing out the old 2019 and welcoming the new year 2020, we never knew what is there in store for us in the coming 2020. We all faced an unprecedented situation due to the pandemic COVID-19 in this academic year – a situation which one had never even imagined – that one shall be under lockdown for days together due to an invisible virus. This little entity troubled the entire world and has given us many lessons to learn for the future. It compelled all the teaching institutions, including the University of Allahabad, to go for on-line learning so that the academic calendar is least affected. I must thank all the faculty members for accepting the sudden challenge thrown upon them and to come out with all types of viable solutions to somehow connect with the students to complete the remaining syllabi. Looking at the problems that teachers were facing with regard to the connectivity, the University designed its own online portal “Learning Management System” where department-wise learning material of the faculty members has been uploaded for the benefit of the student community. With the help of all, this portal will be further strengthened in the days to come. The University is in the process of establishing its own video studio which shall be functional from July, 2020. It will ensure recording of good quality lectures of the faculty members which shall be uploaded on the portal in future. We all know, as a faculty, that there is no replacement of face-to-face teaching but it appears that in the next session also, at least for the first few months, we shall have to cover most of the teaching in the online mode only because of the social distancing norms and other related problems due to the current pandemic.

This pandemic also acted as a catalyst towards the creation of a “Work From Home” environment in the University. A team of bright students is working to provide a good solution within a month's time. A dedicated server is being installed for uploading the documents of office/accounts section so that in future a “work from home” environment is available in the University. Once it is in place, the University will have a paperless office. Currently, it is a big challenge for the University to conduct the pending examinations of this academic session and to admit the new students in the session 2020-21.

The University is moving ahead on the path of success and is doing well on all fronts. In the last NAAC accreditation, done after a long gap, the University got the B++ grade. Out of the five components of the University – administration, faculty, non-teaching staff, students and alumni – the last two components are most important. Once the students realise that the University belongs to them, once they ensure that the teaching environment is never disturbed in the campus and the alumni associate with their alma-mater as often as possible to provide their valuable suggestions for the betterment of their juniors, I am very sure that the University will touch new heights. An Alumni portal is being integrated with the

main website of the University to request alumni to provide their most valuable suggestions for the betterment of their alma mater. This will make the entire environment vibrant and bubbling with activities and enthusiasm.

The University fully understands its responsibility of capacity building for nation development. The highest priority needs to be given to raise the bar of teaching, learning, research & development and innovation in the University.

With the kind help of MHRD, a new centre of Vocational Education & Skill Development has come up in the University to provide skilled manpower to the country. Initially it will provide technicians in the area of networking, storage and computer peripherals to the country. A B.Voc. program in Software development has been launched so that professionals are available to provide local computing applications, aiming in the direction of Self Reliant Bharat.

The University is ensuring optimal utilization of ICT tools in administration and teaching and is committed towards making the University web-enabled in all possible ways. In the recent lockdown period due to the pandemic, to keep the faculty and the students mentally engaged, many departments of the University organized webinars, even inviting experts from abroad for exchange of thoughts.

So far as infrastructure development is concerned, Vijayanagram Hall and Tilak Bhawan is ready to be inaugurated. Within six month's time, the following new complexes shall be available to the University;

- (a) IshwarTopa Academic Complex in the Arts Campus of the University, where cubicles for teaching faculty and big size lecture theatres shall be available to conduct theory classes
- (b) Sophisticated Analytical Instrument Facility and M. N. Saha Centre for Space Studies in the Science Faculty, facilitating Faculty and Researchers to do good quality research work
- (c) Student Activity Centre providing space for meeting, Library, Gym and Cafeteria to the student community
- (d) 36 room Boy's Hostel where 72 students will be accommodated

Besides above construction activities, foundation stone of another 60 room Girl's Hostel has been laid in the Women's hostel premises where 120 Girl students will be accommodated. This construction work shall be completed by March, 2021.

These efforts will help the University to gain its lost glory and create its own space among the Institutions of higher learning in the country and abroad. We have to expand our wings for a much wider reach in the society so that we may provide the best human resource to the society. This shall be possible only when each one of us is not only aware of one's right but one's duty as well. One has to give one's everything for the progress and betterment of the university.

I am sure that once we all realize well what our duties are and make a focused and concerted effort to realize the goal that we set, we shall not only be able to achieve our goal but shall go far beyond that.

I would like to express my deep sense of gratitude to the Hon'ble Visitor, Hon'ble Chief Rector and Hon'ble Chancellor of the University for their constant support and encouragement. I thank the members of the Court, Executive Council, Academic Council and the Finance Committee for their Guidance and support. Thanks are also due to all the members of the Annual Reports Committee, Prof. A.K.Rai, Dean (R & D) and his entire team, to bring out this publication in record time.

The report contains the brief details of the University. I hope this information will be useful to the readers.

MILESTONE OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University of Allahabad, established in 1887, is the fourth oldest in India and has to its credit significant academic attainments and contributions towards the promotion of higher education in the country. The University has been a unitary teaching institution (with certain kinds of institutions admitted to its privileges) since 1921, the year it came under Provincial (i. e. State) jurisdiction.

In recognition of its role, endeavours, and contribution in the fields of higher learning, national development, and social engagement, and with a view to help it realize its potential at the national level, the University has been re-incorporated by Parliament, upon the recommendation of the Government of India to that effect, as a Central University by means of the University of Allahabad Act 2005, which received the assent of the President on June 23, 2005, and has commenced on July 14, 2005.

The change in status from State to Central University has been accompanied by significant changes in the functional set-up, inter alia in respect of the constitution of its authorities, the modes and subject matter of internal legislation (the Statutes and the Ordinances), appointment and recruitment procedures, and provisions relating to institutions admitted to the privileges of the University.

The University was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in April 2019, and accredited with a rating of B++.

Presently the University has four faculties; Arts, Commerce, Law, and Science; three university institutes: the Institute of Inter-Disciplinary Studies, the Institute of Professional Studies, and the National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology and one independent university Centre of Behavioural and Cognitive Sciences; one constituent institute: Govind Ballabh Pant Social Science Institute and eleven constituent colleges: Ewing Christian College, Chowdhary Mahadev Prasad Degree College, Allahabad Degree College, Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Govt. Degree College, Ishwar Sharan Degree College, Sandanlal Sawaldas Khanna Degree College, Arya Kanya Girls Degree College, Jagat Taran Girls Degree College, Rajarshi Tandon Girls Degree College, Hamidia Girls' Degree College and K. P. Training College. Under the stewardship of distinguished Vice-Chancellors (Sir Ganganatha Jha, Pt. Iqbal Narain Gurtu, Prof. Amaranatha Jha and Prof. Tara Chand) and the academic leadership of illustrious faculty, the University took determined steps to enlarge its intellectual and educational ambit and gave a lead in national emancipation. In view of its achievements, as well as its position among the universities of Uttar Pradesh, the state government accorded it formal recognition in July 1992 as a 'Premier Institution' (Vishesh Agrani Sanstha), and at one point in time, it was called the "Oxford of the East". Several teachers and students played a prominent role in the national struggle, particularly from 1930, and the University solemnly recalls with pride the martyrdom of its student Lal Padmadhar Singh during the Quit India Movement

The University has had on its rolls a host of politicians and statesmen including one president and two vice-presidents of India, two former prime ministers, several union and state ministers, at least four chief justices of the Supreme Court, besides a large number of senior bureaucrats and has contributed immensely to the Defence Sector of the Country.

The scholars who gave an idiosyncratic aroma to the academic vibes of the University, from its first venture into teaching in 1905, are too numerous to be named individually, and included such legendary figures as Amaranatha Jha, Raghupati Sahai "Firaq", S. C. Deb and P. E. Dastoor (English), H. N. Randle, R. D. Ranade, and A. C. Mukerji (Philosophy), L. F. Rushbrook Williams, Sir Shafaat Ahmad Khan, R. P. Tripathi, G. R. Sharma, D. C. Panday (History), Syed Muhammad Ali Nami and M. G. Zubaid Ahmad (Arabic and Persian), Udai Narayan Tiwari (Linguistics), P. K. Acharya, Babu Ram Saxena and Kshetresh Chandra Chattopadhyaya (Sanskrit), Dharendra Verma, Devi Prasad Shukla and Ram Kumar Verma (Hindi), Syed M. Zamin Ali and Muhammad Hafiz Syed (Urdu), Beni Prasad, Tara Chand, Ishwari Prasad (all three being historians of repute) and A. B. Lal (Political Science), R. N. Dubey (Geography), P. S. Naidu, S.B. Adawal (Education), Meghnad Saha, K. S. Krishnan, D. S. Kothari, Salig Ram Bhargava, R. N. Ghosh G. B. Deodhar and K Banerjee, Prof. Rajendra Prasad Singh nickname Rju Bhaiya (Physics), N. R. Dhar, Satyeshwar Ghosh and Satya Prakash (Chemistry), A. C. Banerji, Gorakh Prasad, P. L. Srivastava and B. N. Prasad (Mathematics), J. H. Mitter, Shri Ranjan, R. K. Saxena and R. N. Tandon (Botany), D. R. Bhattacharya and H. R. Mehra (Zoology), H. Stanley Jevons, S. K. Rudra, C. D. Thompson, B. P. Adarka and J. K. Mehta (Economics), M. K. Ghosh and R. C. Choudhury (Commerce) and J. C. Weir, M. U. S. Jung, K. K. Bhattacharya, K. R. R. Sastry and T. N. Sapru (Law).

The University is now exploring the new magnitude of the institutional achievement, by renovating its academic system, reinforcing and augmenting its teaching, research and residential facilities and pursuing social purposes in a coordinated manner, to keep pace with international standards in these areas and endow human resource with the capabilities to serve the nation in the special context of the challenges and imperatives of globalization.

- The preparation of human resource of the highest possible quality, capability and motivation, appropriately equipped for fulfilling the needs and expectations of society, the nation and humanity and playing a constructive role in social advancement, national progress and human development.

- The optimum deployment of placement activities of the students

HIGHLIGHTS OF UNIVERSITY INITIATIVES

ACADEMICS

- The NAAC accreditation body visited the University after a long gap. Because of the shortage of teaching faculty, the University got B++ grade (CGPA: 2.86) on April 1, 2019.
- The entire world faced an unprecedented situation due to the pandemic COVID-19. The entire regular activity was disrupted, and the country went to the lockdown mode on March 24, 2020. To address that the academic calendar is least disturbed, the University of Allahabad had to initiate online teaching. The faculty members accepted the challenge and connected with the students by conducting online classes in various ways to complete the remaining syllabi. The progress report of online teaching status was submitted to MHRD on daily basis.
- Because of the technical issues of poor connectivity, etc. as many students were there in remote areas, like other Universities, the University of Allahabad also faced problems in connecting with its students. To address this problem effectively, the University designed its own online learning portal on the Moodle platform by the name "Learning Management System." The link to the portal is lms.univ.ac.in. Department-wise learning material of the faculty members has been uploaded on this portal for the benefit of the student community.
- To supplement ONLINE teaching in a better way and organised manner, the University is in the process of establishing its own video studio, which shall be functional by the end of July 2020. The University will then record good quality lectures of the faculty members, not only to be uploaded on the University portal but on the public learning portals as well.
- Major funding under DST-PURSE, DST-HFIBF, and DST-fMRI and National Genomic Core Project were provided to the University.
- Alumni are a very important component of the University system. An Alumni portal has been created and linked with the main website of the University so that the Alumni may provide their valuable feedback and can connect with the present students for their better future. The link to the portal is lms.alluniv.ac.in/alumni/.
- An innovative centre of Vocational Education & Skill Development has been created in the University to deliver trained and skilled human resources to the country so that the country may become self-reliant. In the first phase, it will provide manpower in the area of Software application packages development, designing and providing a networked environment and maintenance of computing peripherals, storage, etc.
- To make University web-enabled, the best utilization of ICT tools in administration and teaching is warranted.
- Because of the lockdown, it was not possible for the departments to organize conferences, seminars, or workshops in the normal mode. So the departments had to switch over to the virtual mode. Different departments of the University and its constituent Colleges organized webinars to mentally engage the faculty members and the student community during the lockdown period.
- UGC has included the University of Allahabad for the Hindi translation of various MOOC programs of UGC/MHRD.
- CBCS has been implemented in the University in all academic programs at the PG level and also in all professional UG courses.
- The extra-mural funding has increased as new departments were granted DST-FIST support.
- First time Ph.D. students were also enrolled in the constituent colleges of the University.
- The first batch of PG (MA in Women's Studies) has just passed out, and eight batches of Certificate Course in "Understanding Gender" have completed the course.
- Ph.D. Ordinance of the University has been revised and approved by the statutory bodies of the University.
- Invited lectures under the Distinguished Lecture Series by Distinguished academician and societal experts were organized and put on the University website.
- National and International Seminars were organized throughout the year in nearly all the academic units before March 2020.
- University got connected with other Centres of advanced learning in the country as well as abroad through national and international collaborative arrangements and MoUs.

- Students of the University visited the Heidelberg University under the DBT sponsored Big Data Research.
- Due to the COVID-19 lockdown, online/virtual placement of the students was started, and up to March 31, 2020, nearly 1500 students are at various stages of the online selection process in four organizations viz. Genpact, Embibe (Reliance Jio), Azim Premji Foundation, and Sampark Foundation.
- To enhance the quality, quantity, and frequency of placement activities, collaborative effort has been initiated.
- The procurement of new types of equipment in various departments was done through equipment grants by the Government e-Market.
- Timely and continuous monitoring of the progress of the research students has drastically improved the research standards and quality of Ph.D. Program of the University.
- The Library subscribed to 268 journals, approx. 22017+ e-journals and 14 e-databases. The access of these resources was provided through UGC-INFLIBNET Consortium, i.e., e-Shodhsindhu, and subscription by the University.
- Approximately 527 student researchers and educators from various universities/institutes of the country visited to access the resources accessible in the Library of the University for their research work.
- Many of the faculty members and students of the University bagged prestigious fellowships and awards of national and international importance.
- The Convocation of the University was held on September 5, 2019 after a long gap. The University has decided to hold the Convocation every year.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

- Due to the current pandemic COVID-19, the University faced a severe problem of staff movement as the entire country went to lockdown mode on March 24, 2020. They had to come to the University or the camp office after seeking the movement pass from the district administration so that the salary of the staff and scholarships to the students could be disbursed in time, and other important issues could be addressed. The University was already working in the direction of the creation of a paperless office, but this pandemic acted as a catalyst. The University is actively working towards the creation of the "work from Home" environment in the institution. A dedicated server is being installed for uploading the documents of the office/accounts section, and appropriate software is being designed in-house. This environment, hopefully, shall be in place by the end of July 2020, making the University a paperless office.
- Several eligible faculty members of the University and Colleges were promoted under CAS.
- The General Financial Rules (GFR)-2017 and its subsequent amendments are being strictly followed.
- E-procurement (e-tendering and e-publishing) system and GeM are fully functional in the University for procurement of goods and services as well as for works (manpower) allotment.
- The VISAKA (VittiyaSakshartaAbhiyan) guidelines have been implemented in the University.
- Financial accounting is being done so that maximum transparency may be ensured to have a proper system in place.
- The financial transactions of the University have become cashless. The digital initiatives of the MHRD have been fully implemented in the University.
- The University actively participated in all the national schemes proposed by MHRD and UGC.
- The CCASH is functional to provide prompt relief to the complainants as per its guidelines.
- The staff has been asked to understand their duties, besides their rights. Everyone needs to contribute one's best for the upliftment of the University. The University can reach a new height only with proper cooperation and cohesion of all the staff and the students.
- Students' involvement has been ensured for proper teaching environment and peace in the entire campus, including the University hostels.
- The University actively participated in all the Govt. of India initiatives such as Yoga Day, Run for Unity, Guru Purnima, Environment Day, etc.

EFFECTIVE USE OF THE ICT FOR TEACHING, ADMISSIONS, AND E- GOVERNANCE

- The pandemic COVID-19 created havoc worldwide. The economy of the world is in shambles. There are no sports, industries are closed, and the education sector has been severely affected. Slowly things are reviving after we have come out of the lockdown mode. Even today, the world is highly confused, and probably the confusion shall prevail until such time there is a vaccine for this virus. This pandemic has thrown a lot many challenges and has given us a lot many opportunities. This pandemic has acted as a catalyst to force us to implement the solutions on which we were already working but had never thought that one needs to move fast as we have to prepare for the scenario where there is no other option available. In this crucial and dreadful period, ICT has only come to our rescue so that we could connect with the students to address teaching in the virtual mode; students could fill up their application forms online for admission to the next session in all the UG and PG courses in the University.
- The University is gradually striving for the creation of a paperless environment. During the lockdown period, culture of "work from home" is adopted. As stated, an in-house team of students of the University is working day in and day out for the creation of a "work from home" environment in the University. It will be a big step for the University to have a paperless office.
- The University is in the process of conducting an online Entrance Test for UG, PG, Professional, and Ph.D. courses for admission to various courses of study for the academic session 2020-21. This exercise will help the University to attract talented and potentially bright students from all over the country.
- New lecture hall complex, with large lecture theaters, with ICT enabled infrastructure is coming up to be shared by various departments to address effective teaching.
- The bandwidth of the campus-wide LAN (including the hostels) and also the Wi-Fi facility is being increased from 1 Gbps to 10 Gbps through NKN.
- The campus-wide CCTV surveillance system, having pan, tilt, and zoom cameras, with the centralized control room, is being effectively used to cut down the security expenditure on the campus.
- The University is fully utilizing the digital initiative of MHRD, namely the MOOCs platforms like Swayam, NPTEL, ePG Pathshala, Swayamprabha, etc, as well as GIAN scheme to ensure that best and updated lectures are available to the student community.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND STUDENT AMENITIES

- The Vijayanagram Hall, the heritage of the University and Tilak Bhawan is fully refurbished and is ready to be inaugurated.
- A mini auditorium having a seating capacity of approximately 300 persons is available.
- The demand of the girl's students has been fulfilled by the creation of a common room for girl's students.
- The famous Senate hall has been refurbished with new chairs, and the painting has been executed externally & internally. The grandeur look of Senate Hall is a matter of appreciation.
- The eastern portion of Darbhanga hall has been upgraded and refurbished and is housing all the administrative offices in one place.
- The workspaces for teaching faculty and large lecture theatres will be available in Ishwar Topa Academic Complex in the Arts Campus of the University by December 2020.
- To ensure good research work for teachers and research scholars, and to house Diagnostic Apparatus, M. N. Saha Centre for Space Studies in the Science Faculty will be accessible by the end of December 2020.
- Student Activity Centre providing space for meeting, Library, Gym, and Cafeteria to the student community will also be accessible by the end of December 2020.
- To house 72 students, a new Boy's Hostel shall be available by July 2021.

- The foundation stone of a new Girl's Hostel in the Women's Hostel premises has been laid down. It will house 120 girl students. This hostel shall be available by the end of May2020.
- Efforts are on to repair the famous and classic clock tower of the University, housed in its main senate-house campus
- Efforts are on to hoist a high mast national flag in the senate-house campus of the University.
- Efforts are being made to increase the out-reach activities for better linkages with society.
- University has installed solar panels of the capacity of 1.434 MW.
- Plantation of trees is carried out at regular intervals to keep the campus as green as possible.
- Anti-ragging cell, as per UGC guidelines, is fully functional.
- NCC and NSS organized several activities throughout the year.
- Recreation and sports facilities have been upgraded to the campus.
- Efforts are on to upgrade the Health Centre of the University.
- Freeships, Scholarships, Poor Boys Fund, Merit-cum-means scholarships were distributed to economically weaker students.
- Jawahar Lal Nehru Centre for differently-abled students of the University has been further equipped with state-of-the-art gadgets.

