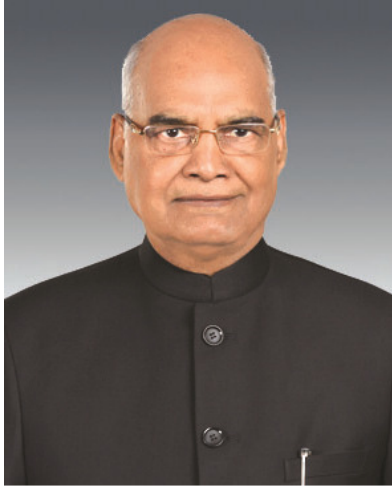

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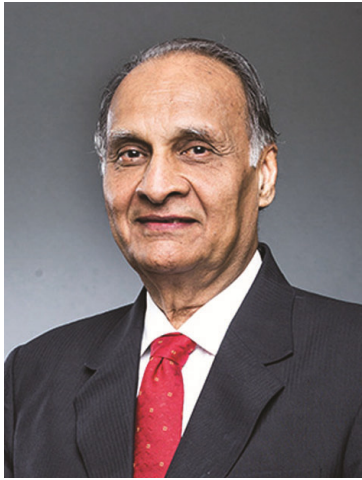

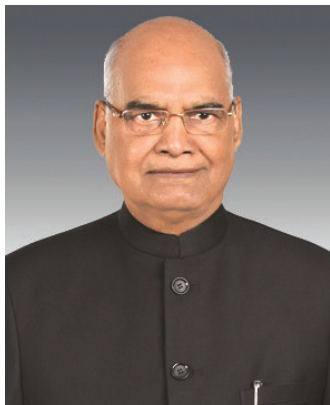

A lawyer, veteran political representative and long-time advocate of egalitarianism and integrity in Indian public life and society, Shri Ram Nath Kovind was born on October 1, 1945, in Paraunkh, near Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh. His parents were Shri Maiku Lal and Smt Kalawati.

Before assuming charge of the office of the 14th President of India on July 25, 2017, Shri Kovind served as the 36th Governor of the state of Bihar from August 16, 2015, to June 20, 2017.

Educational and Professional Background

Shri Kovind completed his school education in Kanpur and obtained the degrees of B.Com and L.L.B. from Kanpur University. In 1971, he enrolled as an Advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi.

Shri Kovind was Union Government Advocate in the Delhi High Court from 1977 to 1979 and Union Government Standing Counsel in the Supreme Court from 1980 to 1993. He became Advocate-on-Record of the Supreme Court of India in 1978. He practised at the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court for 16 years till 1993.

Parliamentary and Public Life

Shri Kovind was elected as a member of the Rajya Sabha from Uttar Pradesh in April 1994. He served for two consecutive terms of six years each till March 2006. Shri Kovind served on various Parliamentary Committees like Parliamentary Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes/Tribes; Parliamentary Committee on Home Affairs; Parliamentary Committee on Petroleum and Natural Gas; Parliamentary Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment; and Parliamentary Committee on Law and Justice. He was Chairman of the Rajya Sabha House Committee.

Shri Kovind also served as Member of the Board of Management of the Dr B.R Ambedkar University, Lucknow, and Member of the Board of Governors of the Indian Institute of Management, Kolkata. He was part of the Indian delegation at the United Nations and addressed the United Nations General Assembly in October 2002.

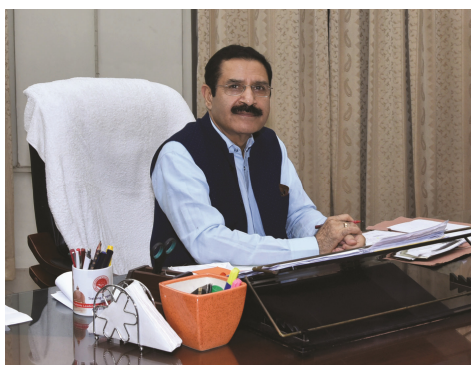

MILESTONE OF THE UNIVERSITY

University of Allahabad has always occupied an esteemed place among the universities of India for over a century now. Established on 23rd September 1887, it is the fourth oldest university of India after Calcutta, Bombay and Madras University. The credit for conceiving a large Central College at Allahabad, eventually to develop into a University, is due to Sir William Muir, the then Lt. Governor of United Provinces. As a result of his initiative the foundation stone of the Muir Central College (named after him) was laid on December 9, 1873 by His Excellency Lord Northbrook. On September 23, 1887 Act XVIII was passed which established the Allahabad University. Allahabad University was a centrally-funded Affiliating University exercising jurisdiction over higher and secondary education in a wide area in northern and central India, comprising the present-day States of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan and the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. In 1905 it initiated teaching and research under its own aegis, by establishing the Departments of *Law* (1905), *Economics* (1908) *History* (1912), research fellowships, libraries and laboratories. The eminence of the faculty of its teaching Departments, the Muir Central College (the premier affiliate, founded in 1873 at Allahabad) and several other reputed Affiliated Colleges, earned high regard for the University within and outside India. Some of the Colleges themselves matured into Universities the Banaras Hindu University (1916), the Aligarh Muslim University (1920) and the Lucknow and Nagpur Universities (1920 and 1923).

The University was later reorganized as a provincially-funded unitary teaching University, comprising its own teaching Departments and the Departments of the Muir Central College (which was merged with the University). The other Affiliated Colleges were initially grouped under the External Wing of the University and then handed over (in 1927) to the newly-incorporated, University of Agra in 1927, and the responsibility for secondary education was transferred (in 1922) to the U. P Board of High School and Intermediate Education. In the ensuing three decades, under the stewardship of celebrated Vice-Chancellors (Sir Ganganatha Jha, Pt. Iqbal Narain Gurtu, Prof. Amaranatha Jha and Prof. Tara Chand) and the academic leadership of illustrious faculty, the University took determined steps to enlarge its intellectual and educational ambit and gave a lead in national emancipation. Several teachers and students played a prominent role in the national struggle, particularly from 1930, and the University solemnly recalls with pride the martyrdom of its student Lal Padmadhar Singh during the Quit India Movement.