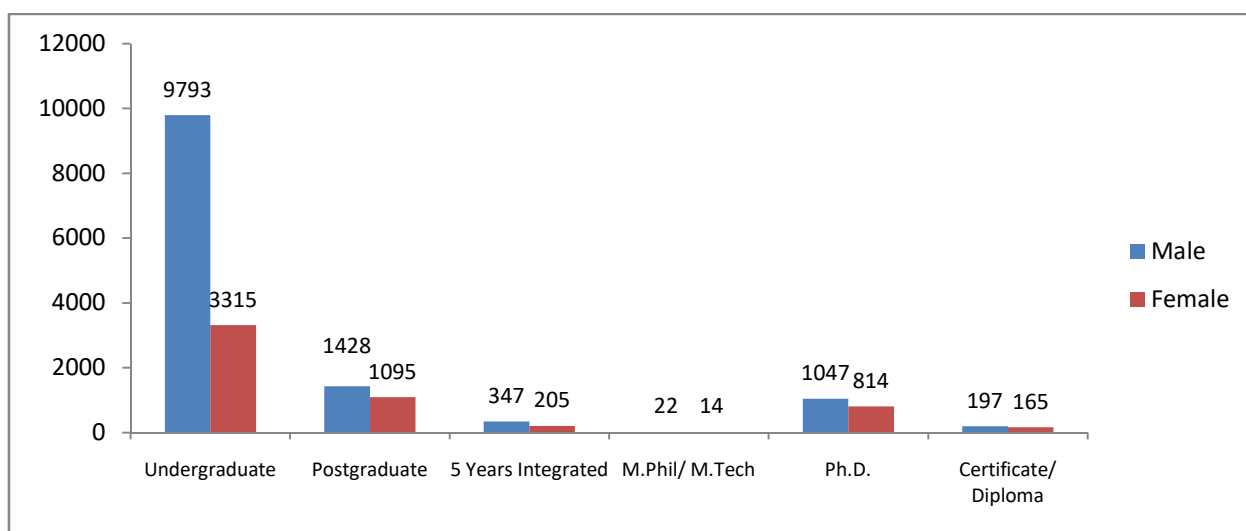

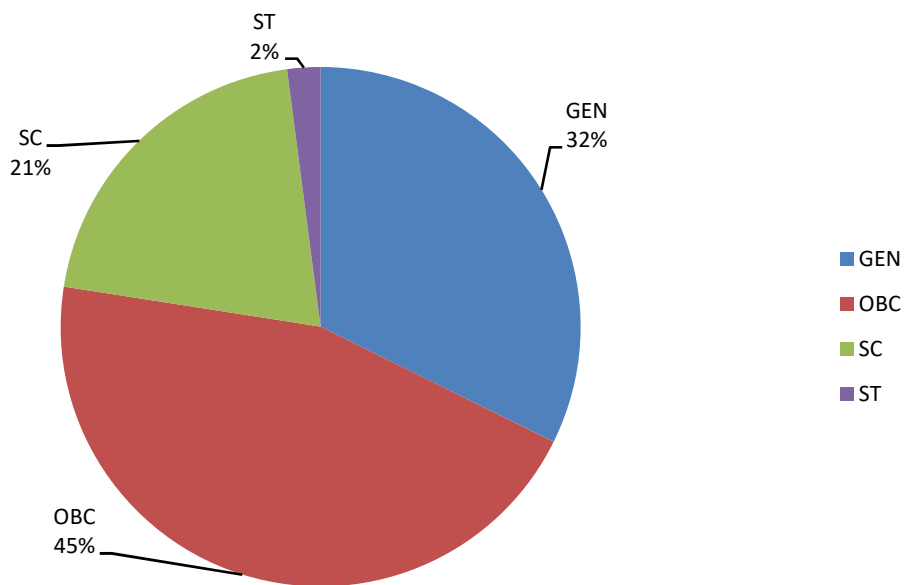

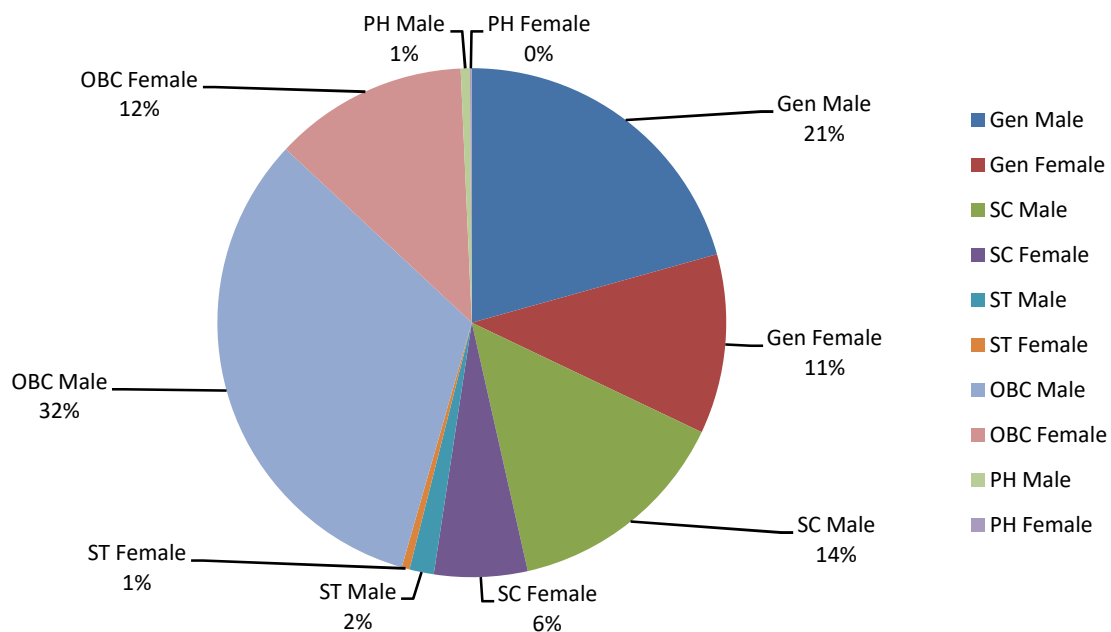
Total no. of students (Programme wise) 2019-20

INITIATIVES TO ADDRESS CURRENT CHALLENGES

The University has taken the following steps to safeguard the students, non-teaching staff, and faculty members of the University from the infection of the Coronavirus.

A. Creation of an in-house solution for active online learning:

The entire country was locked down on March 24, 2020, to prevent the spread of CORONA VIRUS (COVID-19). Since then, one started conducting every activity in the virtual mode instead of physical mode. MHRD requested all the Central Universities to complete the remaining syllabi in the ONLINE manner so that the academic session is least disturbed because of the pandemic COVID-19.

The Faculty of the University of Allahabad also switched to the virtual mode from the physical mode, but there were many problems in connection with students because of issues like the digital divide and poor connectivity. To address this problem, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University involved his Research Scholar and Resource Person, Mrs. Sunita Tripathi, at the Centre of Computer Education & Training, IPS, UoA and students to work out a solution around Moodle platform to create the portal named as "Learning Management System" of the University of Allahabad.

Moodle is a course management system. It is a free open source software package designed to help educators to create an effective online personalized learning environment. Moodle delivers a powerful set of learner-centric tools and collaborative learning environments that empower both teaching and learning. It provides a simple interface, drag and drops features and well-documented resources along with ongoing usability improvements making Moodle easy to learn and use. Because it is open-source, Moodle can be customized in any way and tailored to individual needs. Its modular setup and interoperable design allow developers to create plugins and integrate external applications to achieve specific functionalities. It is robust, secure, private, and is scalable to any size, from a few students to millions of users. Moodle is web-based and can be accessed from anywhere in the world. With a default mobile-compatible interface and cross-browser compatibility, content on the Moodle platform is easily accessible and consistent across different browsers and devices. It is backed by a strong community, and therefore significant new releases are available every six months.

This portal (<https://lms.alluniv.ac.in/>) is effectively working. On this portal, Department wise learning material of most of the Faculty members have been uploaded so that whenever a student at any place gets opportunity can open this portal to access the learning material, which is relevant for him/her as per syllabi.

The University is going to have its own video studio by the end of July 2020, where excellent quality lectures of the faculty members shall be recorded and uploaded on this portal.

B. Creation of "work from home" environment:

The University witnessed another severe problem during this lockdown period. Even in the first lockdown either employees of the University had to come to VC's Camp Office after obtaining the movement pass from the district administration or the Vice-Chancellor had to go to his office to see that all the important papers are disposed of, and the salary to all the employees of the University is timely disbursed.

The University was already working in the direction of the creation of a paperless office. But this pandemic acted as a catalyst. This problem led to the idea of creation of a WORK FROM HOME environment so that once all the relevant files and documents are uploaded on a separate Server, it may be accessed ONLINE from anywhere. Once this solution is properly implemented, the University will have a paperless office. An inhouse team of University students is working on it, and we are hopeful that this solution will be in place by the end of July 2020.

C. Integration of an alumni portal with the main website of the University:

The University acknowledges the contribution of all the alumni who have made an indelible mark wherever they reached or are there because of which the University is known as the Oxford of the East. We wish to request our alumni to provide fruitful and positive suggestions for the betterment of the University and urge them to join us in fostering a healthy and peaceful atmosphere not only in the university campus but the campus of all the constituent colleges as well. A team of three Resource Persons and Technical Staff of the Centre of Computer Education, Institute of Professional Studies, UoA have designed the Alumni Portal for the University of Allahabad, which is linked with the official website of the University. This portal shall facilitate Alumni to provide their inputs to the University. The link of the portal is lms.alluniv.ac.in/alumni/.

D. Establishment of a separate center of vocational studies and skill development:

MHRD has been kind enough to provide a Centre of Vocational Studies and Skill Development. This Centre will broadly bridge the gap between the industry and academia. Job oriented courses shall be provided through this Centre. This Centre shall provide the human resources to the nation aiming towards Self-Reliant Bharat. Initially, the Centre shall provide the technicians in the field of Computing Peripherals, Storage, and networks. Through the degree program at this Centre, it will produce Software Developers who shall be helpful in providing good quality computer application packages to the nation.

CONVOCATION 2019

The University of Allahabad, a central institution of the Government of India and having a glorious past of more than 132 years in the service of mankind and the nation, organized the Convocation 2019 on September 05, 2019, a very auspicious day on which we celebrate the birth anniversary of Shri Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, a great Indian philosopher, academician, and statesman who served as the President of India (1962–1967). Shri Kailash Satyarthi, a Nobel Laureate and famous Child Rights Activist, and the leader of “Bachpan Bachao Andolan” graced the occasion as the Chief Guest of the ceremony. On this occasion, the distinguished guests, Shri Keshari Nath Tripathi, former Governor of West Bengal, Bihar and Mizoram, and Shri Om Prakash Singh, Director General of Police, Uttar Pradesh and the Director General of NDRF (2014-2016) and CISF (2016-2018) were conferred on the Honoris Causa degree of Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) and Doctor of Literature (D. A total of 178 students from different faculties were awarded Ph. D. Degree by the vice-chancellor Professor R. L. Hangloo. The students who could not be present during the convocation due to their prior engagements were awarded the Medals by the present vice-chancellor Professor Rajiv Ranjan Tewari, in a special function organized for the purpose, to boost the morale of the students, on February 20, 2020, in the North Hall of the University. The students of the session 2017-18 were considered for the award of Medals and Ph. D. Degrees during the Convocation 2019.

Several eminent personalities from Central Government, State Government, academia, medical field, and society attended the convocation held in the famous Senate Hall of the University of Allahabad. This premier institution, since its inception, has served the country by providing President, Prime Ministers, Ministers, Engineers, Doctors, Scientists, Educational leaders, and many great social workers and an innumerable number of bureaucrats who form a shining galaxy of its alumni. DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT HISTORY, CULTURE & ARCHAEOLOGY

Introduction:

The department was founded in the year 1955 with the objective of promoting research and teaching in ancient history (including pre-history and proto-history) and ancient world civilizations. The department excavated the world famous archaeological site of Kaushambi from 1948 to 1964 with outstanding results. The department was chosen for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) by the UGC for three consecutive phases from 1981 to 1995. It was also granted the status of Centre of Advance Study (CAS) from 2001 to 2006. The department carried out International Collaborations with a) University of California, Berkeley (1980-82), b) Soviet Union on the Project, "Comparative Archaeology and Ethno-Linguistic Studies" (beginning in 1980), and 3) Australian Research Council (2005-2008). The Department is Internationally recognized for its studies in Socio-Economic Puranic studies and Art.

Department has following facilities:

- **G.R.Sharma Memorial Museum** developed out of cultural material recovered mainly through excavations and explorations in the Northern Vindhya and the Middle Ganga Plains by the archaeologist of the Department.
- **Experimental Archaeology Lab:** Since its inception, January 2010, the lab has had been engaged in understanding **Cognitive Ecosystem of archaeological landscape** combining the results of the various scientific experimental techniques.
- **Archaeo-Zoological Lab:** for Archaeozoological Researches.
- **Departmental Research and PG Library.**
- **Lab of Archaeological Chemistry, Photographic Lab, Surveying Drawing Lab, Computer Reprographic Lab.**

From time to time, learned professors across the world visited and interacted with faculty members, research scholars and students of the departments. The latest visitors include a team of scholars from Delhi and Boston, USA. Our departmental museum (Prof G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum) houses a unique collection of antiquities spanning from Prehistory to early historical period. 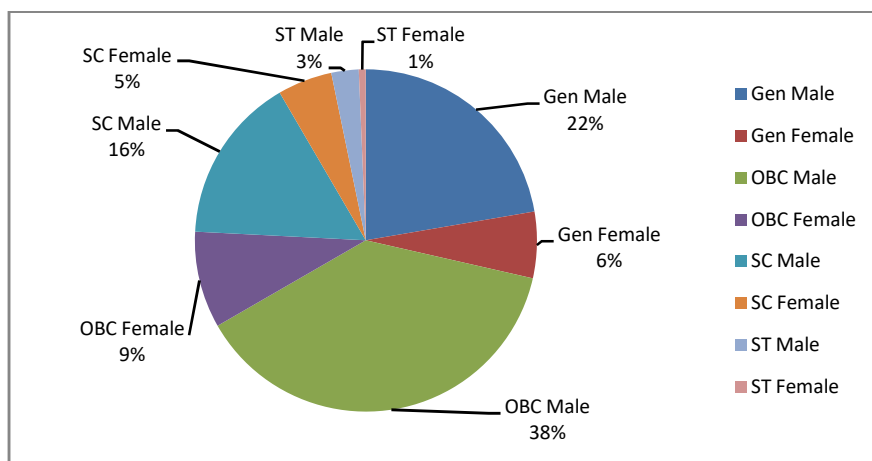

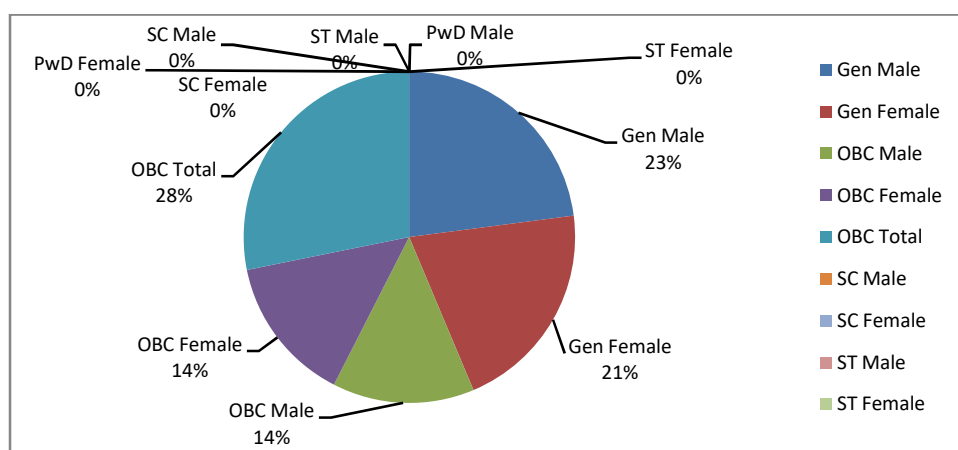

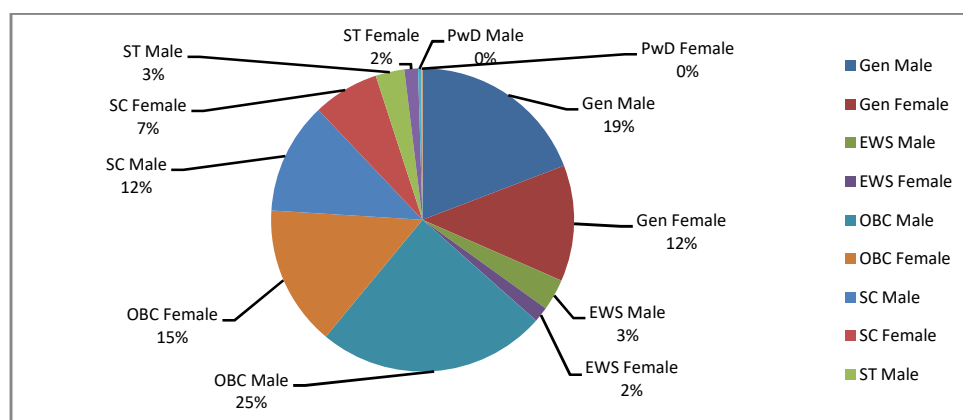

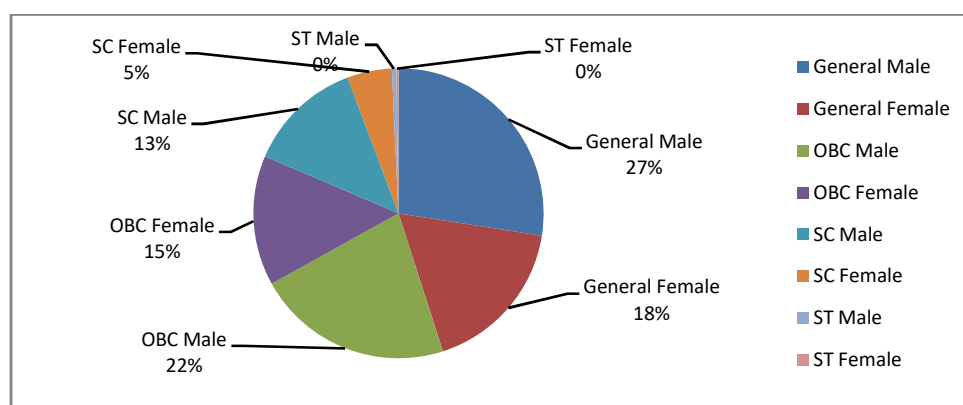

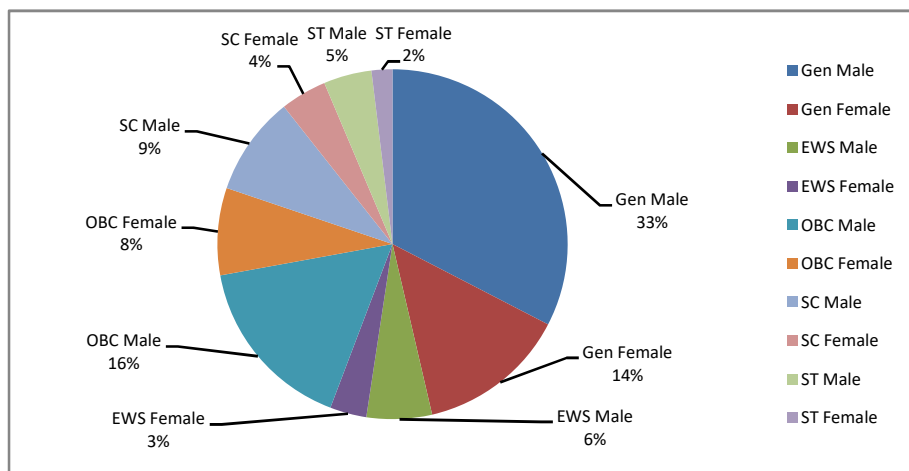

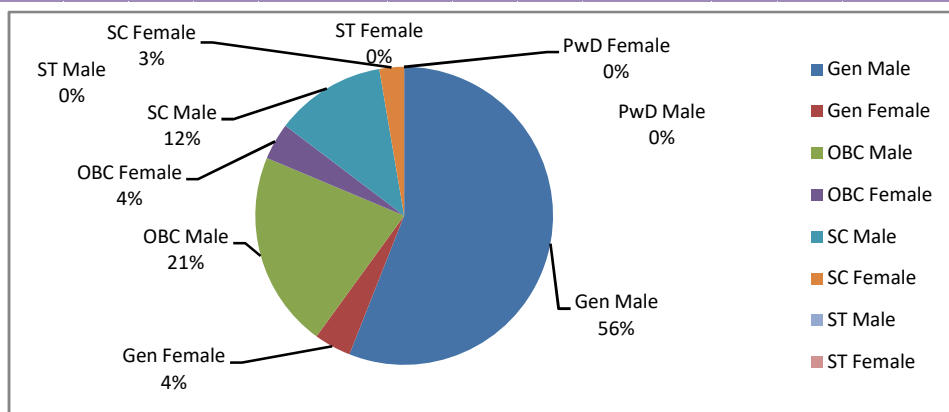

DEPARTMENT OF MEDIEVAL AND MODERN HISTORY

Introduction:

The Chair of Professor in Department of Medieval & Modern History was created in 1912-13. Academic lectures and teaching commenced in December 1916. Gradually eminent historians joined the department on the invitation and appointment made by the first HOD, Prof. L. F. Rushbrook Williams. Those joining in 1917-1919 period include Ishwari Prasad, R. P. Tripathi, Beni Prasad, Sir Shafaat Ahmad Khan and Dr. Tara Chand. Two of the above earned the D.Litt. degree of the London University by working under the legendary Harold Laski – Beni Prasad and R. P. Tripathi. By 1935, when the first session of the Indian History Congress was held at Pune – it was deemed necessary to unanimously elect Prof Shafaat Ahmad Khan, then HOD of our Department as its first president because of the immense contributions made by the historians working under his stewardship. Their contributions gave rise to what came to be emerging later as the “Allahabad School of History”.

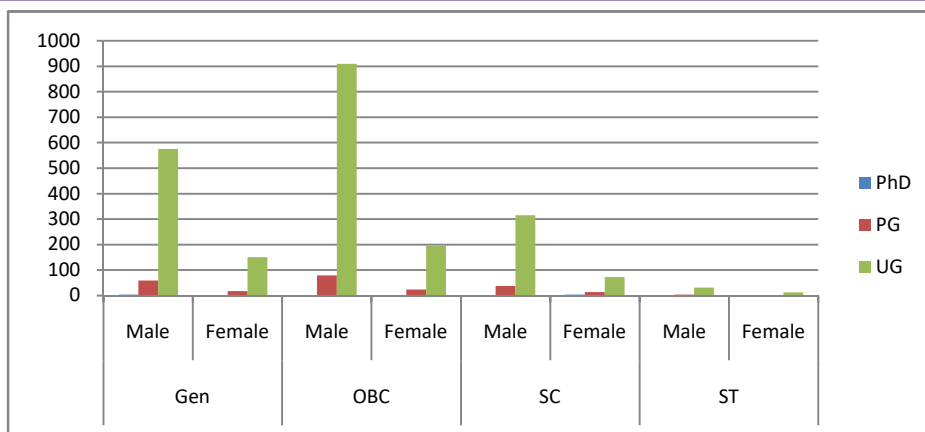

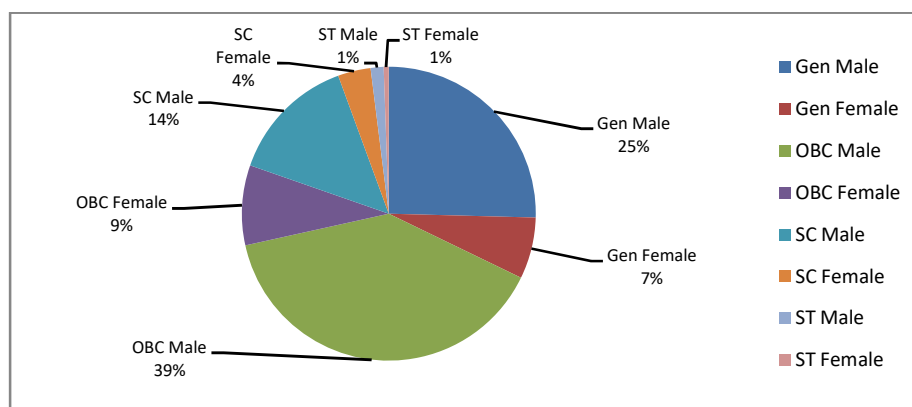

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

Introduction:

Established in 1926, the Department of Music and Performing Arts has a long and illustrious history, when the well-known music lover and the renowned academician Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya started a Music Association in 1926 and the first music conference was organized under the auspices of this Association and Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya was the Vice-President. Two years Junior Diploma in vocal and instrumental music was started in 1935 and diploma in painting in 1937 in Women's College Campus. In 1942 senior Diploma in vocal and instrumental Music was introduced and in 1945 the music vocal, instrumental and painting became a formal academic subject at undergraduate level and the regular teachers were appointed. It was only in 1947 that Dr. Amarnath Jha, Vice-Chancellor of Allahabad University laid down the foundation of the building of Music department and in 1950 a small building was constructed for the music department and inaugurated by the then Hon'ble Governor Sri. H.P. Modi. But again this building was handed over to Urdu Department in 1968 and the Music classes were again shifted to women's college campus. Only in 1970 by the courtesy of Prof. A.B. Lal, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, building of the music department was constructed and inaugurated on the auspicious occasion of Basant Panchami in 1971 and since then the department has flourished on every front from 1973 onwards. P.G. classes were started and research work also began as a follow up. Many students of the department emerged as national level artists as well as occupying important position in academics or other important work places.

The department till now offered teaching at B.A. , M.A. and Diplomas and conducted research, but from July 2003, the department of music has introduced Bachelor of Music, B.Mus three years Degree course in Vocal / Sitar / Tabla and M.Mus from 2006-07 for enriching the quality of teaching music and to advance specialized training to the students. From 2005, the department included male candidates in B. Mus programme as a follow-up in M.Mus also. In B.A. this provision was since 2001. The department also introduced practical screening test for P.G. entrants in Music from July 2003 and included Rabindra Sangeet in B.Mus degree programme. The department also started 2 years diploma course in Indian classical Kathak dance from session 2006-07. Started new course in P.G. MPA in Vocal, Sitar and Tabla from 2016-17. B. Mus 3 years UG course change in BPA 4 year from session 2016-17.

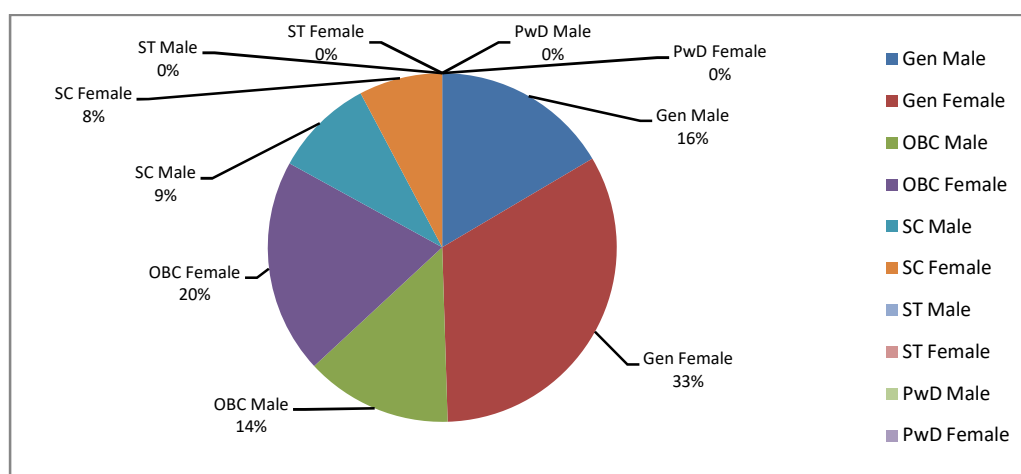

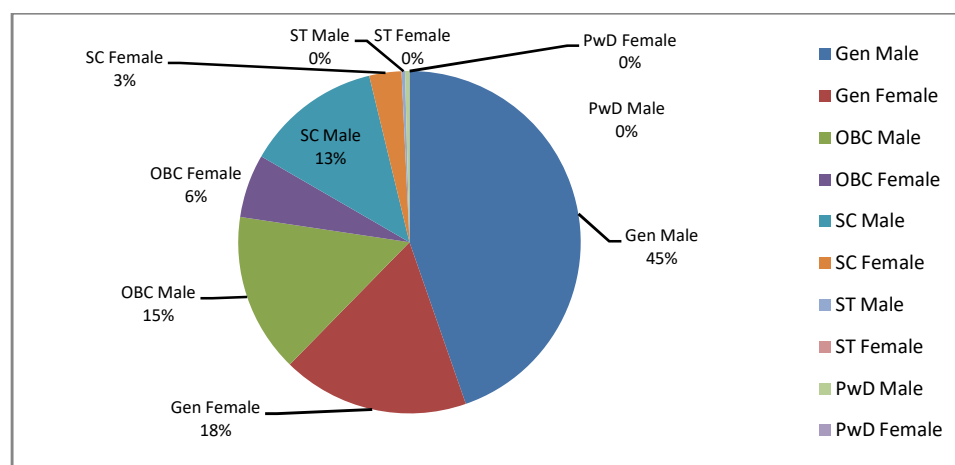

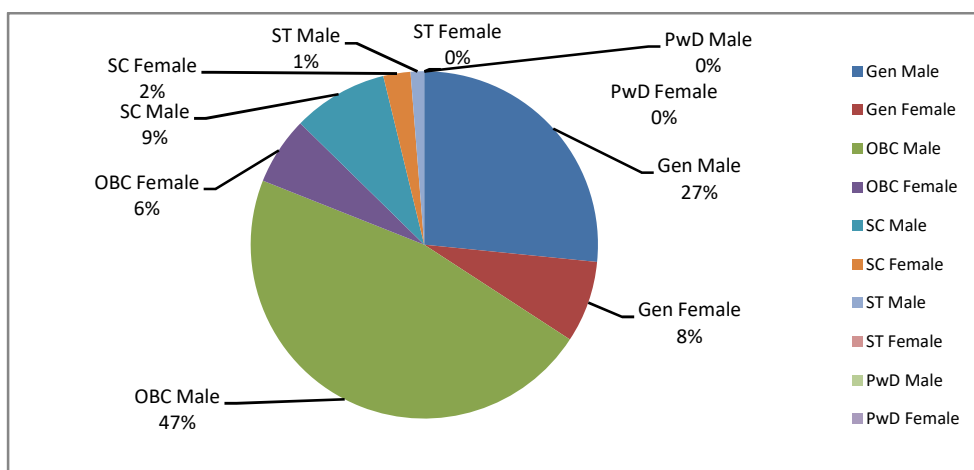

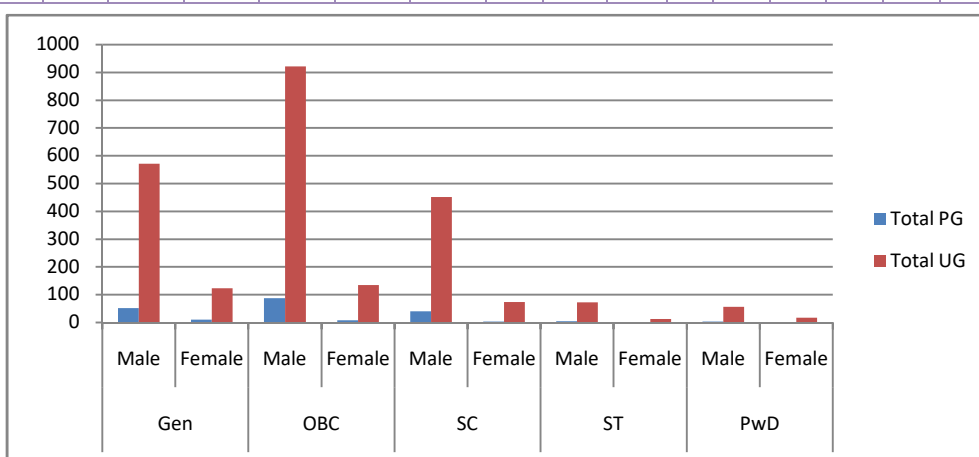

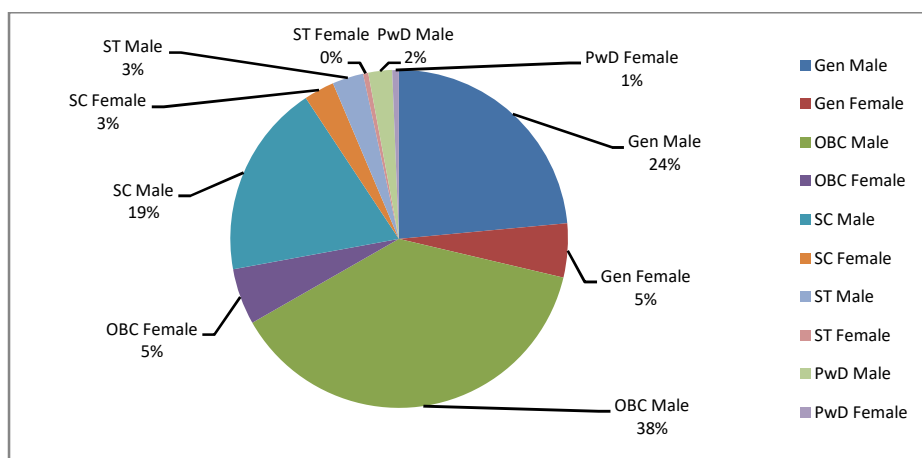

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department of Psychology was established in the year 1961 with Prof. Durganand Sinha as the first chairperson and two other faculty members. In 1977, the UGC approved it as a Department of Special Assistance (DSA) and the faculty strength was increased to 20. In recognition of its outstanding contribution to the field of Psychology in India, the Department was upgraded as the centre for Advanced Studies (CAS) in 1984 by the UGC. The Department was evaluated by the UGC and second, third and fourth terms of CAS were sanctioned between the period 1989 to 2008.

In 1989, the Department started an International journal 'Psychology and Developing Societies' in collaboration with the Sage publications which is now in its 32nd year. The Department was the first in the University to start D. Phil. with course work as early as in 1979. The Semester system in P.G. Programme was started in the Department in 1989 and later on, in 2001, the Department adopted 'Choice Based Credit System' in P.G. Programme. The Department has a Departmental Library which is recognized as Regional Resource Centre.

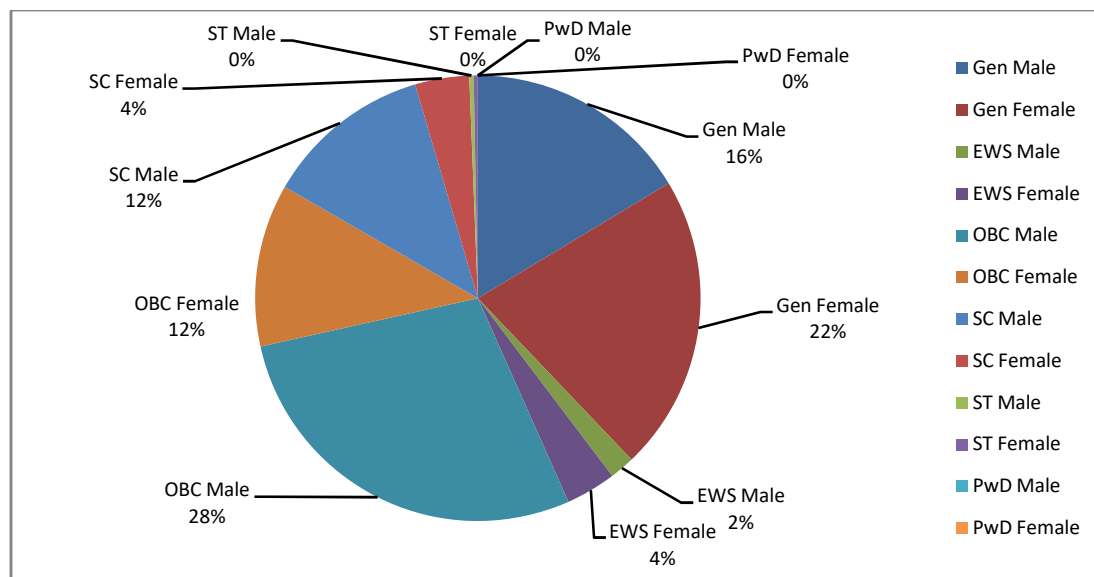

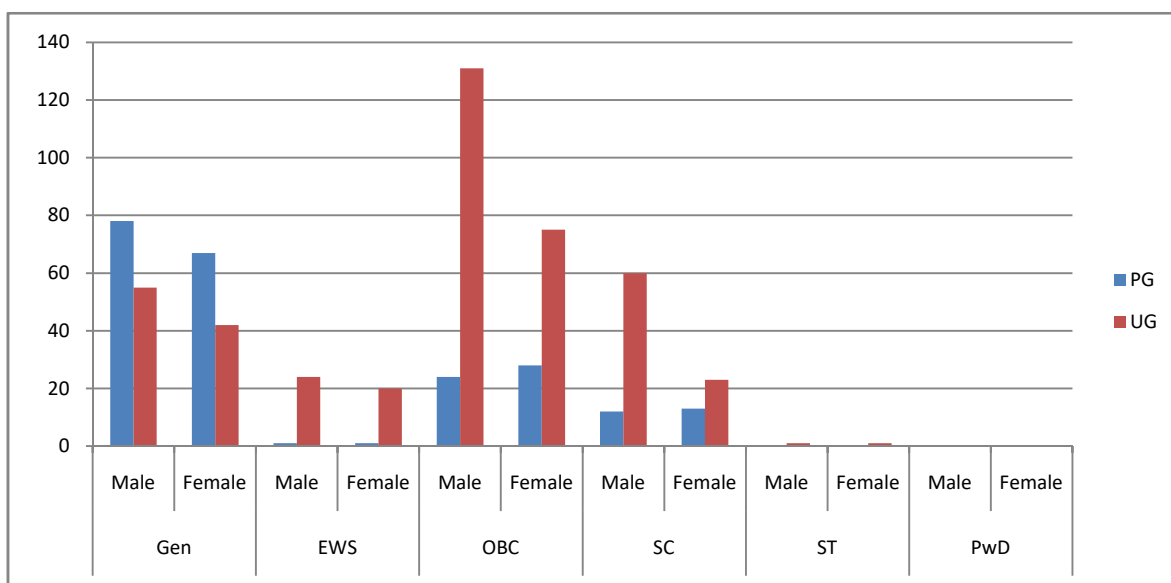

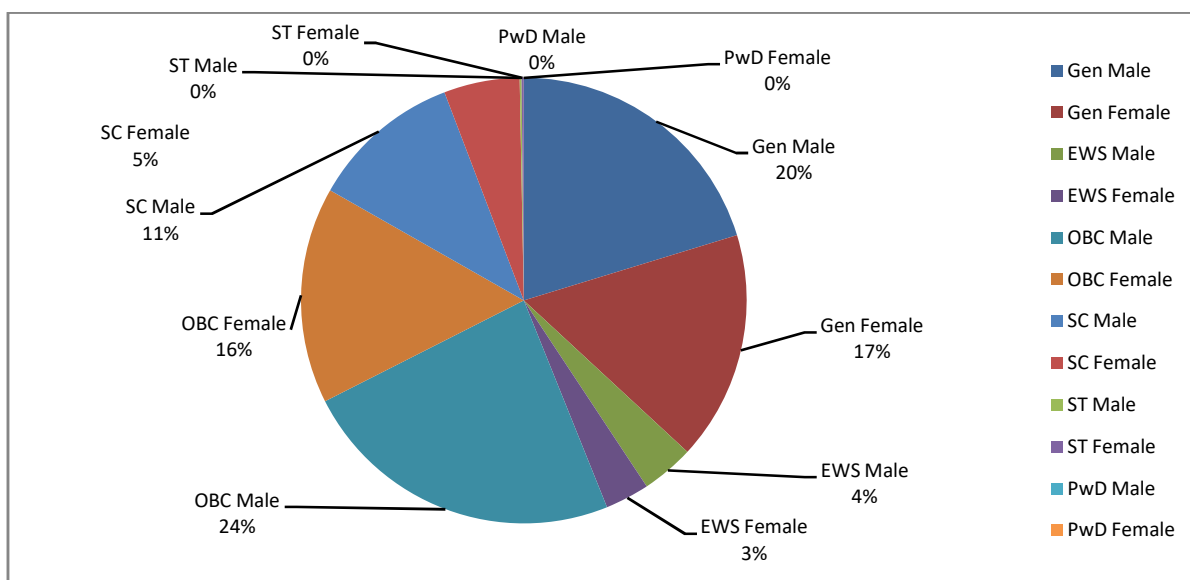

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Introduction:

The department of Sociology was established in June 2010. The main research thrusts of department are: Agrarian studies, Development studies, social movements, Subaltern studies and Sociology of Health and illness. So far, the Department has organized **03** Symposium/Workshop, **03** National Seminar/Symposium, **01** UGC sponsored Refresher Program, **02** Pre-Ph.D. Programme, **19** Public Lectures and **05** Consultancy Programme.

In the M.A. I semester, the students conduct field studies individually in their place of residence relating to religious ceremonies and analyze the data in order to write reports. M.A. III semester students conduct library exercise to understand the issues of modernization and development of India in a comparative framework with selected African nations from secondary resources. Field study was conducted by the M.A. II semester students in the city of Allahabad on the broader theme of 'Youth' as a category. The sub-themes are: Youth and Education; Youth and Gender; Youth and ICT (Information Communication Technology); Youth and Politics; Youth and Religion. Similarly, M.A. IVth semester in-depth case studies among patients admitted to or visiting the hospitals in and around the Allahabad city. The major sub-themes include: The socio-economic profile of the households/patients; Folk wisdom on health and illness; Health programs and evaluation in rural/urban areas; Challenges of effective health care system in rural/urban areas; Maternal and child health – promise and realities; Doctor patient relationship – people's doctor and professional distance; Accessibility, affordability and accountability

All the faculty members are involved in inculcating the skills to the Post-graduate class members in matters of preparing interview schedules, collecting data from the villagers, preparation of coding manuals, entry of coded data, analysis of the data through SPSS and finally writing small reports.