The scholars who gave a distinctive flavour to the academic ambience of the University, from its first venture into teaching in 1905, are too numerous to be named individually, and included such legendary figures as Amaranatha Jha, Raghupati Sahai "Firaq", S. C. Deb and P. E. Dastoor (English), H. N. Randle, R. D. Ranade and A. C. Mukerji (Philosophy), L. F. Rushbrook Williams, Sir Shafaat Ahmad Khan, R. P. Tripathi (History), Syed Muhammad Ali Nami

and M. G. Zubaid Ahmad (Arabic and Persian), P. K. Acharya, Babu Ram Saxena and Kshetresh Chandra Chattopadhyaya (Sanskrit), Dharendra Verma, Devi Prasad Shukla and Ram Kumar Verma (Hindi), Syed M. Zamin Ali and Muhammad Hafiz Syed (Urdu), Beni Prasad, Tara Chand, Ishwari Prasad (all three being historians of repute) and A. B. Lal (Political Science), R. N. Dubey (Geography), P. S. Naidu (Education), Meghnad Saha, K. S. Krishnan, D. S. Kothari, Salig Ram Bhargava, R. N. Ghosh G. B. Deodhar and K Banerjee (Physics), N. R. Dhar, Satyeshwar Ghosh and Satya Prakash (Chemistry), A C. Banerji, Gorakh Prasad, P. L. Srivastava and B. N. Prasad (Mathematics), J. H. Mitter, Shri Ranjan, R. K. Saxena and R. N. Tandon (Botany), D. R. Bhattacharya and H. R. Mehra (Zoology), H. Stanley Jevons, S. K. Rudra, C. D. Thompson, B. P. Adarka and J. K. Mehta (Economics), M. K. Ghosh and R. C. Choudhury (Commerce) and J C. Weir, M. U. S. Jung, K. K. Bhattacharya, K. R. R. Sastry and T. N. Sapru (Law) During this "Golden Age", the University was often referred to as "The Oxford of the East".

With the advent of Independence, the University gave priority to the rising expectations of the people for wider access to higher education and keeping pace with the world in higher education, took up concerns crucial to national and social reconstruction. The Seventieth Anniversary Celebrations (1957) were marked by the affirmation to concert intellectual resources for exploring new academic, educational and social horizons while conserving its classical heritage. The Centenary Celebrations (1987) provided the opportunity to reaffirm the goal of academic modernization predicated on social responsibility

The University did, however, face difficulties in mobilising resources for the pursuit and fulfilment of its intents and objectives. This paved the way for a concerted campaign, which began with the Seventieth Anniversary and was re-invigorated from the Centenary Celebrations, for the re-incorporation of the University as a Central University. These efforts, which were immeasurably, strengthened by the support of the Alumni in different fields of national life, bore fruit in 2005, with the adoption by Parliament of "The University of Allahabad Act, 2005", and its enforcement on July 14, 2005.

This restoration of the original 'Central Status' has inaugurated a new Chapter in the evolution of the University, and occasioned a fresh resolve to realize its earlier stature as an internationally acclaimed institution of higher learning. The University is now poised for exploring new dimensions of institutional accomplishment, by renovating its academic system, reinforcing and augmenting its teaching, research and residential facilities and pursuing social purposes in a coordinated manner, to keep pace with international standards in these areas and endow human resource with the capabilities to serve the nation in the special context of the challenges and imperatives of globalization.

HIGHLIGHTS OF UNIVERSITY INITIATIVES

ACADEMICS

- Major steps have been taken to execute the academic vision plan of the University. The teaching and research in multi-disciplinary and cross-disciplinary areas of national importance was promoted.
- Steady reforms were brought about in examination and evaluation system with uniform implementation of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in PG courses across all academic units of the University.
- Teachers of the constituent colleges were allowed to enrol PhD students under their supervision as per the UGC Guidelines.
- New PhD Ordinance of the University was formulated and approved by the competent University authorities.
- Eminent academician and social scientists were invited to deliver lecture under the Distinguished Lecture Series. The lectures were audio-video recorded and put on the University website.
- National and International Seminars were organized throughout the year in nearly all the academic units.
- University got connected with other Centres of advanced learning in the country as well as abroad through national and international collaborative arrangements and MoUs.
- Students of the University visited the Heidelberg University under the DBT sponsored Big Data Research.
- Continuous improvement in the student's performance was reflected through increase number in placements and selections in different jobs of the State and Central Governments as well as private organizations.
- Awards/recognitions have been given to outstanding students, teachers (including retired teachers) and non-teaching staff on the occasion of 15th August and 26th January.
- Procurement of new equipments in various departments was done through equipment grants.
- Timely and continuous monitoring of the progress of the research students has drastically improved the research standards and quality of Ph.D. programme of the University.
- Condition of the Central Library of the University has significantly improved in terms of collections of books and journals. The modernization of the library was ensured with the help of e-library. The plagiarism detection software as well as remote access facility was made available to faculty and students.
- Infrastructural development and augmentation for research facilities, uninterrupted power supply and other necessary facilities as well as constant encouragement and motivation by the academic leadership has resulted in quantum jump in number of research publications by the faculty members and students of the University.
- Many of the faculty members and students of the University bagged prestigious fellowships and awards of national and international importance.
- DST sponsored Neuro Imaging facility (functional MRI) at the Centre of Behavioural and Cognitive Sciences was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of Science and Technology.
- NAAC Accreditation was carried out after a gap of 15 years.
- University has decided to hold the Convocation on 5th Sept 2019 after a gap of 15 years.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

- Permanent appointments of Faculty members were made in the Dept. of Hindi, Computer Science, Home Science, Globalization and Development Studies, Centre for Women Studies and Centre for Science and Society.
- The regular appointments of Assistant Professors were also made in the Constituent Colleges of the University.
- Several eligible faculty members of the University and Colleges were promoted under CAS.
- Regular appointments were made on the posts of Registrar, Finance Officer, Law Officer, and Information Scientist.
- The appointments process for filling up the vacant teaching and non-teaching positions of the University was started.