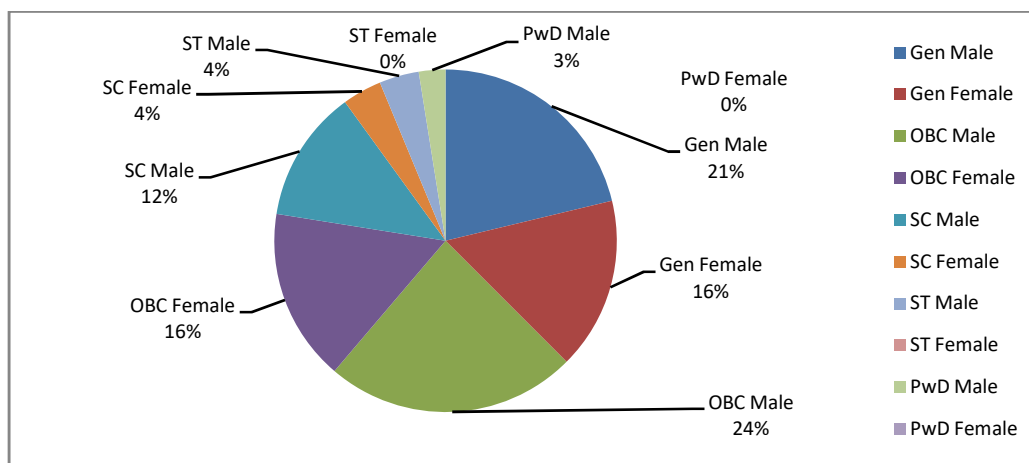

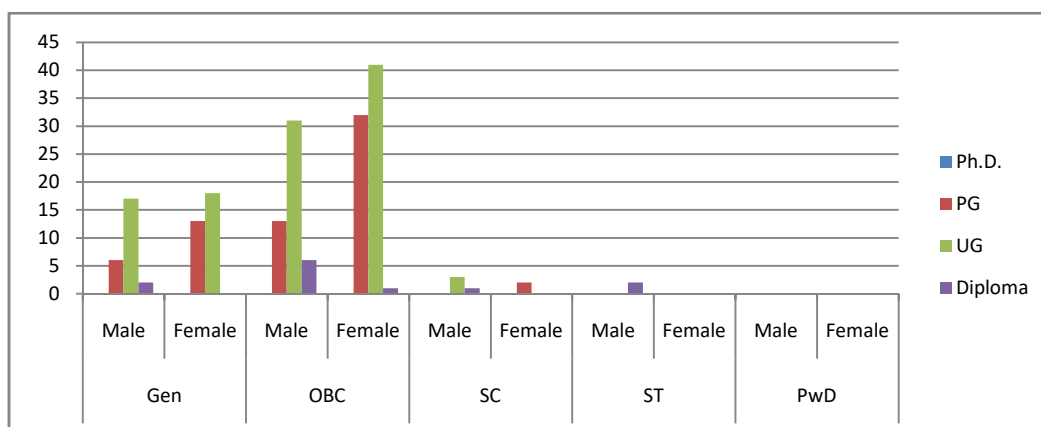

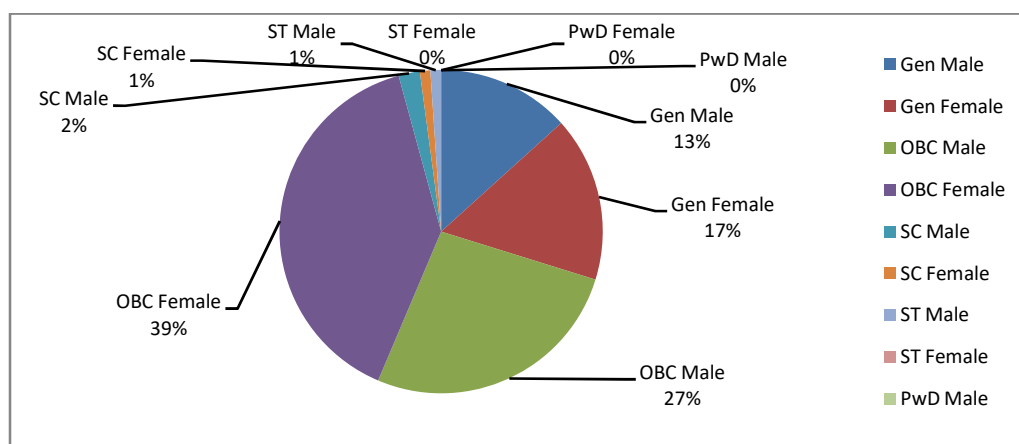

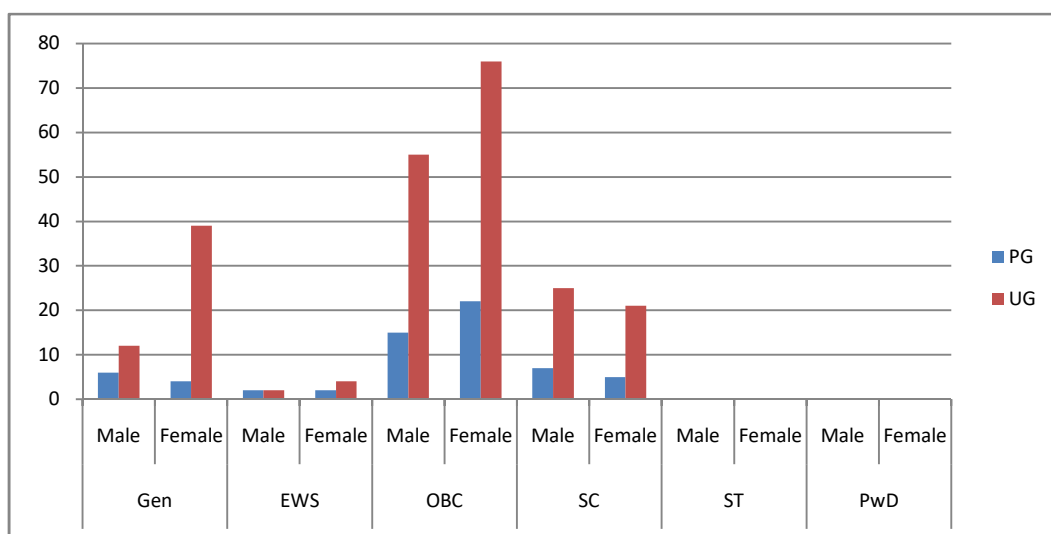

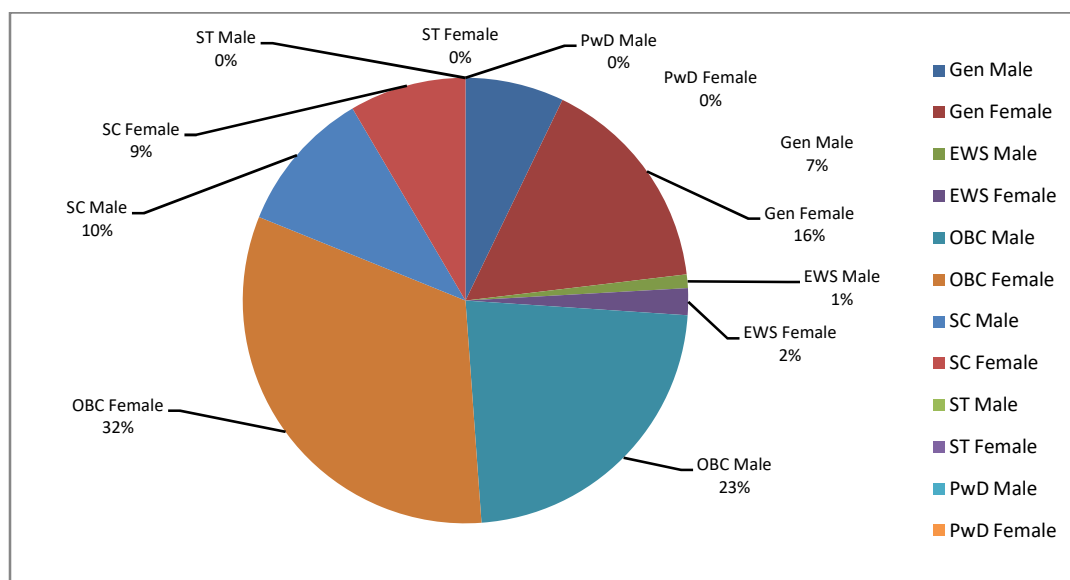

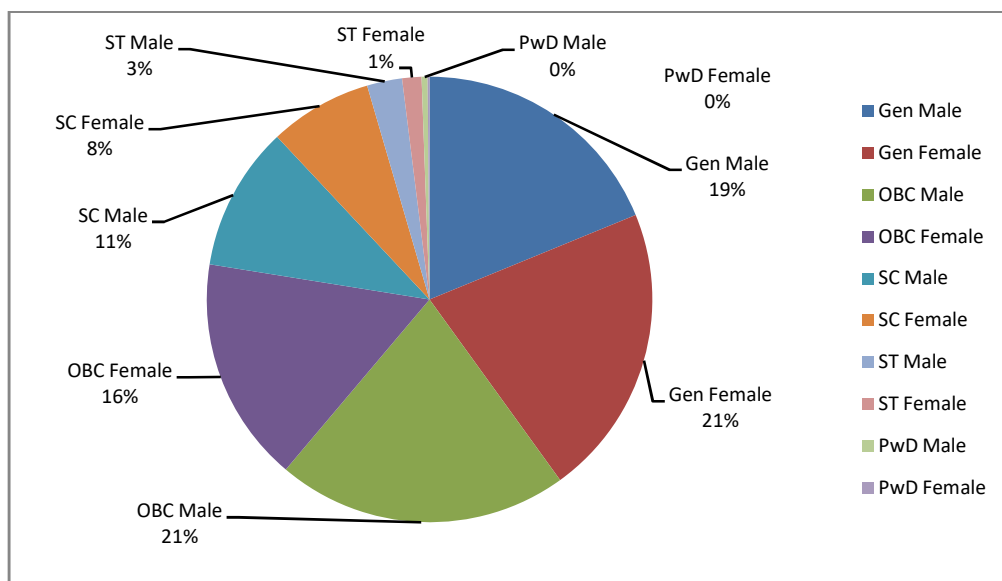

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

Introduction:

The Department of Economics became a truly full-fledged department in 1914, with the appointment of Herbert Stanley Jevons (son of the marginalist, W.S. Jevons) as the first Professor of Economics and Head. A post-graduate course was also introduced the same year, so that the full fledgling department offered both, under-graduate and post-graduate courses. Year 2014 is taken to be its Centenary Year of the Department. Prof. Jevons also founded the Indian Journal of Economics, in the year 1916, the first economics journal ever to be published in India. This is the oldest existing journal of Economics and is regularly published, even today.

His legacy was faithfully adhered to by stalwarts like Professors C.D.Thompson, A.R.Burnett-Hurst and S.K.Rudra, Mr. B.P.Adarkar, and later by Professors J.K.Mehta, P.C.Jain, S.L.Parmar, Mahesh Chand and many others. Faculty members such as Prof. H.S. Jevons, Prof. C.D. Thompson, Prof. S.K. Rudra and Prof. J.K.Mehta became Presidents of the Indian Economic Association Conferences of 1922, 1934, 1946, and 1968 respectively. Former faculty of the Department who became Presidents were Dr. M.V. Mathur (1967), Prof. Gautam Mathur (1978) and Prof. P.D. Hajela (1980). Allahabad had the proud privilege of hosting I.E.A. conferences in the years 1920, 1929 and 1940.

Department also has a Planning and Development Unit, created through an endowment by the Planning Commission, Government of India, with the renowned development economist, Jean Dreze was Associated with it as the Honorary Chair Professor. The UGC also selected the Department under Special Assistance Programme (SAP) in 2004-05, DRS- I level. It was further renewed in 2009-10, DRS-II level. The Department looks ahead further to convert it into a Centre for Advanced Study. The Departmental library has more than fifteen thousand books and it subscribes 35 national and international journals, along with about 40 journals received under exchange basis through the Indian Journal of Economics. It is in the process of modernization through digital cataloguing. The Department also has a Statistical/Computer laboratory for the research scholars. Prof. P.C. Jain and alumni of the Department contributed significantly to the establishment of the Departmental library in the present form.

The Department recently formed an Alumni Association and the first Alumni meet was organized on Feb.14, 2014, the meet was a grand success and it was attended by more than two hundred alumni. The Department is holding meetings of the Association every year since then. The Department has celebrated its Centenary Year and many academic/cultural programmes were held during this 2014-2016.

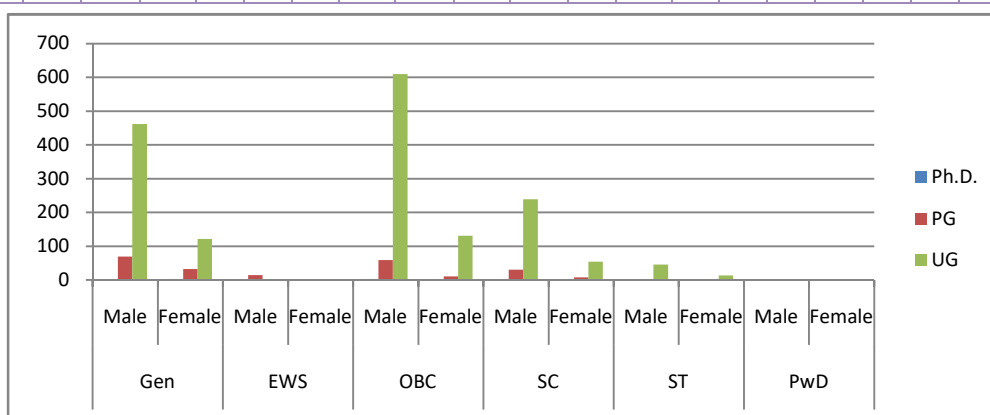

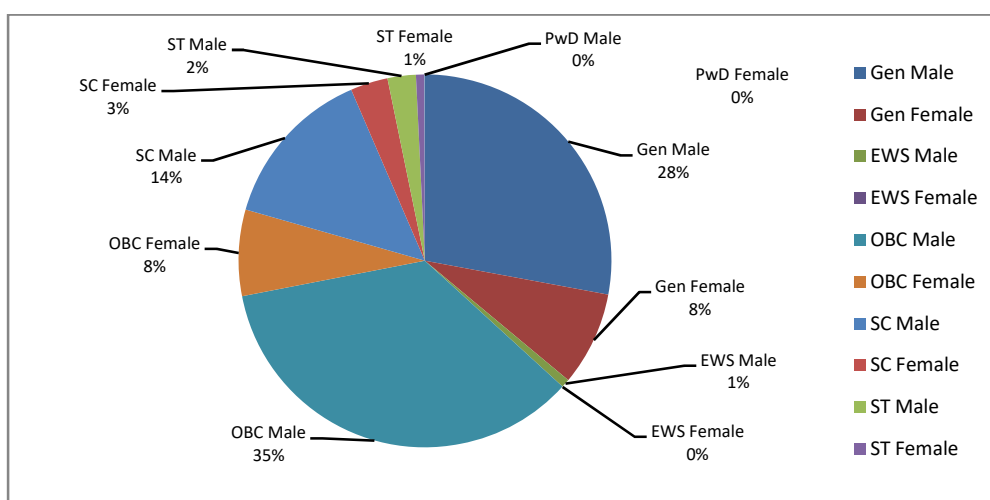

Introduction

Law as a subject was introduced in the year 1872 in affiliation with the Calcutta University (presently Kolkata University). In 1887 the Department of Law was established and in the year 1890, the Department became a separate single Department /Faculty of the University along with the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. Hon'ble Justice D. Straight was appointed as the first president of the Department. The Law Department functioned in Muir College from 1872 onwards till the new building was constructed for the Law Faculty around 1910, adjacent to Senate House. By an Act of the United Province of British India. Prof. Weir, a distinguished jurist became the first Head of the Law Department. The Department was shifted to the new building which was constructed by UGC grant in the Chatham Lines Campus of which Hon'ble Mr. A.K. Sen the then Law Minister of India, had laid the foundation stone in 1965.

The endeavour at Faculty of Law, University of Allahabad is to provide excellence in legal education. We strive to develop better human resources for trade, industry, public administration, departments of law and justice. Our continuous endeavour is to promote studies in law, legal institutions and processes of justice in close context of the knowledge of other disciplines having vital bearing on human behaviour and society in all aspects.

In keeping with its best tradition of reform and excellence in legal education, the University launched a Five Year Integrated Course of Law w.e.f. the academic session 2005-2006. Its prime purpose and avowed aim is to fashion new techniques of teaching and design courses to cope with the challenges and issues in contemporary society. A separate building for Law Five Year Integrated course has been built in the same premises.

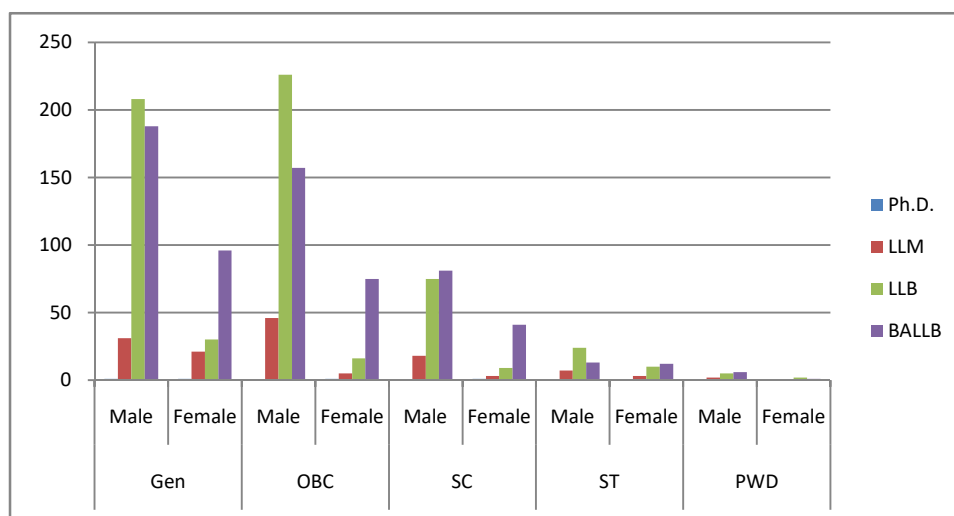

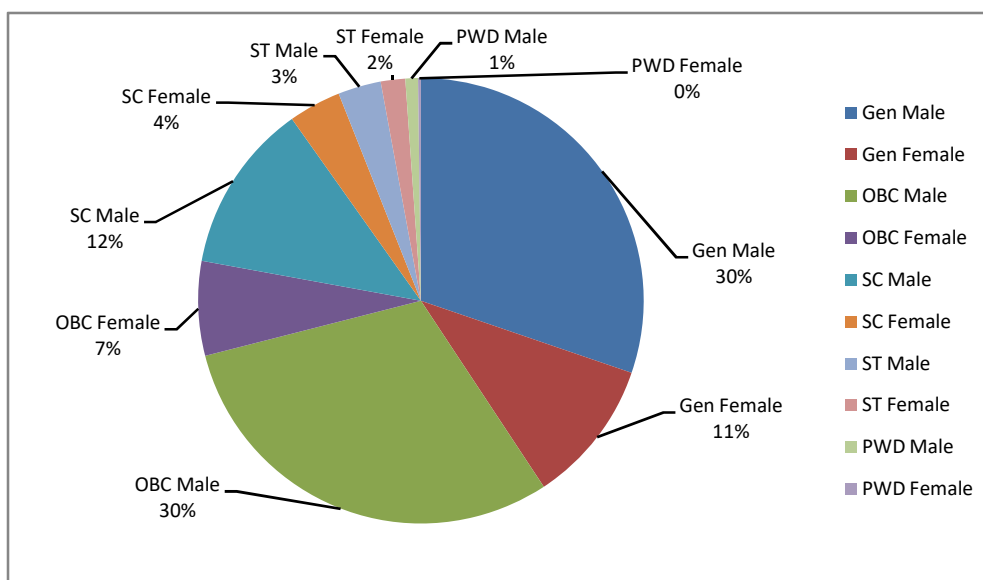

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY

Introduction:

The Department of Biochemistry was incepted in 1968 by renowned organic chemist turned biochemist, Professor Dr. Radha Pant. At that time University of Allahabad was one of the few Universities in the country to start a Master's course in Biochemistry. In view of the growing importance of Biochemistry, both as a basic science as well as a broad based discipline, the Department also introduced Biochemistry at the undergraduate level in the year 2000. The Department presently offers a 3-year undergraduate program (B.Sc.) with Biochemistry as one subject, a 2-year Master's program (M.Sc. Biochemistry), and a Doctoral program (Ph.D. Biochemistry). Department organizes weekly Journal Club on Fridays(or Thursdays) by Research Scholars, students' seminars and frequent invited lectures by leading scientists from across the world with a view to develop quality personnel in the field of Biochemistry. In the year 2018, Biochemistry department completed 50 years and celebrated Golden Jubilee year by organizing the first ever Alumni Meet and a National Conference on "Expanding Horizons of Biochemistry" on December 01, 2018. It was attended by distinct alumni from across the World.

The faculty is engaged in collaborative research with several institutions and universities.

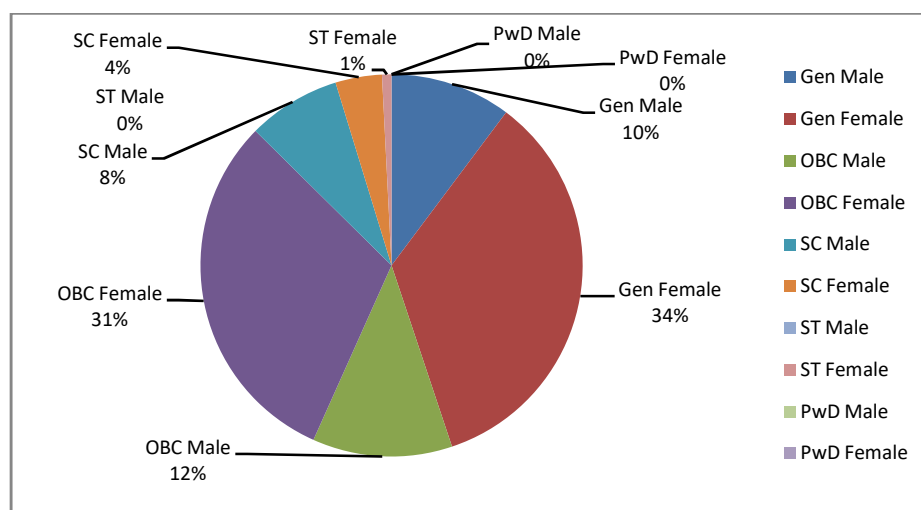

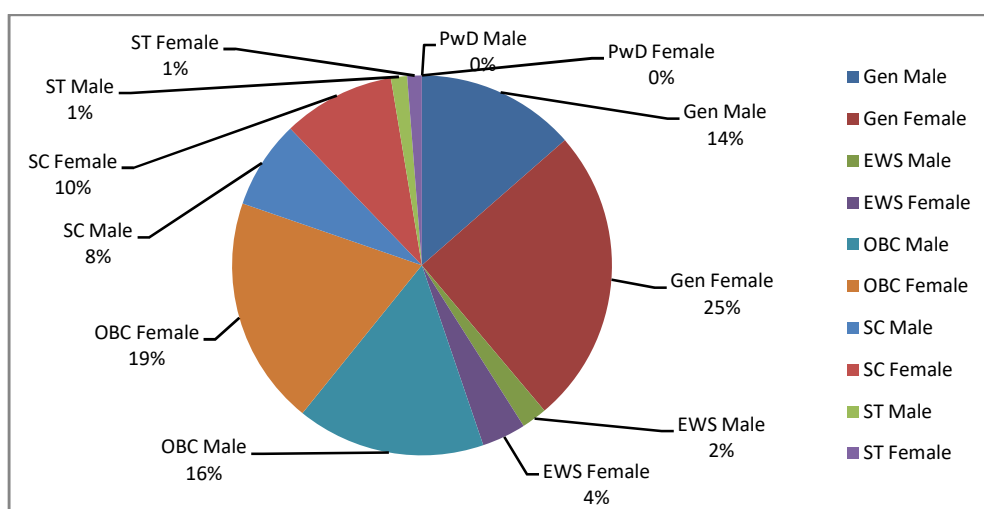

Encouraged by the past glory, the department is striving hard to create a niche for itself in national and international domains of teaching and research. As a result it was selected as a Centre for Special Assistance by U.G.C. in 1978, selected for an aid under COSIST in 1996.

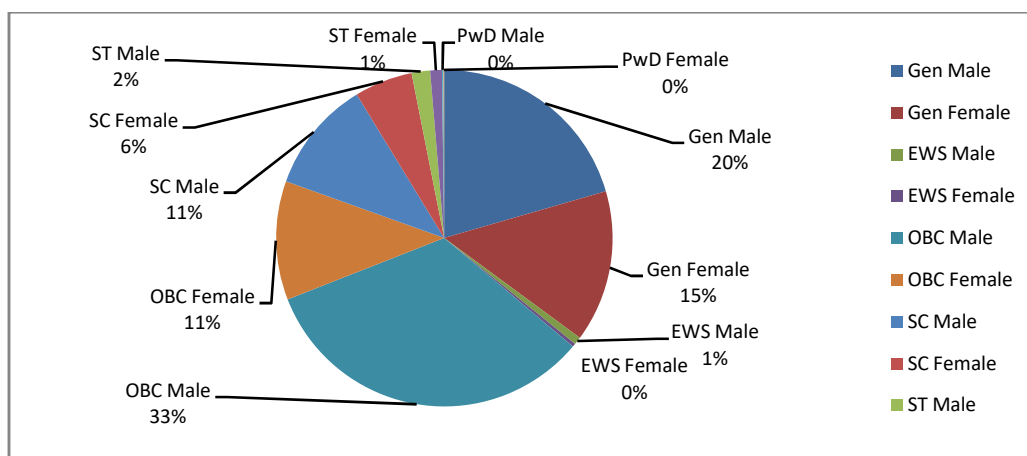

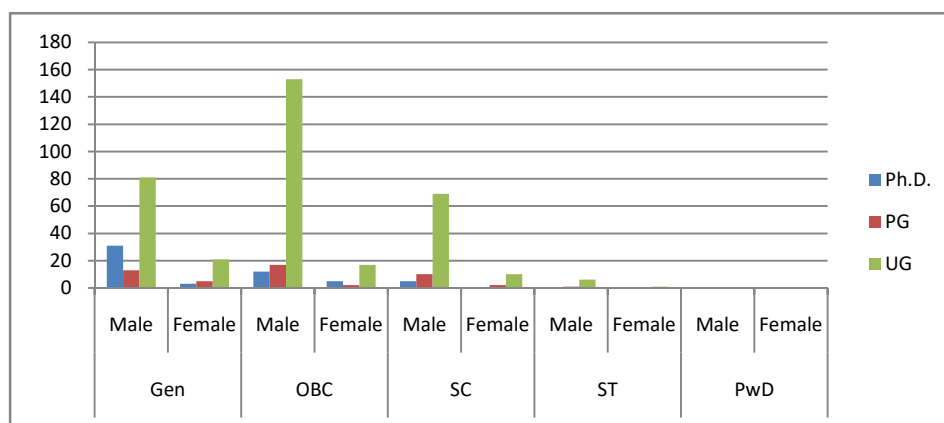

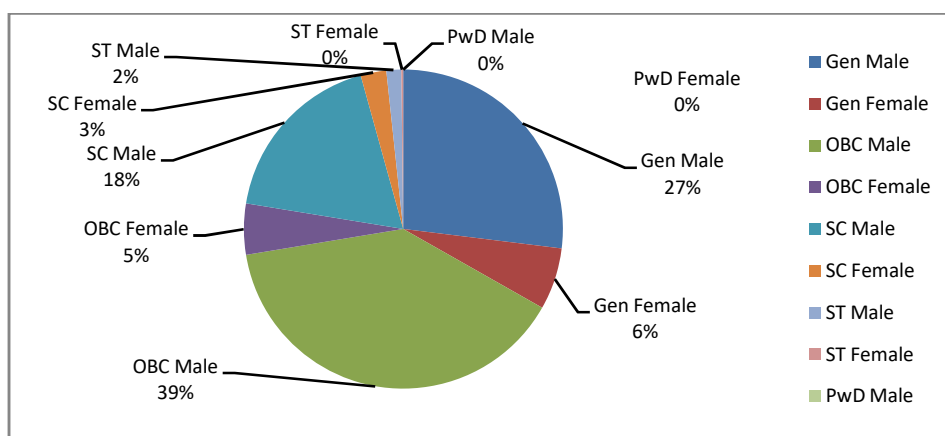

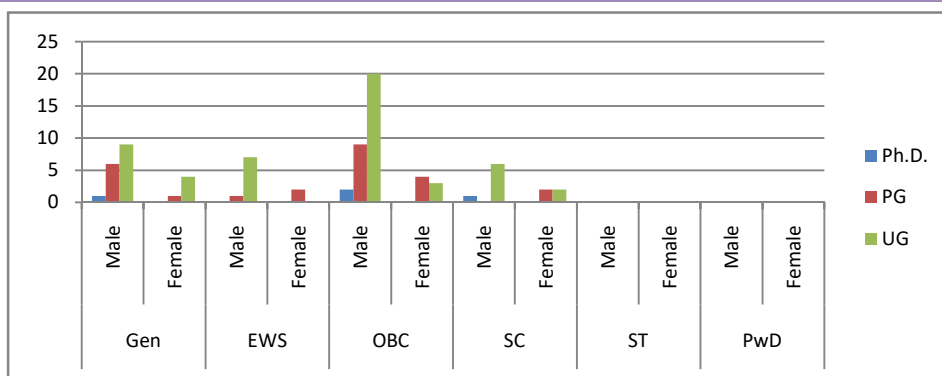

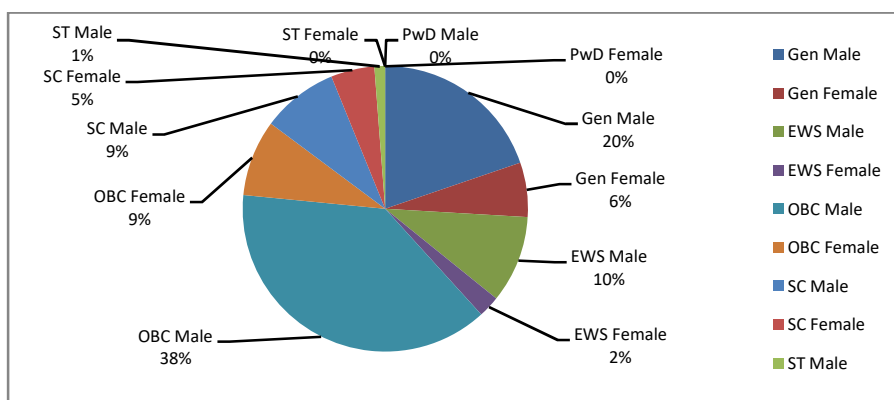

Geological Field Excursion for B.Sc. (Geology) and M.Sc. Students

1. The geological field excursion of B.Sc. III and M.Sc. (Previous) students was carried out in several parts of Archean Bundelkhand craton under the supervision of Professor Jayanta Kumar pati assisted by Mr. Anuj Kumar Singh (Research Scholar) during November 8 to 18, 2019. The students were exposed to various types of geological mapping techniques, variation in granite composition including their structural and textural aspects, mineralization in quartz veins and its contact with granites, pegmatites, mafic dykes etc. They were also exposed to the study of ophiolite sequence, shear zones, mylonites, subdued topography, pillow basalts, komatiite etc. Further, all the students were visited to the Dhala impact structure (Shivpuri district, Madhya Pradesh) and Sukwa-Dukwa dam Site, Babina.
2. The geological field excursion has been accomplished during 10th to 18th February 2020 under the supervision of 02 faculty members of the department, Dr. Ravindra Pratap Singh and Dr. Arvind Kumar. A team of 25 M.Sc. students had practical exercise on modern tools and techniques in the field of economic geological mapping. The field excursion has been conducted in and around Ganga River Basin (Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh) and Aravali Region (Jaipur and Ajmer) of Rajasthan.

Introduction:

The foundation stone of the Institute was laid by the first Prime Minister of India Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru on April 14, 1949. Pt. Later in 1967, on the advice of AICTE and UGC, the course was bifurcated into a three year Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) degree course in Electronics and Telecommunication (after B.Sc.) and to a three semester post graduate degree course i.e. M.Tech. in Electronics Engineering. Further, in the year 1982 a new course/subject in Computer Science (as one of the subjects in B.Sc.) leading to a Bachelor's degree in Science was introduced. Subsequent to the introduction of new subject in Computer Science at undergraduate level, it was desirable to have a full-fledged Post Graduate course in Computer Science. The Department was sanctioned a prestigious DRDO Project (the only centre in North India) by the name "Manpower Development in the area of Computer Science" in the year 1986. In the year 2008, three-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) course was replaced by 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) degree course after 10+2. A new branch of Engineering in Computer Science leading to Bachelor's Degree in Technology i.e. B. Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) was also introduced in the year 2008. The Department started a new three-year Post Graduate degree course named as Master of Computer Applications (MCA) from the academic session 2018-19. The institute has a very good placement record and its Alumni of this Department are giving their services in the engineering and computer science fields over in India and abroad and are occupying key positions in their fields.

- **Electronics and Communication Engineering:** Microwave Engineering, Microstrip Antenna, Embedded Systems, Optical Fiber Communication, VLSI Technology, Microwave and Antenna, Milli-meter Waves, Fiber Optic Communication, High Performance Computing, Soft Materials and Condensed Matter Physics etc.
- **Computer Science and Engineering:** Image Processing and Computer Vision, Natural Language Processing and Sentiment Analysis, Parallel and Distributed Computing and Cloud Computing, Cyber Security and Internet of Things, Optimization and Multimedia, Cryptography and Big Data Mining, Real-Time System design, Computer Networks WSN, MANET, Machine Learning, Data Science, Deep Learning etc.

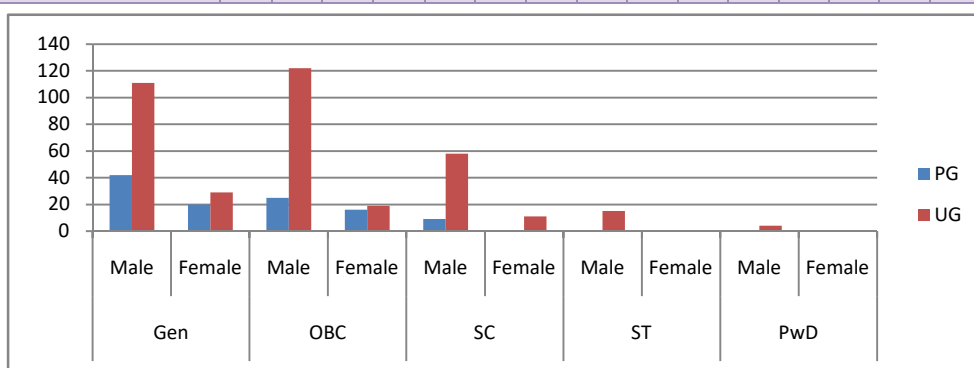

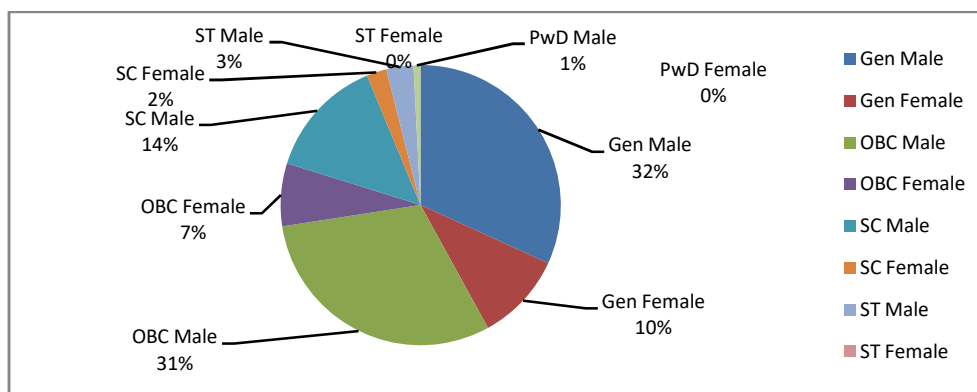

Introduction:

The department of Home Science was established in 1945, in pre independent India, with a two year undergraduate course with the objective to educate women. The department currently has 4 academic programmes - 1 Undergraduate course - B.Sc. Home Science (1945), 2 Postgraduate courses - M. Sc. Textile and Apparel Designing (2009), M. Sc. Food and Nutrition (2019), Ph.D. Programme - In all applied fields of Home Science (2011). Prof. Sangita Srivastava was the Former Head of the Department and presently Vice Chancellor of Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya University, Prayagraj). Dr. Neetu Mishra is currently the Head of Department. The department has 8 permanent faculties comprising of 1 Professor (on leave), 1 Associate Professor and 6 Assistant Professors. The department has 10 research scholars, doing research in innovative fields of apparel, dyeing, printing methods, weaving, finishing and fortified product development on foods and clinical investigation of food material using animal model. The department is actively engaged in community development programmes too. The Department comprises of: 1 library, 1 staff room, 2 faculty rooms, 1 seminar room, 3 class rooms, 4 well equipped laboratories which cater to 16 practical's of undergraduate and post graduate course, 1 laboratory for research scholars, Office, Head's room, 4 rest rooms (2 for the students), 1 sitting area for faculty and student interaction.

Home science is a multidisciplinary subject that involves an interdisciplinary approach in synthesizing knowledge which focuses on following thrust areas:

- **Clothing and Textiles:** Dyeing, Printing, textile testing, computer aided designing, garment designing, drafting and garment construction.
- **Food and Nutrition:** Important nutrients, nutritional biochemistry, community nutrition, public health nutrition, health and hygiene, therapeutic diets and food science & food analysis, nutritional counselling.
- **Human Development:** Child development theories, study of life span and psychological counselling.
- **Extension Education:** Teaching and communication, various community programs, community work, folk songs, puppetry, street plays.
- **Family Resource Management:** Interior decoration, management of human resources, flower arrangement, pottery making.