- The General Finance Rules (GFR)-2017 and its subsequent amendments were strictly followed.
- E-procurement (e-tendering and e-publishing) system and GeM were made fully functional in the University for procurement of good and services as well as for works. Most of the procurement was done through GeM.
- The VISAKA (Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan) guidelines were implemented in the University.
- Financial Ledger was compiled on a daily basis to ensure maximum transparency and to curb corruption.
- The CCASH worked towards prompt relief to the complainants as per its guidelines.
- Zero tolerance was shown towards the financial malpractices and indiscipline of students and staff.
- University of Allahabad Alumni Association worked to extend the current alumni database. The active involvement of the Alumni was ensured for suggestions to improve the quality of teaching and research in the University.
- The University actively participated in all the Govt. of India initiatives such as Yoga Day, Run for Unity, Guru Purnima, Environment Day etc.

EFFECTIVE USE OF THE ICT FOR TEACHING, ADMISSIONS AND E- GOVERNANCE

- The University has conducted an all India Online Entrance Tests for UG, PG and DPhil courses for admission to various courses of study for the academic session 2018-19. This exercise helped the University to attract talented and potentially bright students from all over the country.
- The ICT enabled Smart Class Rooms have been established in several new departments for effective teaching-learning using modern aids.
- The bandwidth of the Campus wide LAN and Wi-Fi facility (available in the entire University campus as well as hostels) has been increased and its full uninterrupted utilization was largely ensured as per the mandate of NKN.
- The campus wide CCTV surveillance system with a modern centralized control room is functional in the University.
- The Automation process to the Finance and Registry was ensured in a phasewise manner.
- Full utilization of MHRD's digital initiative, namely, MOOCS and e-PG Pathshala on SWAYAM platform as well as GIAN scheme was ensured for e-learning and research.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND STUDENT AMENITIES

- Conservation and restoration of historic Vizayanagaram Hall & surrounding area was completed.
- Dilapidated Tilak Bhawan got fully renovated and maintained. The facility shall serve as a mini auditorium with a seating capacity of approx. 300 persons.
- University has carried out installation work of Solar panels of the capacity of 1.434 Mw.
- Construction of new girls hostel, boys hostel and International Hostel has been started.
- Repairing and upkeep work in the University Hostels has been carried out.
- Labs, classrooms, and departmental library of several departments of the University have been renovated.
- Senate Hall of the University was renovated to hold special lectures, functions, and seminars.
- Plantation of trees was carried out at regular intervals to make the campus as green as possible.
- Anti-ragging Cell as per UGC guidelines has been re-constituted and is made fully functional.
- NCC and NSS organized several activities throughout the year.
- Recreational and sports facilities have been upgraded in the campus.
- Freeships, Scholarships, Poor Boys fund, Merit cum means were distributed to economically vulnerable students.
- Jawahar Lal Nehru Centre for differently abled students of the University has been further equipped with state-of-the-art gadgets..