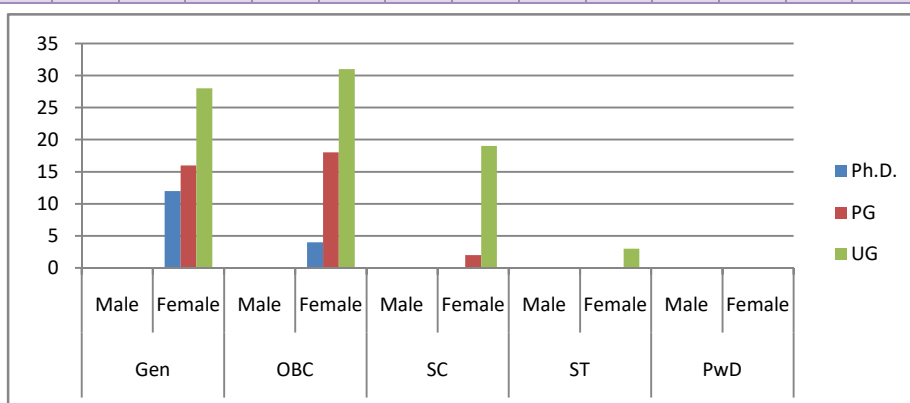

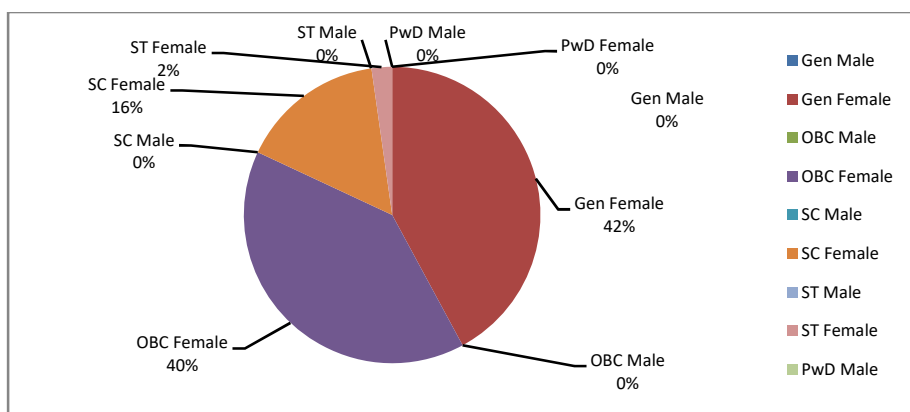

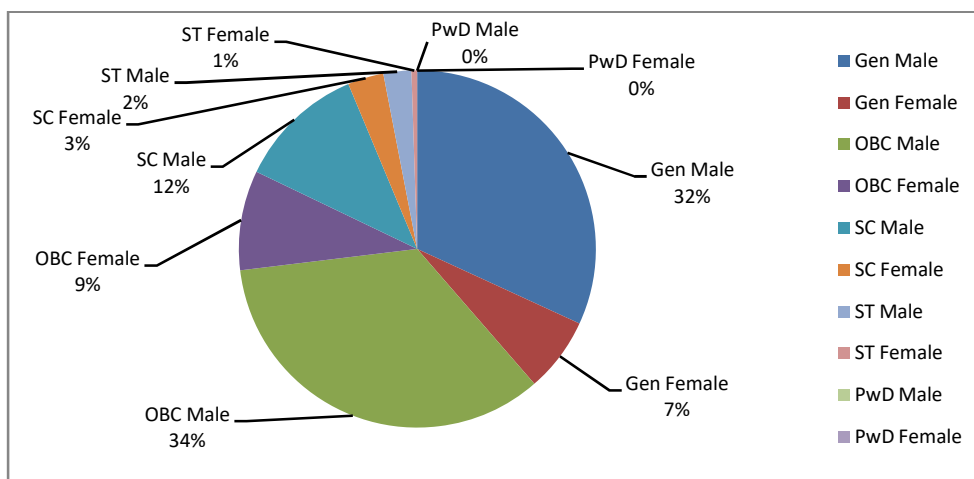

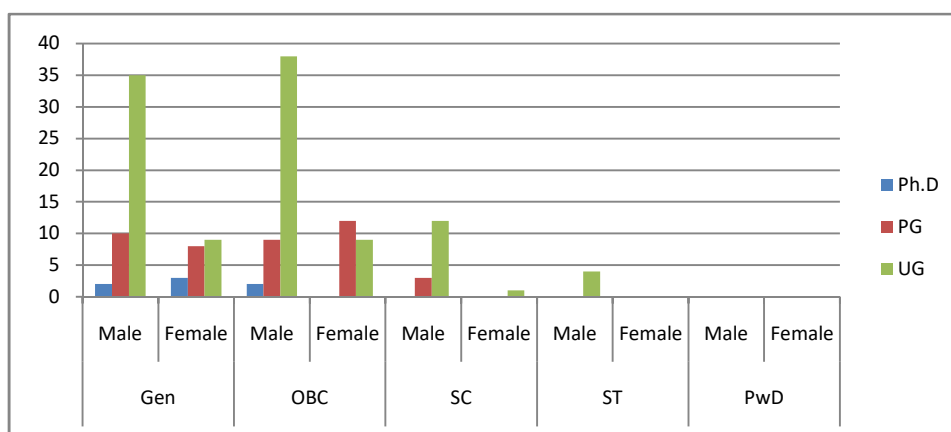

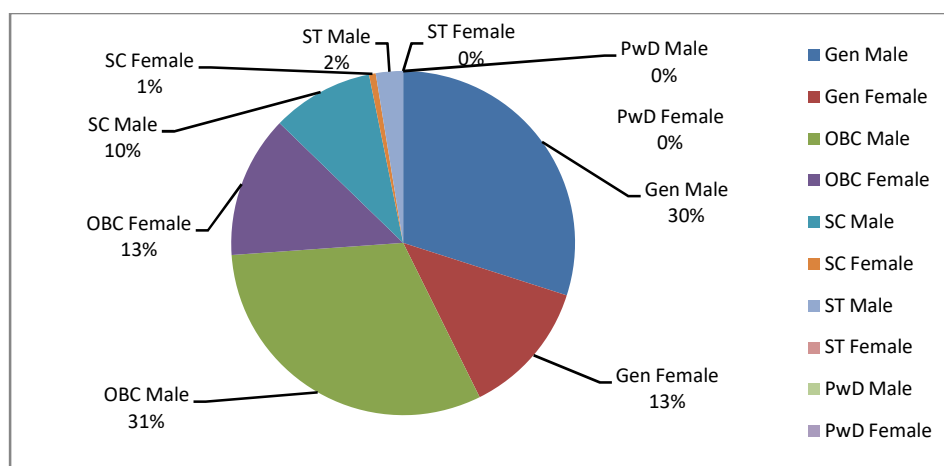

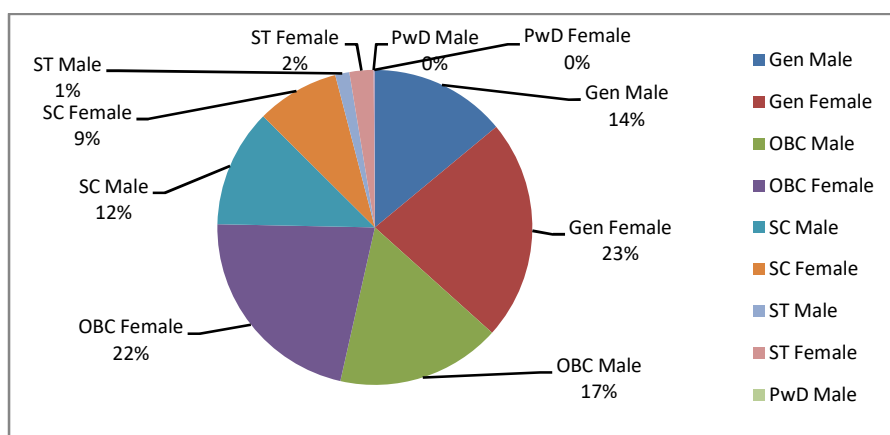

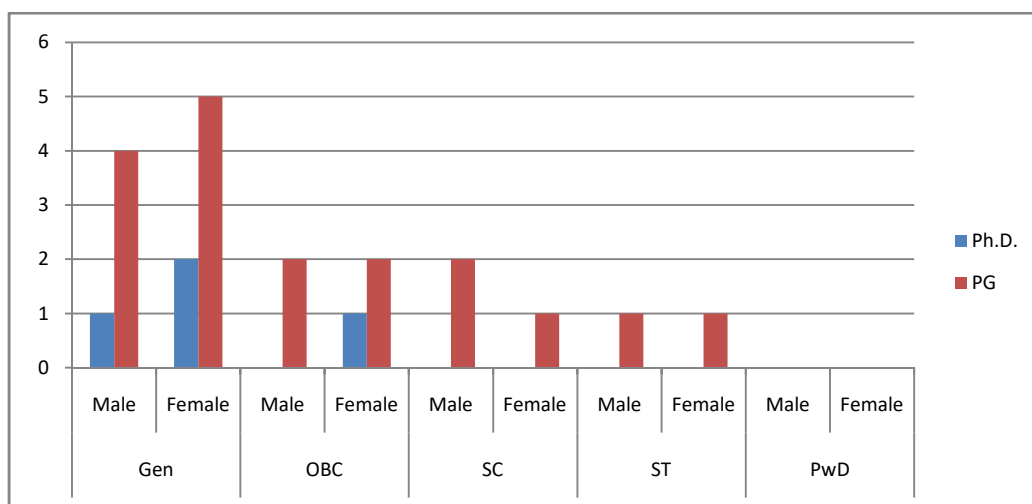

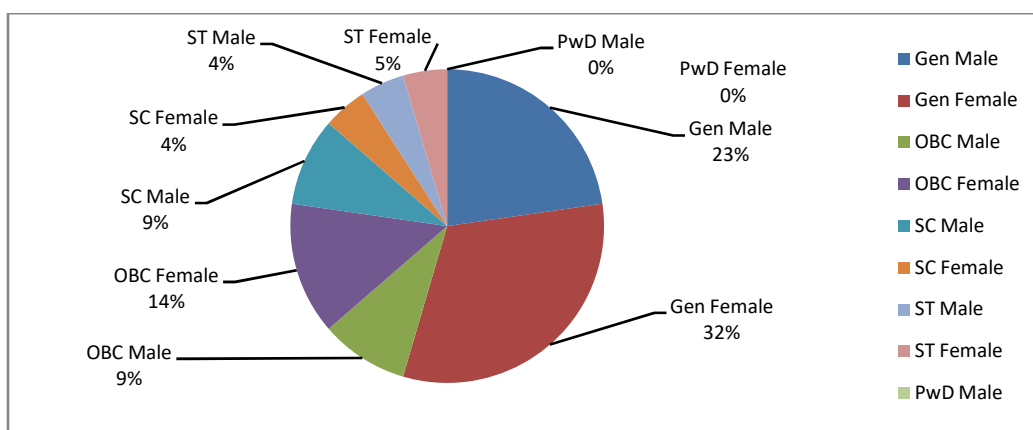

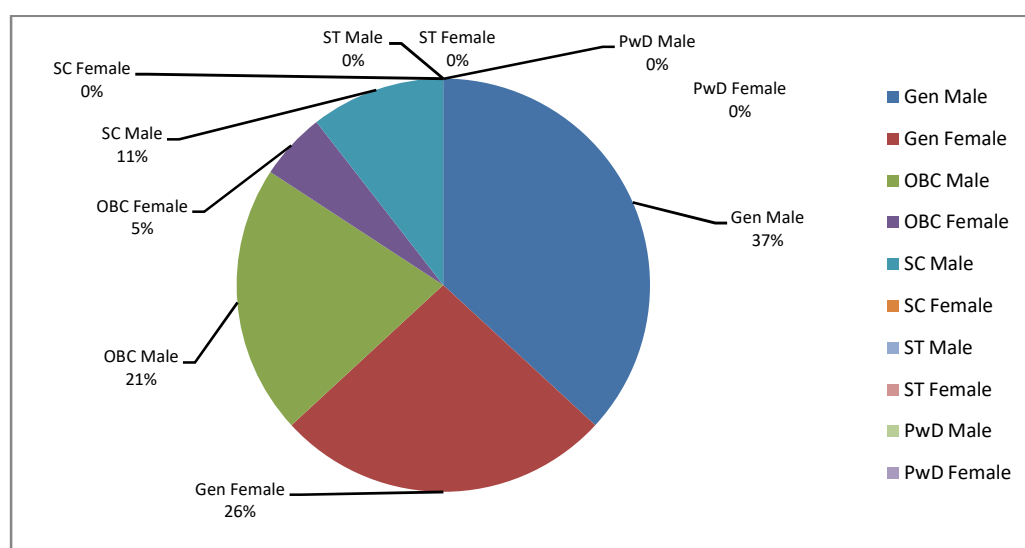

Introduction:

Research in the area of Climate Dynamics and Mathematical Modeling started in the KBCAOS and MNSCoSS in the year 2000 with the generous support from the NCAOR, Goa/MoES, and ISRO, GoI. In 2009, KBCAOS was established by the UGC as the Centre with potential of research excellence with 7 permanent teaching positions. The teaching course (M.Tech in ESS) and research programme (Ph.D.) of the Centre are designed in such a way so that it develops a deep understanding of the fundamental principles of Atmospheric and Ocean Sciences along with creating innovative ability to solve new and challenging problems. 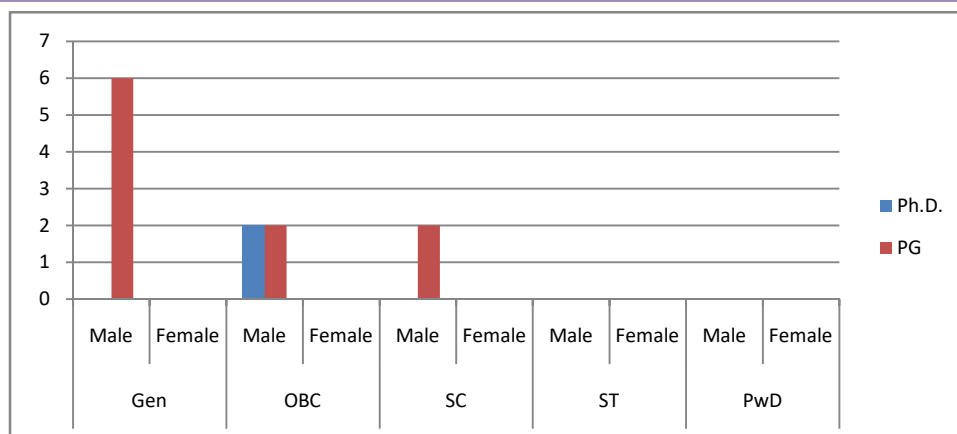

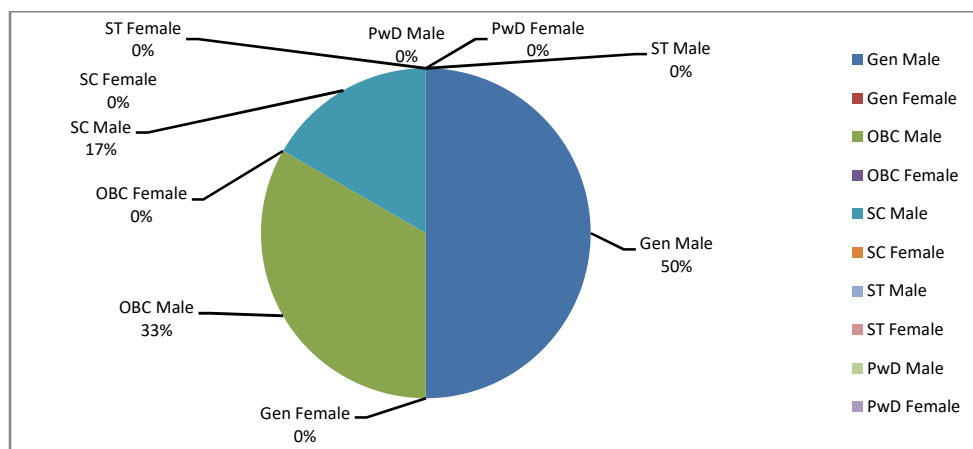

Future Projections:

- To carry out the hydrological impacts investigation of land use/land cover change and climate variability in headwater region of a typical humid subtropical inland river basin.
- To combine land use models (Markov chain, Dyna-CLUE) with hydrological model (SWAT, VIC) to understand the water availability
- To perform model based sensitivity experiments to understand sources of errors in the simulation of monsoon and to develop land surface/boundary layer/shallow convection/convective triggering schemes using observations/modeling to reduce such errors.
- To explore potential impacts of climate change using land use patterns and hypothetical climate scenarios established on the basis of analyzing long-term climatic observations.
- To develop stochastic climate model for the prediction of extreme rainfall events.
- To configure regional earth system model (atmosphere-ocean-land-biosphere) over the Indian sub-continent region for improved seasonal prediction of Indian monsoon rainfall.
- To understand changes in the Indian summer monsoon rainfall in a Warming Environment
- To configure malaria model over the Indian region for assessment of impact of climate change in the malaria transmission in the next 4-5 decades.
- To develop ocean sea-ice biogeochemical modeling and assimilation setup

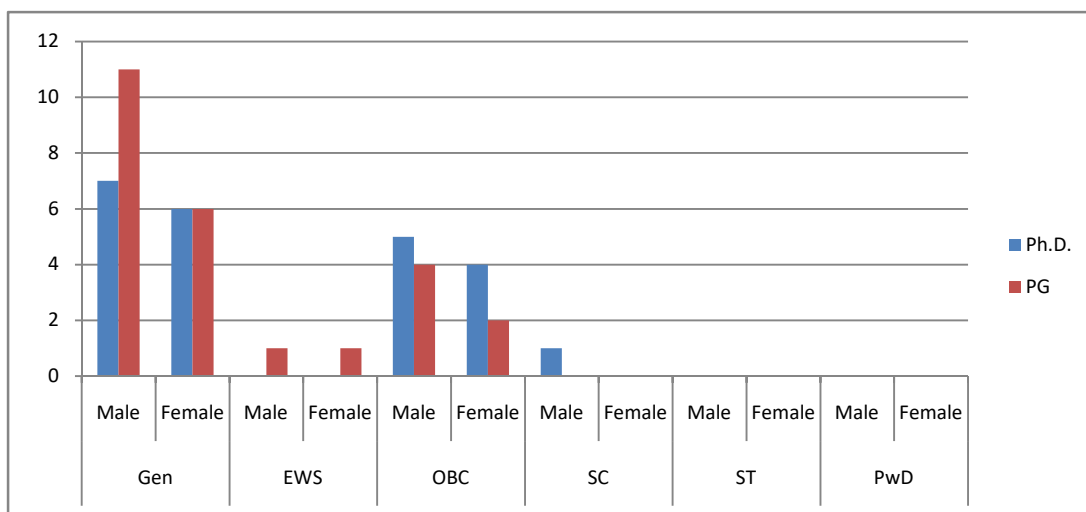

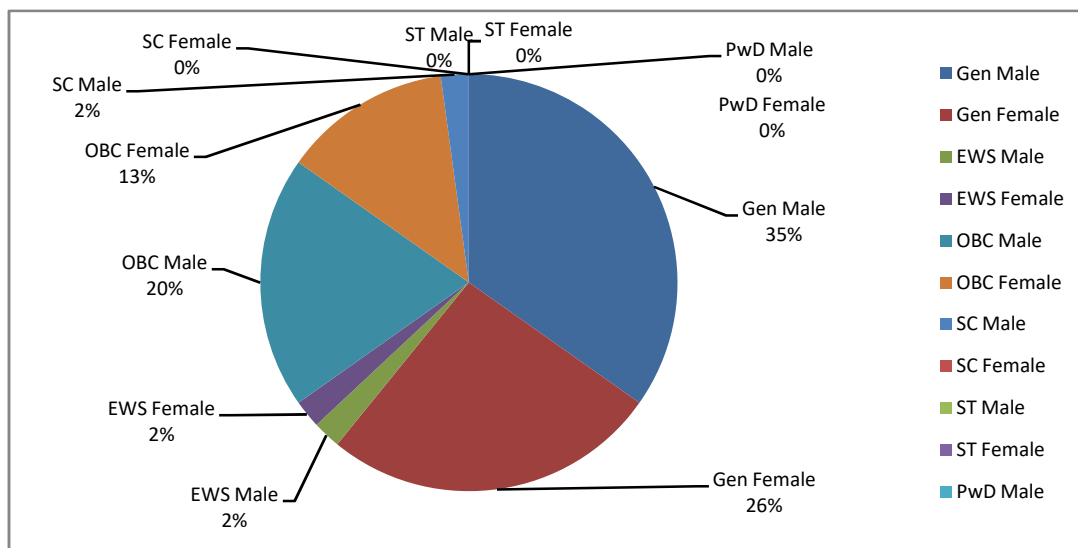

High Fluence Ion Beam Facility: Accelerator Center made functional

Introduction:

The high fluence ion beam facility at University of Allahabad is fully operational and user experiments as well as in-house experiments by PhD students were performed. A few results after the analysis were submitted in different journals for the publication and also some results are being analyzed. Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi has sanctioned a project titled "Utilization of HIGH FLUENCE ION BEAM FACILITY (UHFIBF) vide letter no. SR/MF/PS-04/2017/G" worth a fund of INR ~4 Crore to run the facility.

Thrust Areas:

- The objective is to run the accelerator based research facility in Allahabad University using ECR ion source to create an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas.
- Accelerator based laboratory will provide best possible environment for training human resource as it encompasses latest technologies such as data analysis, computer control, analog and digital instrumentation, Ultra high vacuum, etc.
- It will be gradually developed for providing opportunity to younger generation to get involved in projects involving state of the art technologies.
- An in-house facility of this type in the university will most certainly help in attracting students towards experimental sciences.

Summary of progress:

Research work done with the facility so far:

1. Inconel alloys (625 and 690), a nickel based superalloy that possesses high strength properties and resistance to elevated temperatures were irradiated with He^{2+} with 650 keV energy with varying fluences from 1×10^{14} ions/cm² to 1×10^{16} ions/cm². These experiments were performed by the group of Prof. Yogesh Chandra Sharma, Vivekanand Global University, Jaipur and his students Mr. Deepanshu Arora and Mr. Sanjay Sharma. Total 76 samples were irradiated.
2. Ceramic samples were irradiated with Xe^{19+} , 6.175 MeV and Xe^{12+} , 3.9 MeV energies with varying fluences from 1×10^{14} to 1×10^{16} ions/cm². Experiments were performed by the group of Dr. Pawan Kumar Kulriya and his

students Mr. Saurabh Kumar Sharma and Mr. Aabid Hussain from Inter University Accelerator Centre, New Delhi. Total 12 samples were irradiated during the experiment.

3. 1.36 MeV Xe ions were implanted with different fluences (1×10^{15} , 3.3×10^{15} , 1×10^{16} , 1×10^{17} ions/cm²) on Au/Si, Au/quartz samples. The experiment was performed by the group of Prof. D. K. Avasthi, Amity University, Noida. Ms. Sumaya Nissar (Research Scholar) has performed the experiment.
4. 6.5 MeV Xe ions were implanted with different fluences (3×10^{14} , 1×10^{15} , 3×10^{15} ions/cm²) on Au-Pd, Au/Si, Au/quartz samples. The experiment was performed by the group of Prof. D. K. Avasthi, Amity University, Noida. Ms. Deepti (Research Scholar) has performed the experiment.
5. 120 keV Ar ions with two fluences (1×10^{15} , 1×10^{16} ions/cm²) were implanted on Au/Si, Au/quartz samples. The experiment was performed by the group of Prof. D. K. Avasthi, Amity University, Noida. Ms. Deepti (Research Scholar) has performed the experiment.
6. Polymer and composites of Au-C₆₀, Au-Ag-C₆₀ deposited on glass, quartz and TEM grid was implanted with Ar⁸⁺ ions with 2.6 MeV energy and varying fluences from 1×10^{16} ions/cm² to 5×10^{16} ions/cm². The experiment was performed by the group of Dr. Rahul Singhal from MNIT, Jaipur. Total 21 samples were implanted during the experiment.
7. In-house experiment was performed for investigating the ion irradiation induced mutation on rice seeds. The experiment was carried out with Ar⁸⁺, He²⁺, O⁶⁺, Xe²⁰⁺, ions with varying energies and fluences. There are a number of chemical, biological, physical processes are available to induce mutation but recently ion beam technology emerged as a new form of physical mutagen for the induction of mutation in plants, to produce new varieties of various plants, in place of X-rays, Y-rays, and neutrons. The main aim of ion beam induced mutation in plant breeding is to modify and develop Novel mutants (such as drought resistance, high productivity, high nutrient use efficiency etc.) and their related genes. This process is made possible due to high RBE (Relative Biological Effectiveness) of ion beams of growth inhibition, fatality etc. Most effective LET value for inducing mutant sectors without causing severe damage of genetic material is lies between (30-110 KeV/μm). Results suggested that ion beam generate high mutation frequency (mutation causes deletion of several base pair long genetic material which results in irreparable DNA damage) as well as wide mutation spectrum.
The result of present experiment is yet to be analyzed.

Main features

a) ECR source (Supernanogan)

1. Large area scanning: The beam can be raster scan for the large target area of 30 mm x 30 mm (± 15 mm x ± 15 mm)
2. High flux and high current: Because of high current from the ion source high flux of ions can be implanted in very short time period.
3. Switchability: The switching time between metal ions and gaseous ions is ~2-3 hours.
4. Range of ions: We can produce the metal ions by heating and sputtering techniques depending on element's melting point. Elements with higher melting points can be produced by using sputtering methods.

Moreover the Centre has got the responsibility of Post project Evaluation study of Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojna of 104 of Uttar Pradesh.

In campus selection 18 interested candidates have been selected and well placed from two successful batch of 15 students each. It is also worth to mention that University of Allahabad has been identified as spoke partner of Design and Innovation Centre of IIT-BHU getting funds from MHRD. Further, the university approved the change of nomenclature from M.Sc. Rural Technology and Development to M.Sc. Design and Innovation in Rural Technology.

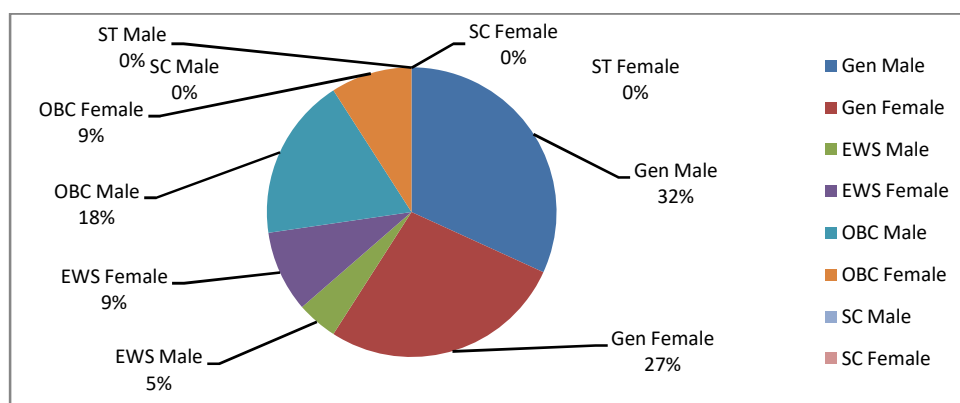

CENTRE OF FOOD TECHNOLOGY

Introduction:

The creation of Centre of Food Technology was done with a vision to encompass food science, food technology, food safety, food management, entrepreneurship development, food processing and rural development; agriculture and industry linkage through food processing, quality assurance for safe food, research and development on functional foods. M.Sc. Nutritional Sciences was started in year 2000. M.Sc. Food Technology programme was initiated in July 2002 as per the guidelines of UGC and ICAR. This was facilitated by a grant from Ministry of Food processing Industries, Govt. of India under its "Manpower Development Programme". The Centre also initiated doctoral programme in 2009 with specialization in Food Technology and Nutritional Sciences. In year 2015, centre started B.Voc. programme in Food Processing and Technology under the skill development program of India with the support from UGC .

The Centre has been sanctioned nearly Rs. 1 crore by MoFPI for setting up a commercial quality control laboratory to serve the industry in surrounding areas by providing testing services for quality assurance and food safety. With this support centre established Food Analysis and Research lab (FARL) and was given NABL accreditation in 2013 and later it was designated as Nodal Lab by FSSAI in year 2015. The Centre has been granted externally funded projects from time to time through various nodal organizations such as UGC, DST, APEDA, UPCAR etc

Thrust Areas:

- Providing education and training for creating human resource capacities for the food processing industry and academic institutions in the country.
- Upgrading the skills of academicians, research students and entrepreneurs in field of food science and nutrition.
- Basic, applied and adoptive research and development in areas of post harvest processing, preservation, foods safety & quality and value addition of food.
- Identification of dietary and nutrition problems prevalent among different segments of the population and improve public health through nutrition research.
- Analytical services to food industries and research institutes for testing the food and other organic samples.

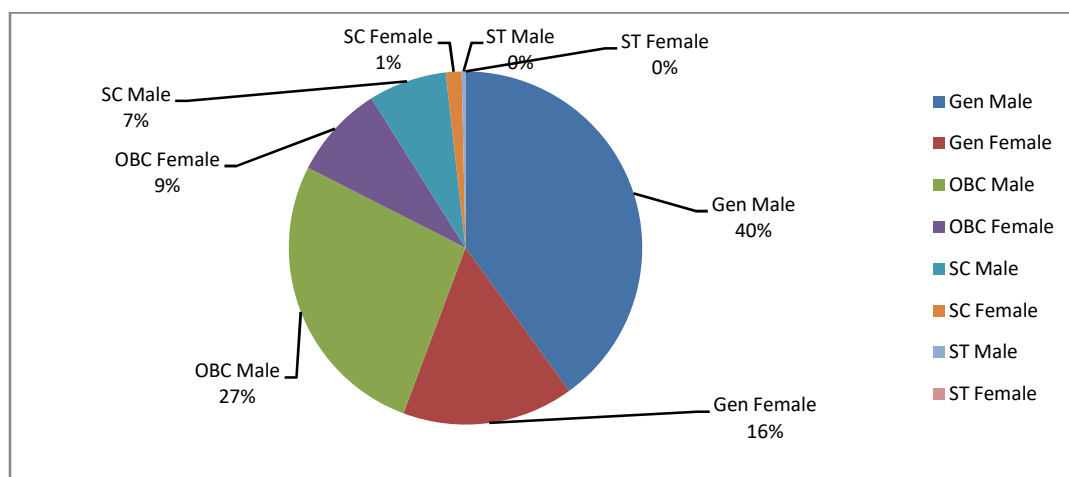

Thrust Areas:

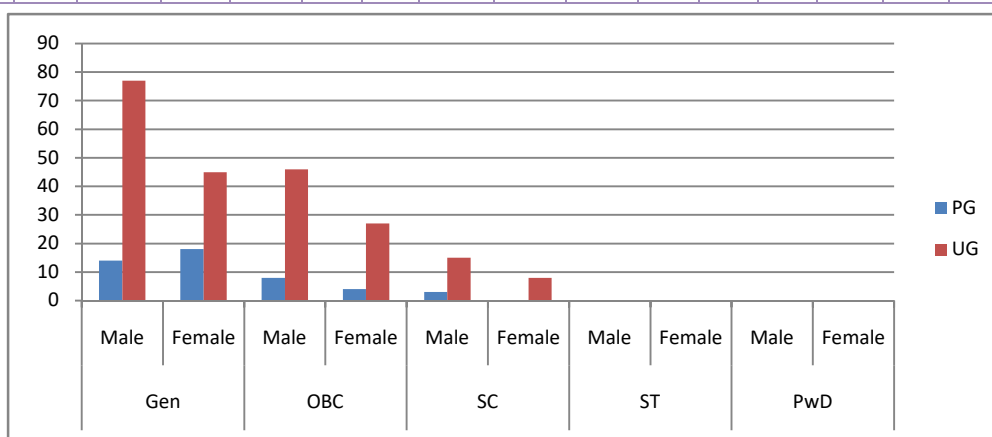

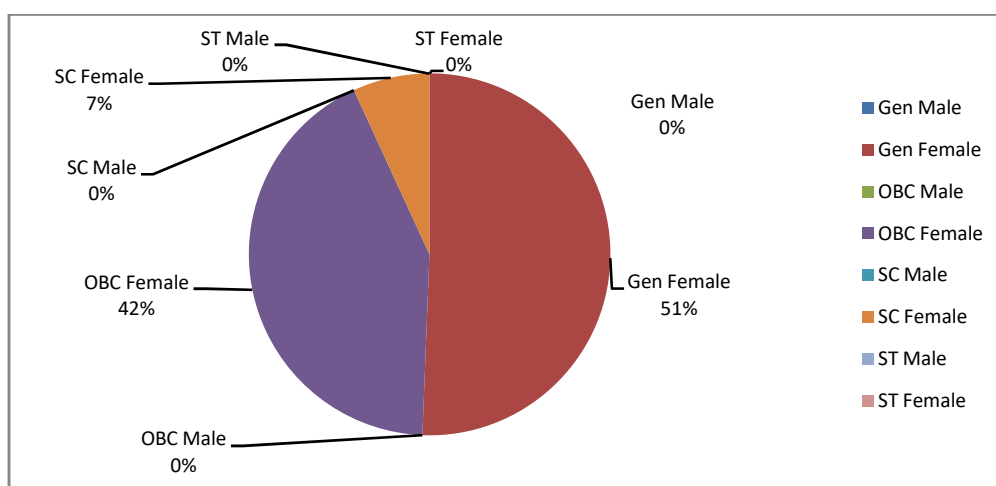

NATIONAL CENTRE OF EXPERIMENTAL MINERALOGY AND PETROLOGY

Introduction:

The National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology (NCEMP) is an Institute of the University of Allahabad and is a Research Unit. The main aim of the NCEMP, A.U. is to conduct high pressure-temperature experimental studies pertaining to the Earth, its interior and various materials. Various experiments for the synthesis of glasses, minerals, rocks and super hard materials, measurement of conductivity and seismic velocity in rocks, phase transformations in minerals, and rate of ascent of magma, etc. are routinely conducted using sophisticated high P-T facilities.

There are different types of High P-T equipments available, such as Multi-Anvil High Pressure-Temperature apparatus, Piston-Cylinder equipment and Hydrothermal apparatus. The NCEMP has sophisticated analytical equipments such as Electron Probe Micro Analyzer and Powder XRD equipments for material characterization. It also has a well-equipped workshop and other technical facilities. The Centre has facilities for synthesis of advanced novel materials such as sol-gel synthesis, melt quenching, hot press and ball milling techniques.

GOVIND BALLABH PANT SOCIAL SCIENCE INSTITUTE

Introduction:

The **Govind Ballabh Pant Social Science Institute** became a Constituent Institute of the University of Allahabad on July 14, 2005, when the University of Allahabad Act, 2005 came into force. Previously it was established as Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) set up in association with the State Governments, in our case, the Government of Uttar Pradesh in 1980. The Institute undertakes interdisciplinary research in the field of social sciences. The main areas of research at the Institute include development planning and policy, environment, health and population, human development, rural development and management, culture, power and change, democracy and institutions. The Institute has M.Phil and D.Phil in social sciences and a MBA Rural Development Programme. In both programmes the degree is awarded by the University of Allahabad.

Thrust Areas

The Institute research is now focusing on the following three areas:

Economic and Social Policies and strategies: wherein the major concerns include agrarian structure, issues related to land, labour and employment; environment, disaster, poverty and climatic change; food security ; development related displacement and most importantly institutions and development. Social policy concerns include population growth and resource constraints, which are of utmost importance to the most densely populated state of Uttar Pradesh; problem associated with ageing; intergenerational transmission of advantages and disadvantages of education, health and stamina; the inter-relationship of under nutrition , health and eco-systems; enlarging human choices: securing freedom, well-being and dignity for every human being; and gender and development issues.

Culture, Politics and Society: Concept of power, popular cultures , memory and past, orality and printed knowledge of Dalit, subaltern and other marginalised communities, local knowledge, structures and forms of subaltern cultural consciousness and linkage between cultural resources of the communities and process of development. Newly emerging public cultures, new turns in religious practices, mobile communities and moving images in globalised world, diasporic cultures, various forms of identity politics, cinema and media and relationship between politics, culture and state in colonial and contemporary India. Explorations of alternative public sphere, dissenting voices, social and political literatures, political of representations and emancipator and syncretic cultural forms.

Democratic Processes and Institutions: concept of justice in democratic processes, relationship between social justice and marginalities, governmentality, new modes of participatory governance, popular aspirations and new social movements, formation of civil societies, state, power and citizenship and public sphere as space of democratic deliberations of post colonial Indian society. Issues of human suffering, forced displacement and migration, human rights and women dignity in contemporary globalisation induced developmental democracy. 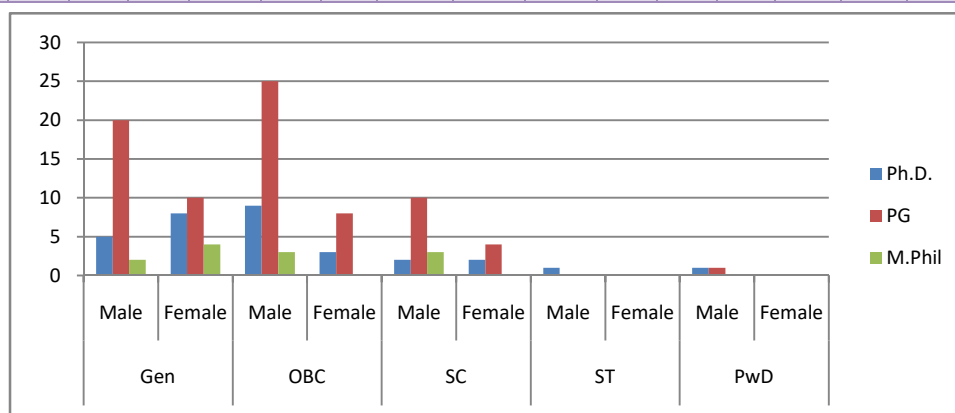

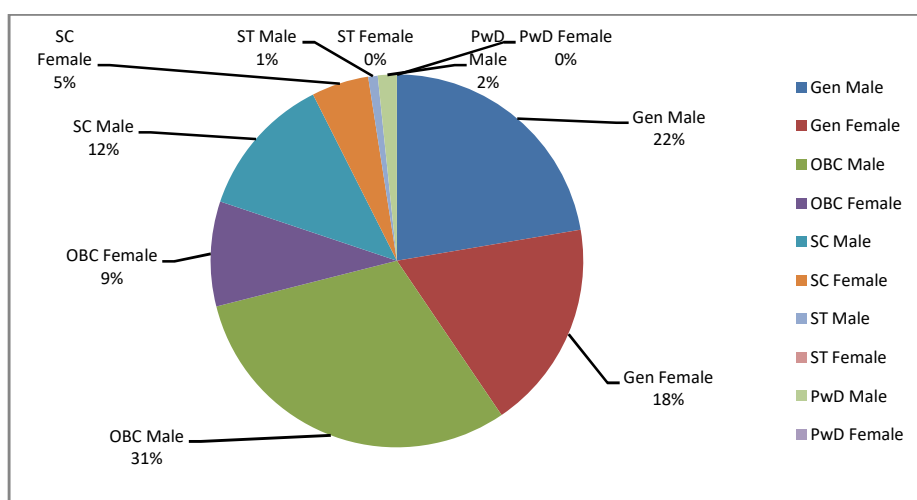

STUDENTS' WELFARE ACTIVITIES

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The year 2019-2020 marked with the DSW set up making tangible gains by way of consolidation and giving thrust to its major initiatives. The year also erased the shadows/pangs of transition in a large measure. Better amenities, larger financial allocation in assistance to students, better healthcare, hygiene, spurring sporting activities and, the last but not least, the hard fought and won peace and tranquility in hostels and the campus have been the cornerstone of the multifaceted activities of the preceding year. Progress and development have been at the core of DSW and his team endeavors. The progress, though slow but surefooted, has instilled yet greater resolve to pursue the unfinished agenda of growth. Unquestionably the mood at the DSW set up has been upbeat and triumphant.

Here are some of the modest successes achieved through sustained team spirit and camaraderie to which the DSW Board, teachers, officers, staff, and students have contributed immensely.

Welfare Measures (General)

Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored "Merit cum Means" Based Scheme .

Financial assistance for meeting partial expenses of medical treatment for serious diseases, accidental injuries etc. to the students

Health Facilities of Students:

- University Health Centre is running for the medical welfare of students and its employees of the University under the supervision of Senior Medical Officer. Homoeopathy doctor, lady doctor, para medical staff and two ambulance facility are also available for students welfare.
- Health Insurance: University has provided health insurance to the students for the session 2019-20.

Welfare of Physically challenged students.

Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently Abled Students has been the nodal Centre for facilitating and supporting academic and digital inclusion for the differently abled students of the University. In the session 2019-2020, it continued to provide the necessary academic resources for the students. It is equipped with computers, scanners, several screen reading software's (specially meant for visually challenged)etc. The Centre was established in 2009 and, therefore, it was a high time overhaul these facilities. In pursuance of this 11 computer systems were overhauled for their efficient functioning. Further, the problem of access and the provision of barrier free environment for the differently abled students was addressed. It was declared by the University Administration that barrier free buildings are a necessary pre-condition for facilitating the educational inclusion of differently abled students and, in pursuance of this, designs for railing and ramps etc have been cleared for the old departmental building of the University. At present the work for provision of barrier- free building is at an advance stage. The grievances of the differently abled students regarding hostel allocation were addressed and they were allotted room in the University hostels on a priority basis. Also, given the constraint of space in the hostel, the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for the Differently Abled Students was activity involved in facilitating the admission of students in the hostels for the visually-challenged students run by the State Government. Due to the support and facilitation by the Centre even some visually challenged student could do well in the competitive examination for professional courses and jobs. The differently abled students who could not be get admission in University hostels were accommodated in State Government hostel through the efforts of the centre.

Admission of physically challenged students

DSW office is continuously working with the Director, Admissions to facilitate physically challenged candidates to get admission in different courses of the University (UG+PG+Law+Professional) by organizing medical board for examining disability of the candidates seeking admission under physically challenged category, and recommend genuine candidates for admission

Measures to enforce discipline, law and order in the Hostels and the Campuses

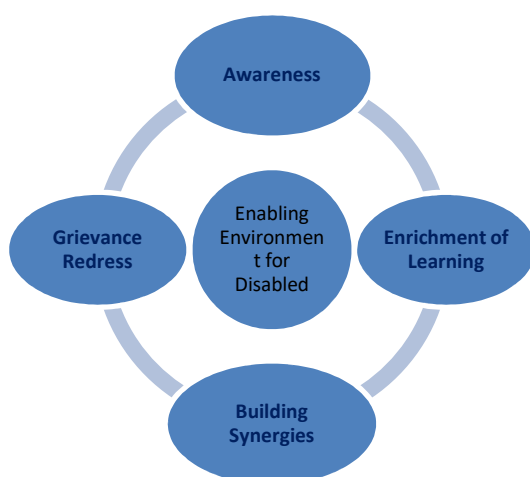
- Setting up of anti ragging cell to monitor/redress the menace of ragging in hostels and campuses. Teams made massive surprise checks and succeeded in containing incidence of ragging. Thankfully constant vigil resulted in no serious cases of ragging.
- Periodic raids/strict vigilance of combined teams of DSW/ Proctorial board and Warden/Superintendent of the hostels carried out to evict anti social elements/ students with criminal records. Tough measures to enforce discipline yielded positive results.
- Organized Meditation/Yoga and health check up camps in the hostels & University Health Centre in collaboration with various prominent NGOs working in this area. Health check up camps for girl students organized on Sundays in collaboration with Women's Advisory Board (WAB) were largely attended

Scholarship and financial assistance to the students by the DSW office

- Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored Merit cum Means Based Scheme . The scholarship awarded to 400 students of UG/PG/IPS/Professional courses @ Rs. 5000/- per student for a session. For the session 2019-20, 323 eligible students were awarded McM scholarship.
- Financial assistance towards meeting partial expenses for medical treatment to students suffering from serious diseases, accidental injuries etc. A sum of Rs. 46000/= was disbursed to the beneficiaries in the session 2019-20.
- Financial assistant for the purchase of books to the poor students out of Poor Boys Funds account. For the session 2019-20, 410 eligible students were awarded assistance.
- Financial assistant for the cultural programme in the various departments & hostels of the University were granted. Total amount of Rs. 2,52,000/- was granted for above activities.
- Financial assistance was also given to students of different units of the University for organizing their annual functions. The Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently abled students organized International Day for persons with disability under the aegis of DSW office.