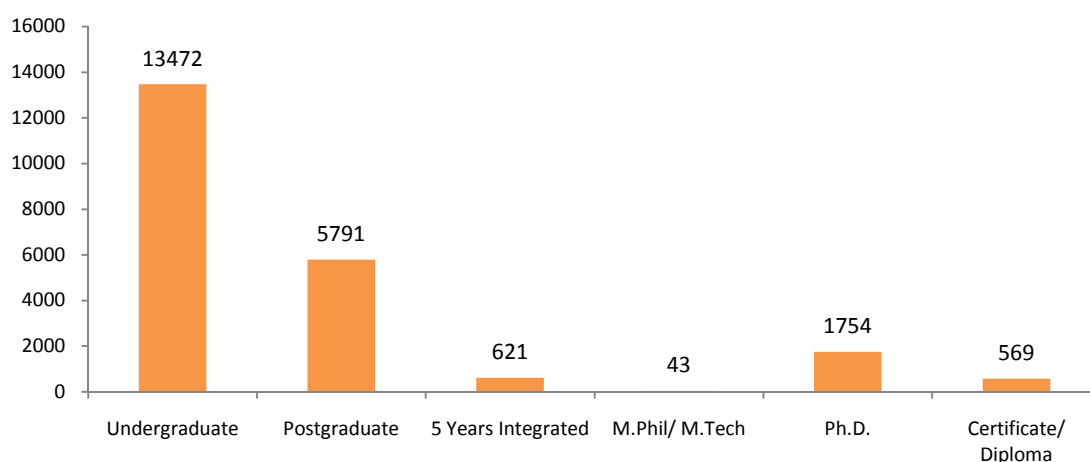

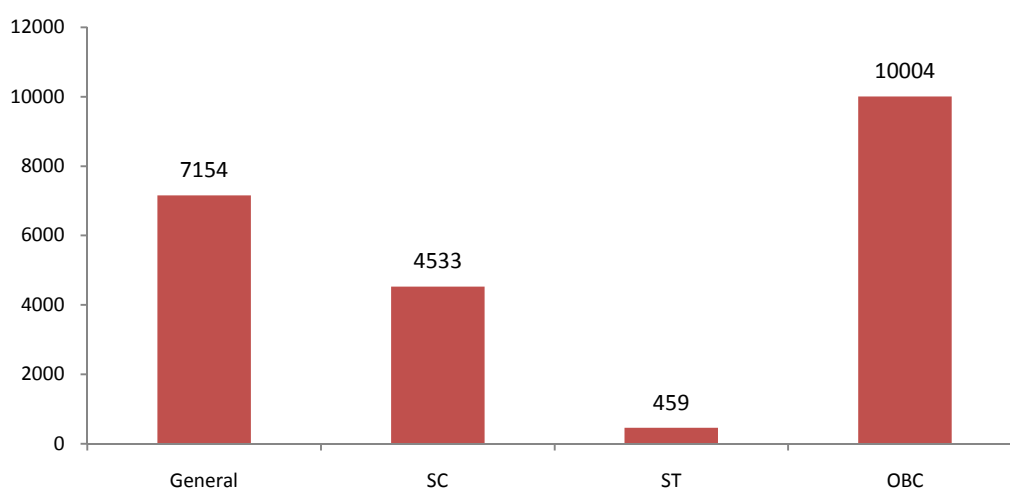

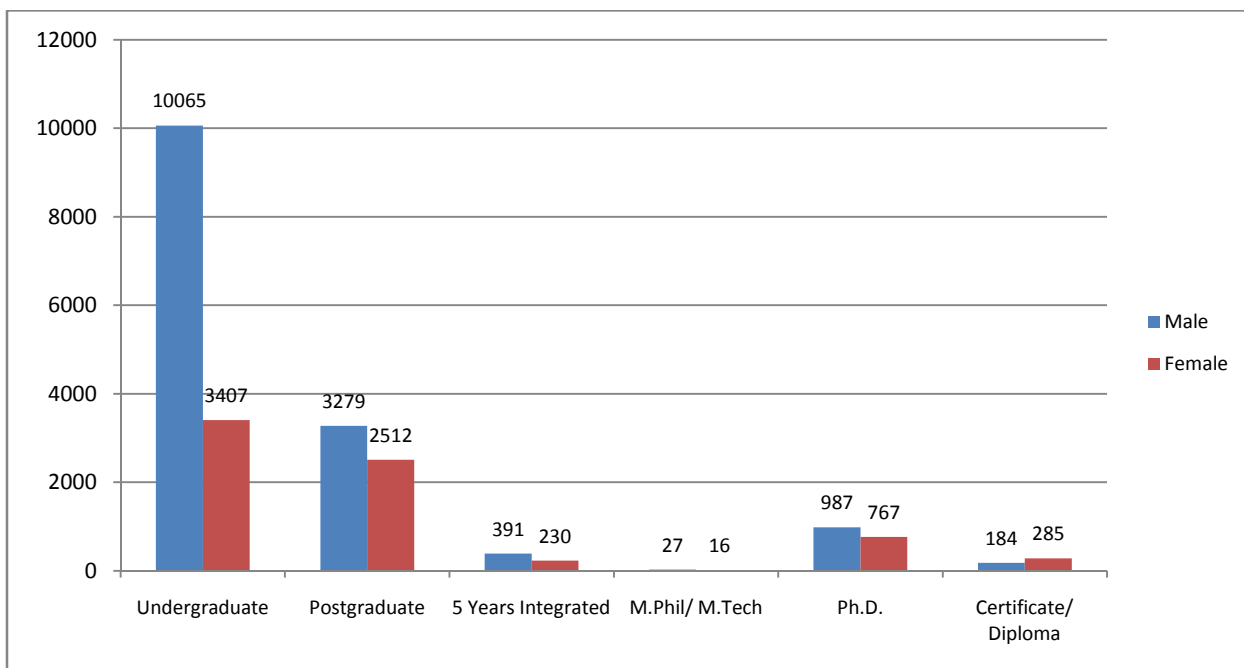

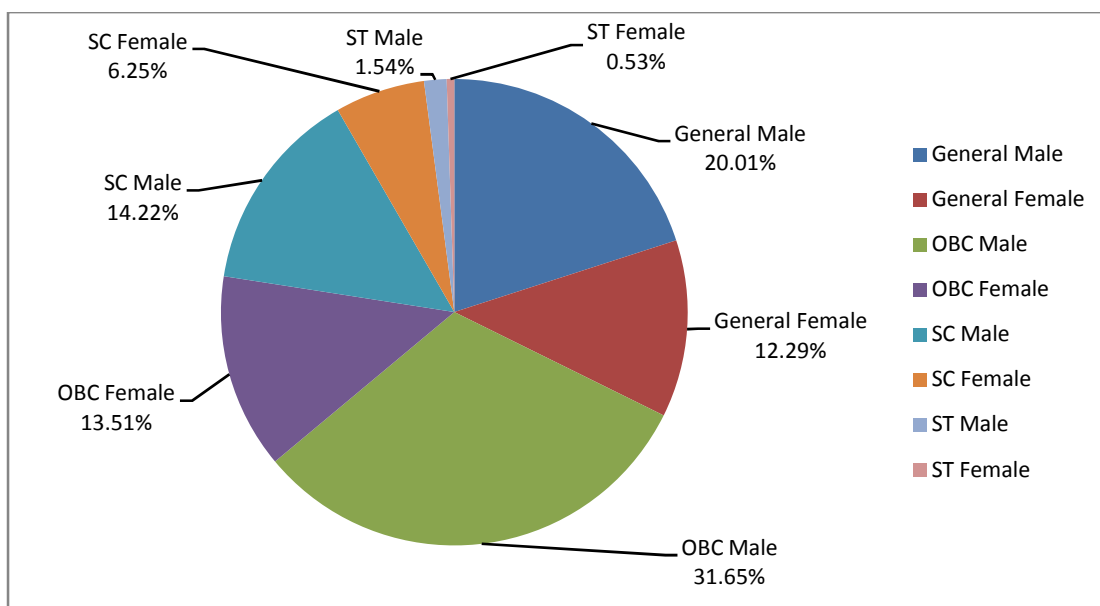
Total no. of students (Programme wise) 2018-19

DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT HISTORY, CULTURE & ARCHAEOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department was founded in 1955 with the objective of promoting research and teaching in Ancient History (including pre-history and proto-history) and ancient world civilizations. The Department excavated the world famous archaeological site of Kaushambi from 1948 to 1964 with outstanding results. The Department was chosen for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) by the UGC for three consecutive phases from 1981 to 1995. It was also granted the status of Centre of Advance Study (CAS) from 2001 to 2006. The Department carried out International Collaborations with a) University of California, Berkeley (1980-82), b) Soviet Union on the Project “Comparative Archaeology and Ethno-Linguistic Studies” (beginning in 1980), c) Australian Research Council (2005-2008)

Departmental museum (Prof. G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum) houses a unique collection of antiquities spanning from Prehistory to early medieval period. Research/Scientific analysis is being carried out on different antiquities and artifacts. The department has archaeological research laboratories, a Photography Unit, A drawing Section, Libraries (PG, as well as, Research) and a Publication Unit.

Department has following facilities:

- **G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum** developed out of cultural material recovered mainly through excavations and explorations in the Northern Vindhya and the Middle Ganga Plains by the archaeologists of the Department.
- **Experimental Archaeology Lab:** Since its inception, January 2010, the lab has had been engaged in understanding **Cognitive Ecosystem of archaeological landscape** combining the results of the various scientific experimental techniques:
- **Archaeo-Zoological Lab for Archaeozoological Researches, Departmental Research and PG Library, Lab of Archaeological Chemistry, Photographic Lab, Surveying Drawing Lab, Computer Reprographic Lab**

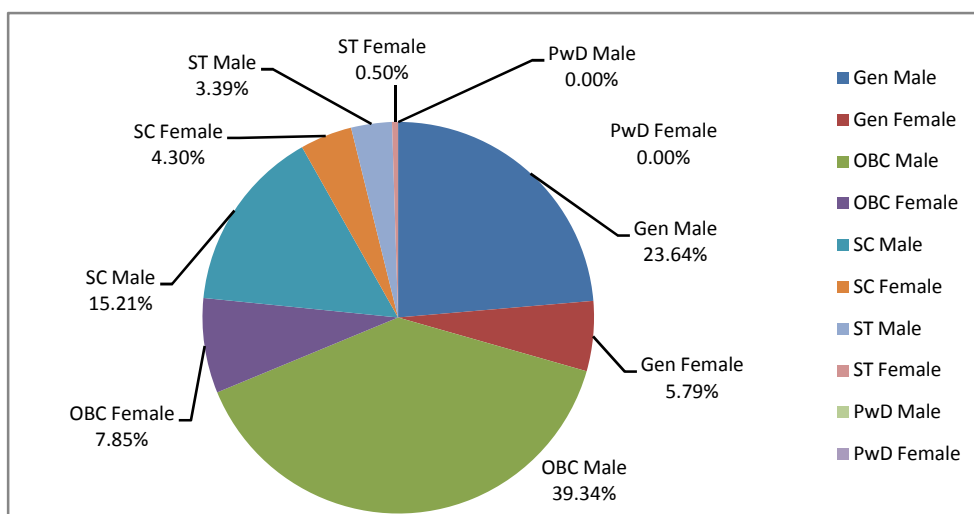

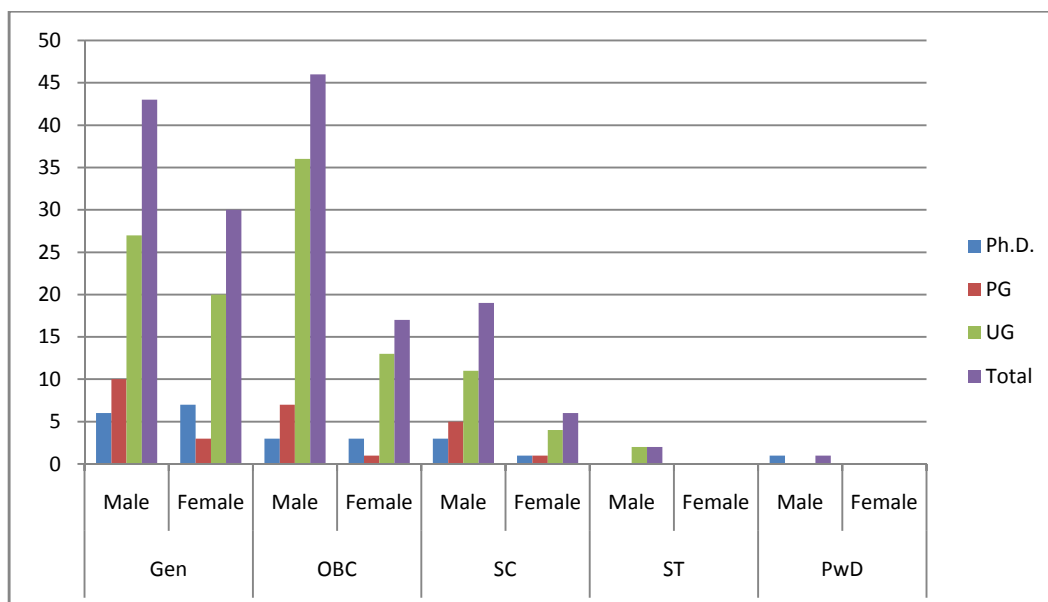

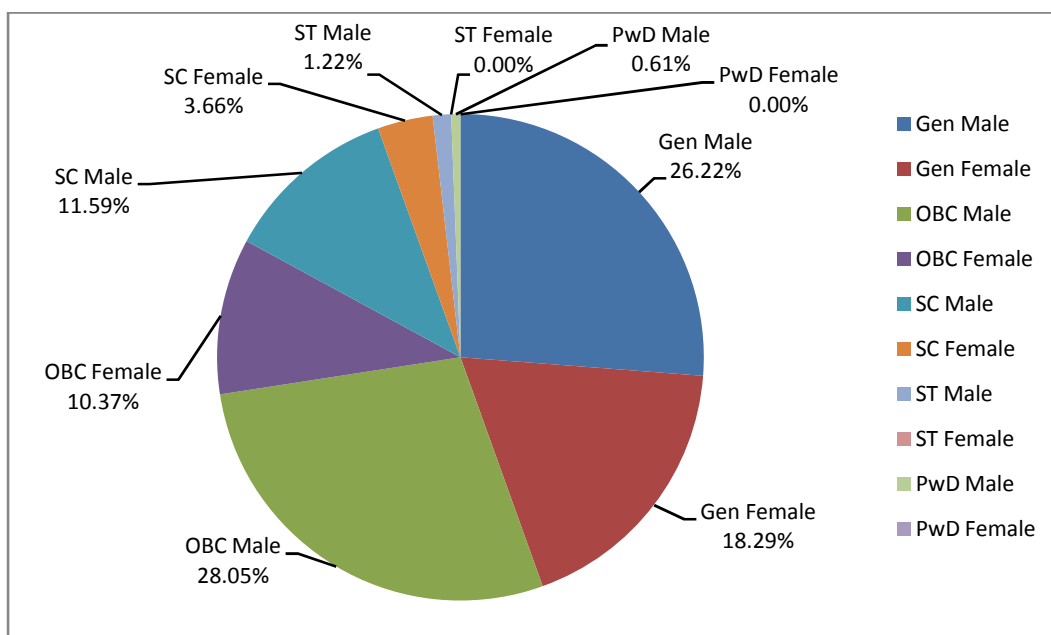

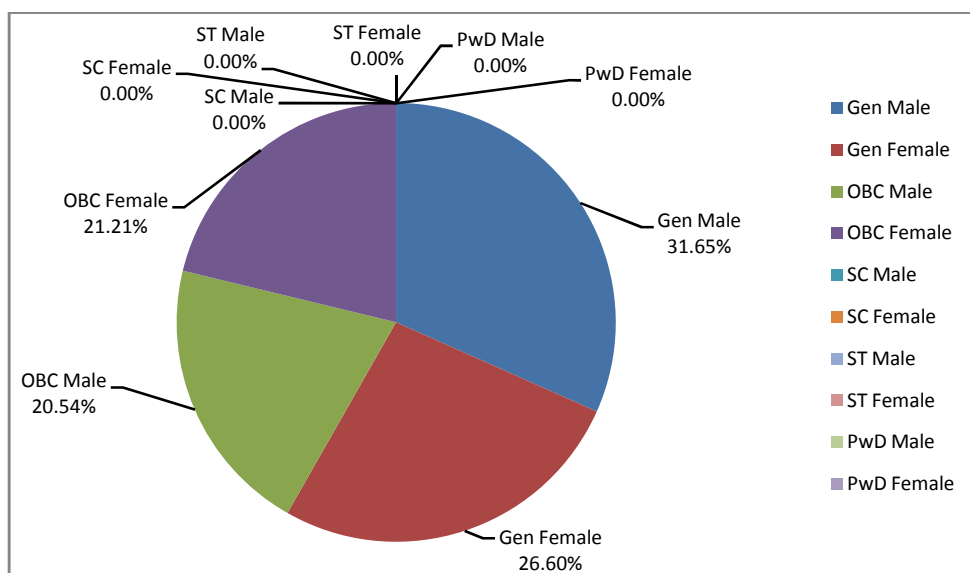

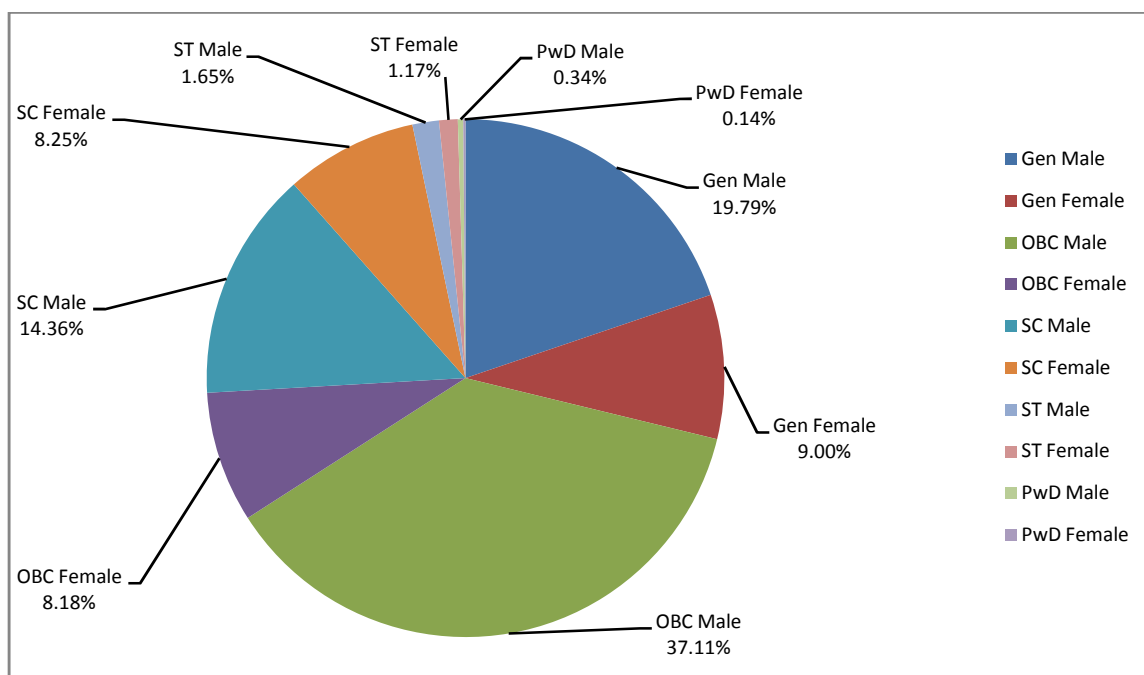