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU CENTRE FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED STUDENTS

Jawaharlal Nehru Center for Differently -Abled Students (JNC DAS) was established in 2009 during the Eleventh Plan. Only a few Universities/colleges in India have such a facility for the differently-abled students. It is an enabling unit for the differently-abled/ *divyang* students. In last three years more than 110 students enrolled and benefited from the facilities available with the center. Significantly, the Coordinator of JNC DAS was also made the Chairman of Equal Opportunity Cell in 2016 and this gave an even greater help to the Center in mainstreaming the issues of the differently abled students of the University.



In 2019-20 27 students were enrolled with it. The Center has a computer lab with e books as well as screen reading software like NVDA for the visually challenged persons. Sixteen more e-books were added to the center's existing learning resources which consist of 392 books in 12 different subjects as well as Braille books available in the Central Library of the University.

Like last year more than 30 students got accommodation in State Government Hostel (Rashtriya Ucha Siksha Adhyanrat Dhrstibadhith Chatravas) especially designed for the *divyang* students. Grievances were promptly redressed. There was an ongoing process to distribute mobility and assistive devices to students.

International Day for persons with Disability (IDPD) was celebrated on December 10, 2019. Several competitions like GK Test and Debate Competition was organized in the run up to the IDPD function. The Vice Chancellor and Dean, Students Welfare distributed the prizes to winners and motivated the students to overcome their disability to excel in their studies.

SPORTS BOARD

The aim and object of the Sports Board are to promote physical well being of the University students in general, by providing facilities for game and sports and by organizing competitions and tournaments. Keeping in mind, the aims and objectives, the activities of the Board are planned. In spite of the infrastructural deficiency and resource crunch, the Board has been able to achieve National level achievements. A brief report about the achievements of the Board are as follows:

1. UNIVERSITY LEVEL ACTIVITY.

Selection trials/Coaching Camps were organized in different discipline for the final selection of the University teams. The selected teams participated in U.P. Championships/Local Tournaments before their final departure for the Inter University Tournaments.

2. INTER UNIVERSITY LEVEL ACTIVITY

Total number of 31 (Thirty One) teams participated in North Zone and All India Inter University Tournaments/Championship. The break up of the participating teams is as follows:

The University through its International Students Advising and Services (ISAS) will continue to play a major role globally in the field of higher education, by seeding new ideas and creating knowledge, and by imparting high level of training with values and social commitment to all its International Students as well. Since its inception on July 14, 2005 as a Central University, the University has reaffirmed to live up to these ideals. We believe that the University is responsible not just for imparting knowledge, but for disseminating knowledge in society; so as to build a better Society at national and international levels in future.

The University has a separate International Students Advisory Board under the International Student Advisor to advise and facilitate the International Students.

With a view to assist international students, University has established an International Students Office in the University campus. The University of Allahabad model for Internationalization of Higher Education has these unique features:

- In the age of globalization, the University has set out to make its presence felt globally through internationalization of its programmes and opening new avenues of association for global student community.
- With the approval of UGC and the Central Government, the International Student Advisors' Office of the University proposes to have a number of MOUs signed with leading Universities whereby sharing of the facilities in the university and exchange of Faculty and students can be made possible.
- Besides looking after admissions and eligibility, the Office of the International Student Advisor coordinates with ICCR, Ministry of External Affairs, different embassies and consulates for various purposes including grant/award of Scholarships.

Sponsored Student Programs

The Sponsored Student Program is a part of International Student Advising and Services (ISAS) at the University of Allahabad with the specific goal of assisting sponsors and sponsored students by:

- Supporting the academic goals of sponsored students and their sponsors.
- Providing records of student's academic standing when requested.
- Facilitating communication between students and sponsors to help with financial and administrative questions.
- Working with the Sponsoring Agencies as well as the Foreign Registration Office to answer sponsored students' questions and to help students maintain and understand their immigration status.

Services for Sponsored Students

- A special orientation session for sponsored students
- Help with providing medical facilities when required. Facilitation is given to Sponsored Students to avail medical insurance, if the student desires.

CENTRAL CULTURAL COMMITTEE

The speaker of this session was Prof. Gopeshwar Singh, University of Delhi. During the week, a debate competition for students was organized on 3rd October, poster making and slogan competition were organized on 4th October, essay writing competition on 5th October and *rangoli* competition on 6th October. CENTRAL LIBRARY

Introduction:

History: The Central Library has started its journey on the path of improvement. It was established to cater the needs of the students, research scholars, and teachers of the University. It not only helps in supporting the class room instructional programmes of the University, but also unfolds the horizon of knowledge with regard to the different research programmes carried out by the University.

The Central Library developed out of the library of the Muir Central College, Allahabad (established in 1872, and affiliated with the university from 1872 to 1922, when it was subsumed in the university upon beginning its career as a teaching University). Foundation stone of the University library building was laid by Sir John Hewett on 17th Jan.1910. The University Library was started in 1916. In 1946-47, Dr. S. R. Ranganathan, Father of Library Science in India, was invited to suggest ways and means of improving the library. He submitted the development plan in March 1947, which was published by the university in the same year. Its contents covered wide range of areas: such as new library building, manpower, finance and other relevant items. A special committee was constituted to review the library development plan submitted by Dr. Ranganathan. The committee pointed out that the central library building constructed in 1913-16 was inadequate. The most satisfactory thing would be to erect a new building designed in accordance with the modern library practice. It recommended the conversion of the Darbanga Hall into a reading room for 500 under-graduates (250 on the ground floor and 250 on the first floor. A portion of the graduates reading room was to be divided into private cubicles for the use by serious students or research scholars. After some times it was felt that space in Darbhanga hall is inadequate to store the reading materials and provide library services.. The present library building was constructed in 1973. The present library building is more spacious and has potential for further expansion. The old library building is now occupied by the office of the Registrar, as well as Accounts and General section of the University.

Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC) and Anglo American Cataloguing Rules-2nd edition (AACR-2) are followed for the purpose of classifying and cataloguing the documents. LIBSYS-4, Library Management Software is being used for creation of database.

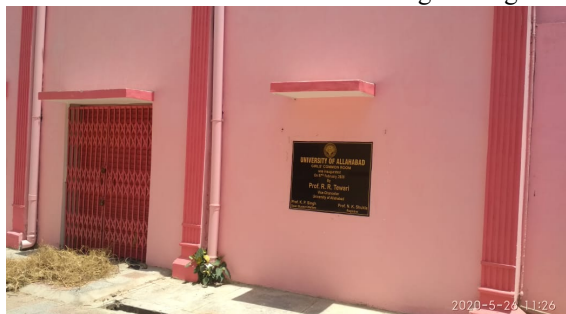

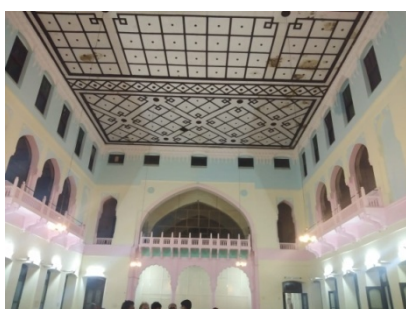
Girl's Common Room

OTHER ACTIVITIES

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) lead the implementation of digital initiatives of MHRD available on SWAYAM platform, such as MOOCs, e-PG Pathshala, and Swayam Prabha channels in the University. The research scholars and students, especially of the Dept. of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Earth and Planetary Sciences have registered for MOOCs courses in credit transfer programmes. The MOOCs courses have been included in the curriculum in few departments for this purpose as per the UGC regulations. The IQAC encouraged faculty members to develop and start new courses of study in the areas of national (societal) interest for quality teaching by way of MOOCs.

The efforts have been made towards transforming the University to a totally web-enabled University by augmentation of ICT resources as well as by increasing the use of ICT tools. The IQAC has provided necessary help and guidance to few departments for the organization of national and international seminars and conferences. Many of the journals recommended by the faculty members and head of the departments were forwarded by the IQAC to the CARE regional office at JNU for possible inclusion in the UGC-CARE list. The IQAC has provided necessary information to the teachers for entering into MoUs with the leading international and national organizations. The University entered into an MoU with Heidelberg University, Germany on Big Data Research and another MoU with NIT Delhi on collaborative research in Climate Dynamics.

One of the major push of the IQAC was towards encouraging innovative practices at all levels in the University. The IQAC motivated departments in improving the research standards and well as for creating a learner-centric environment which is conducive to quality education. The IQAC also helped the administrative wings in the organization of Convocation Ceremony in the University after a gap of nearly 15 years. The IQAC is developing a new Students' Feedback proforma with inclusion of more parameters, especially related to the Online teaching and learning, with a particular emphasis on MOOCs at SWAYAM platform. The IQAC has also helped in thorough and systematic revision of Doctor of Philosophy ordinances of the University which were adopted and implemented in the University.

The IQAC in an effort to give major boost to the academic and research environment of the University helped the FRC in the formulation and designing of totally Online recruitment process for the recruitment of new faculty members in the University. The FRC of the University in collaboration with the IQAC had initiated a massive recruitment drive for the Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff in the University. It is needless to mention that the University is currently severely understaffed and it is highly desirable that the appointment on vacant teaching and non-teaching posts be made at the earliest. The duly ratified revised roster for the vacant faculty positions as per MHRD, Govt of India guidelines was prepared and the vacant posts were advertised in Mar-Apr 2019 as per extant GoI norms. Several faculty members of the University were promoted under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS). An internal Cell was constituted to scrutinize all pending cases of CAS in the University for the timely promotions of faculty members. The IQAC has also made efforts in preparing the documents with proper justification for demanding additional faculty positions from the UGC so that new departments/courses in cutting edge disciplines of national interest may be started in the University at the earliest.

The Internal Quality Assessment Cell as per UGC norms was constituted on 11th June, 2020 by the University to build and ensure quality culture at the institutional level. The prime task of IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the institution. The first meeting of the Cell took place on July 2nd 2020 where following deliberations took place:

The Chair admitted that currently the University is struggling with many problems including the dearth of faculty and the Technical staff in most of the University Departments. Hence what to talk of external benchmark, the University is not even in a position to talk of internal benchmark i.e., competition within the Departments of the University.

The annual fee structure of all the courses in the University needs to be increased so that University may plan things well in future but for that the student community needs to be taken into confidence.

It was stated that besides other problems, like all others in the world, the University is facing the pandemic COVID-19 which has upset many plans but still the University has made some progress from January 2020 onwards. The following current initiatives were stated:

1. The University is trying to see that there is no communication gap anywhere. The University is trying to establish a system in place for everything so that work related with any student or any employee in the University can be smoothly carried out.
2. It is most important to create a teaching environment in the University. The University is trying to establish that the students understand well that they are integral active participants in the teaching and learning process.
3. A solution for active online learning has been created during the lockdown period where the reading material of the faculty members department-wise is being uploaded so that whenever a student at any place gets opportunity can open this portal to access the learning material which is relevant for him/her as per syllabi. The link of the portal named as “Learning Management System” of the University of Allahabad is www.lms.alluniv.ac.in. This portal has been created on Moodle platform, a free open source course management software package.
4. The University is going to have its own video studio by the first week of August, 2020 where good quality lectures of the faculty members shall be recorded, to be uploaded on this portal.
5. A Work from Home environment is being created by a team of University students. Once all the relevant files and documents are uploaded on a separate Server, it may be accessed ONLINE from anywhere. Once this solution is properly implemented, the University will have a paperless office. We are hopeful that this solution will be in place by the end of July, 2020.
6. An Alumni portal is being integrated with the main website of the University. The University acknowledges the contribution of all the alumni who have made an indelible mark wherever they reached or are there because of which the university is known as the Oxford of the East. We wish to request our alumni to provide fruitful and positive suggestions for the betterment of the university and urge them to join us in fostering a healthy and peaceful atmosphere not only in the university campus but the campus of all the constituent colleges as well. This portal shall facilitate Alumni to provide their inputs to the University. When they will link up, they will tell us about their past experience, how the University may reach them and how they may be involved for the guidance of the fresh students and the betterment of the University.

It was said that with a collective will one can overcome any problem. We need to gradually update our resources, particularly the augmentation of faculty personnel as per well laid out plan as the funds become available with the University. We need to plan well, need to define things to lay out the proper design for the implementation of the plan, carry through the planned activity, lay down the checks and monitor to see that progress is in the right direction as per plan and then finally Act to make corrections, if required. It was also said that Quality standards need to be laid down, once the system is in place and objections to those standards, if any, may be invited within a tight time slot but any objection without counter suggestion(s) may not be entertained.

It was stated that the University should lay down smaller achievable goals and move ahead for its implementation with better and cohesive planning.

It was also stated that when smaller number of people are available in the department, the responsibility of all of them increases tremendously. It was said that those who are a part of the University need to understand that they need to carry forward the Institution in best possible manner and for that they need to devote themselves to the cause.

The following were the other suggestions given by the members:

- A. All employees (Teaching/non-teaching) need to take a pledge that they have to carry the institution forward.
- B. Student should be attracted to the classroom. The student interaction must increase.
- C. Periodic Internal academic audit of the departments should be done in addition to the external audit.
- D. Inter department benchmarks may be defined in a time bound manner and strived to reach as per plan.
- E. The University should encourage industry academia interaction and both partner in mutual growth.
- F. Interactive seminars and Guest lectures from persons from profession be organized by the departments and the outcome pursued.

UGC HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Introduction:

The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (formerly Academic Staff College), University of Allahabad has envisaging its new multidimensional and integrative role in HE, become an active hub of academic activity for improving the quality of teachers which is the single most crucial and critical success factor for sustenance of HE in the present era of globalization, Realizing the different paradigms for quality management in HE, which include the paradigm of process control (accreditation), paradigm of integral quality management (TQM and EFQM) and paradigm of breakthrough and innovations, the HRDC has based its activities primarily on three components- quality of design, quality of conformance and quality of performance in order to control its quality and meet the standards required for assuring quality in teachers of HE and to train and develop human resource fit to face the challenges of HE in the Indian as well as the global context

The main aim of the Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) has been to facilitate quality education by upgrading the knowledge and performance of teachers serving in Universities and their affiliated Colleges. Some of the approaches undertaken by this HRDC to fulfill its aims to enhance the personality, performance, awareness and knowledge of the teacher participants include-

- Invocation of basic thoughts on being a good teacher - Values, Character, Commitment, Team Building, Work Culture, Human Resource Development and Academic Leadership qualities required in teachers for Societal Transformation,
- Creating Computer Awareness and in this way developing IT trained human Capital for quality education of the future generation, Power point Presentation.
- Revitalizing inputs for Higher education through Teacher empowerment, Inter-disciplinary dialogues, open and flexible Trans-disciplinary subjects, Innovative teaching Methodologies, Collaboration with Academic, Research and Specialized Institutes
- Creating awareness about the higher education System, Rules ,Regulations, Statutes and Policies, Motivation for Research, Project Writing, Funding Agencies and Avenues
- Weaving Gender Justice and Gender Equality in the system through lectures/ workshops/seminars on Capacity Building, Gender Sensitization and Gender awareness
- Stressing the importance of mental and physical health by lectures and demonstrations by Yoga Experts and practice sessions by the teacher participants. This has become an integral part of all Orientation Programmes
- Organizing programmes and activities related to Social and Communal Harmony, Secularism and National Integrity such as lectures and Literary programmes, Essay Writing Competitions, Cultural Evenings, Group Discussions and Seminars
- Inviting eminent Resource Persons and Subject Experts for both OPs and RCs and giving teachers the opportunity to interact with them.

“NAAC” review of Human Resource Development Centre took place from February 27 -29, 2012 under the chairmanship of Prof. Sunil Gupta, the former Vice Chancellor of H P University, Shimla. Human Resource Development Centre is determined to work in accordance to recommendations given by the NAAC Peer Team and Academic Advisory Committee under the chairmanship of Hon’ble Vice Chancellor Prof. A K Singh.

During the session 2019-2020, for which the report is being submitted, the UGC-HRDC has successfully completed most of the programmes allocated by the UGC for the session. It has organized 3 out of 4 Orientation Programmes with 119 participants and 08 out of 08 Refresher Courses (Including Teacher Educators programmewith 249 participants. Besides the subject Refresher Courses conducted by the concerned department, 3 Interdisciplinary Refresher Courses were organized successfully by the HRDC. This included 1 ID in Environmental Awareness and Disaster Management, 1 ID in Research Methodology in Social Sciences and 1 ID in Languages. **The HRDC has also organized one-week Workshop for on MOOCS, E-content Development and Open Educational Resources with 22 Participants.** It is my pleasure to report here that this HRDC has been ranked amongst the first ten HRDCs of the country based on the OPs and the RCs conducted by the HRDCs. (Detail attached Session 2019-2020)

Two Programmes 12th Orientation Programme and 7 days faculty development programme were cancelled in March because of Covid-19. We have requested University Grant Commission to organize them in the session 2020-21 in addition to programmes of 2020-21

The UGC-HRDC, University of Allahabad has like in the previous sessions contributed efficiently towards sustaining quality in HE which is the basis of socio-cultural, economic and scientific development of a nation by

- continuous improvement of processes, products and services through well defined, well planned and well managed programs
- Implementation of technology rich approach in accelerating the transfer of knowledge to the diversified population of students in terms of age, gender, ethno-religious background and socio-economic profile
- Developing a sound and value-based education system and motivating teachers for creative and innovative teaching and research
- Invocation of basic thoughts on being a good teacher - qualities, character, commitment and academic leadership required in the teachers for societal transformation
- Development of IT trained human capital required for quality education which is at the crossroads of finding directions for future generations, characterized by the Information & Communication revolutions
- revitalizing inputs through teacher empowerment, inter-disciplinary dialogues and open and flexible trans- and multidisciplinary subjects
- Designing a regular feedback mechanism from the resource persons and participants for upgrading our programmes to fulfil our goals

- Programs under ‘**Know your Country India**’ which include visits to archeological museums, excavation , cultural and heritage sites and historical monuments
- Visits to specialized institutes, libraries and participation in related national and international seminar/ symposium being organized during the duration of the programme in the university
- Programs and activities to promote Social Cohesion, Communal Harmony, Secularism and National Integration

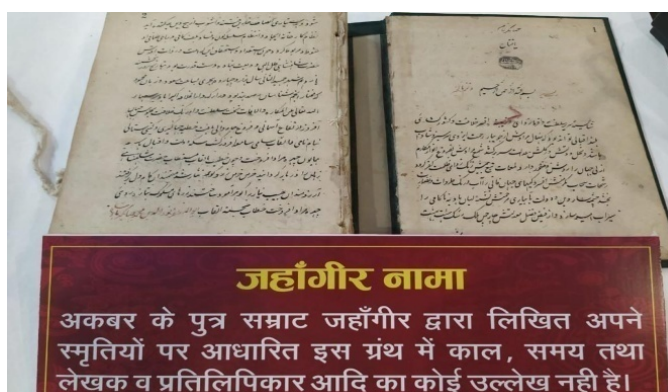

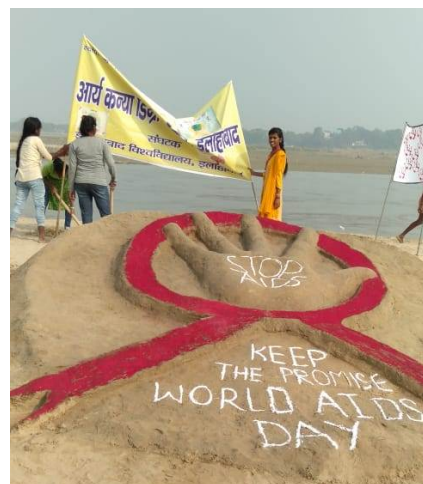