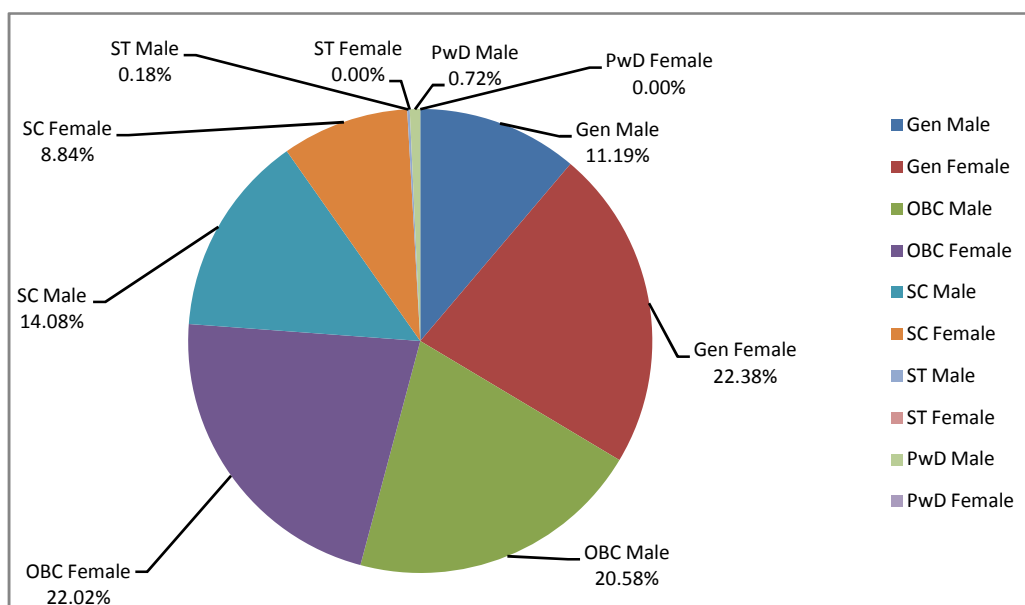

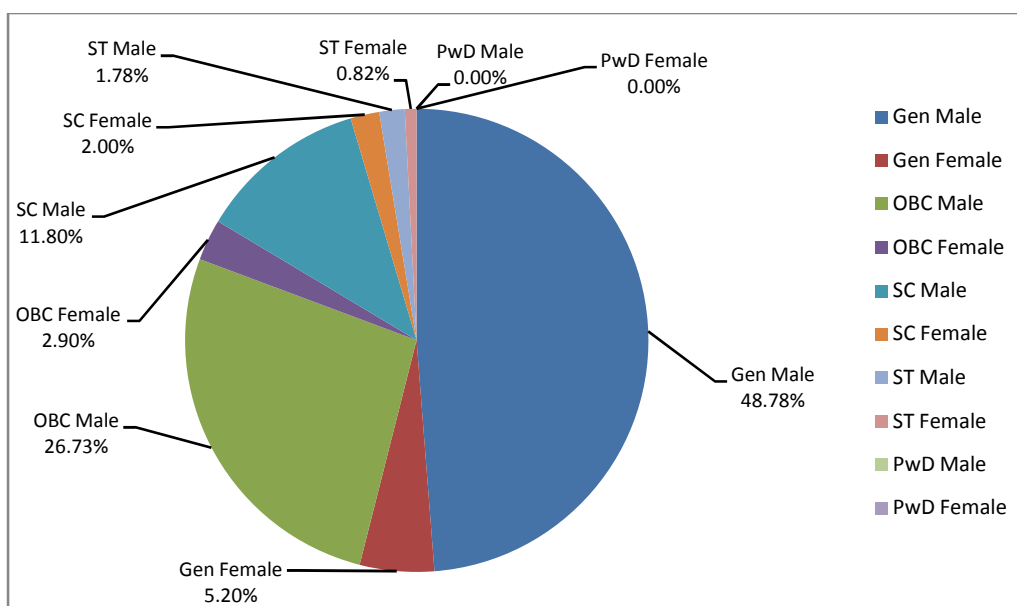

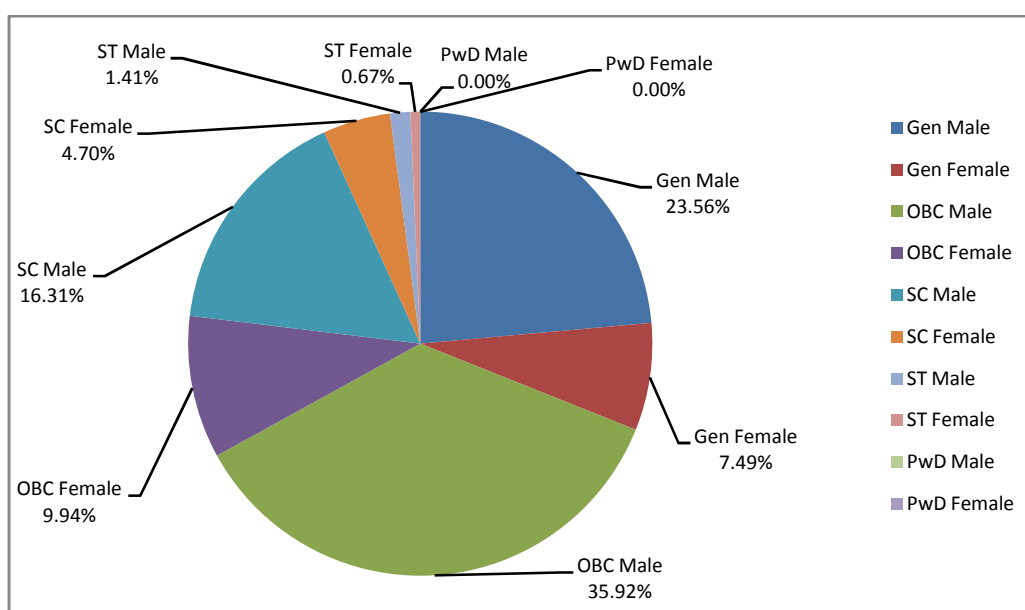

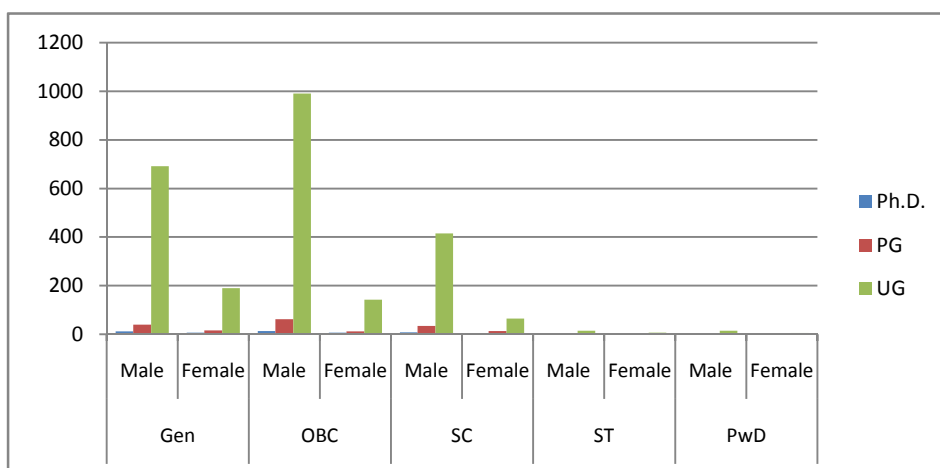

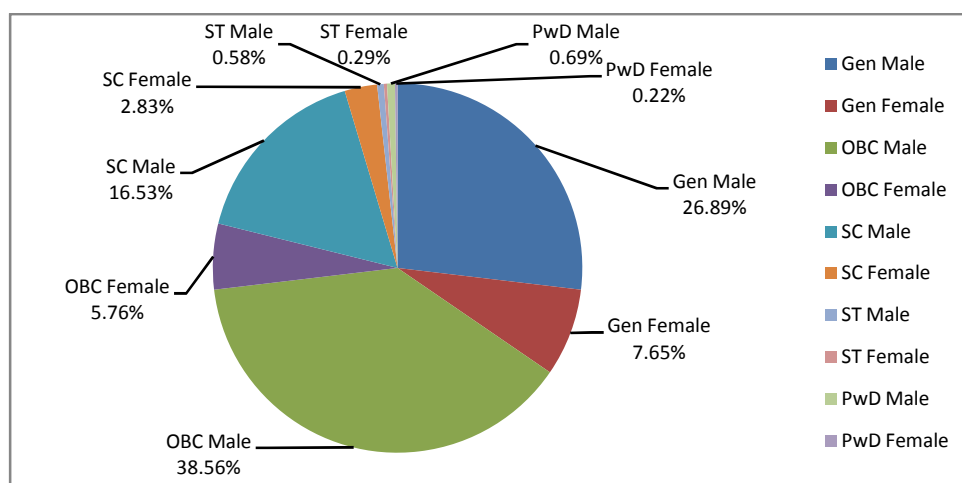

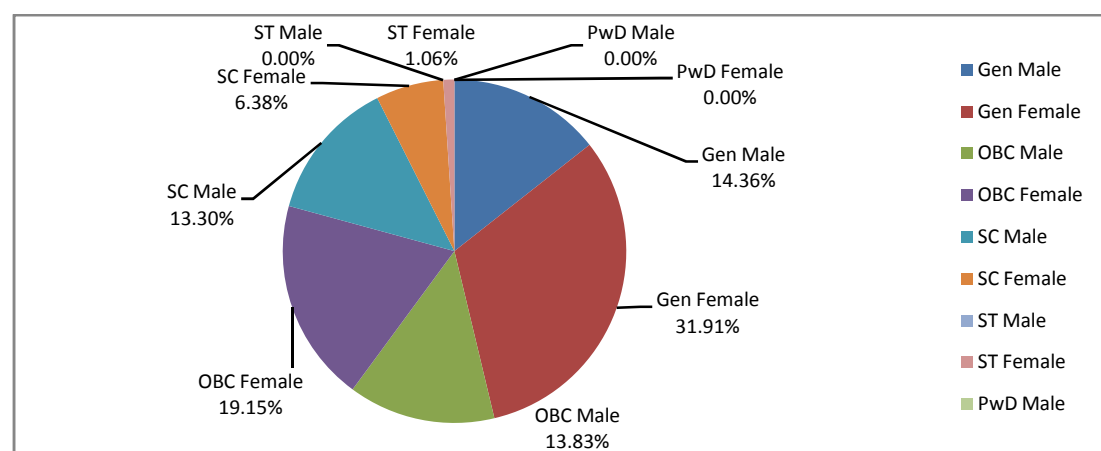

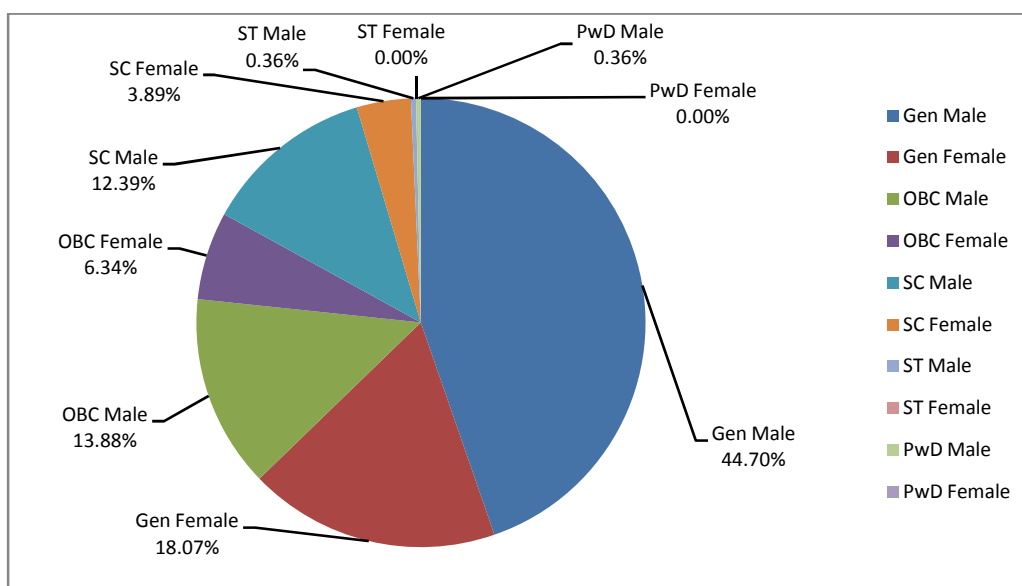

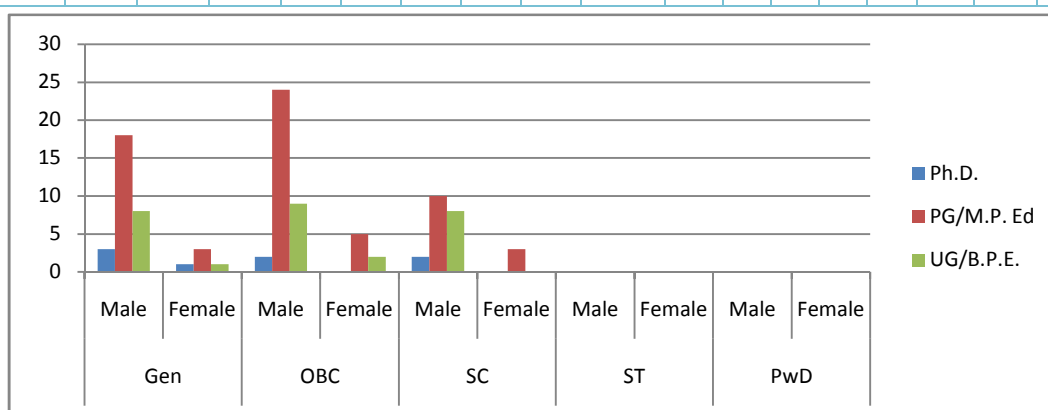

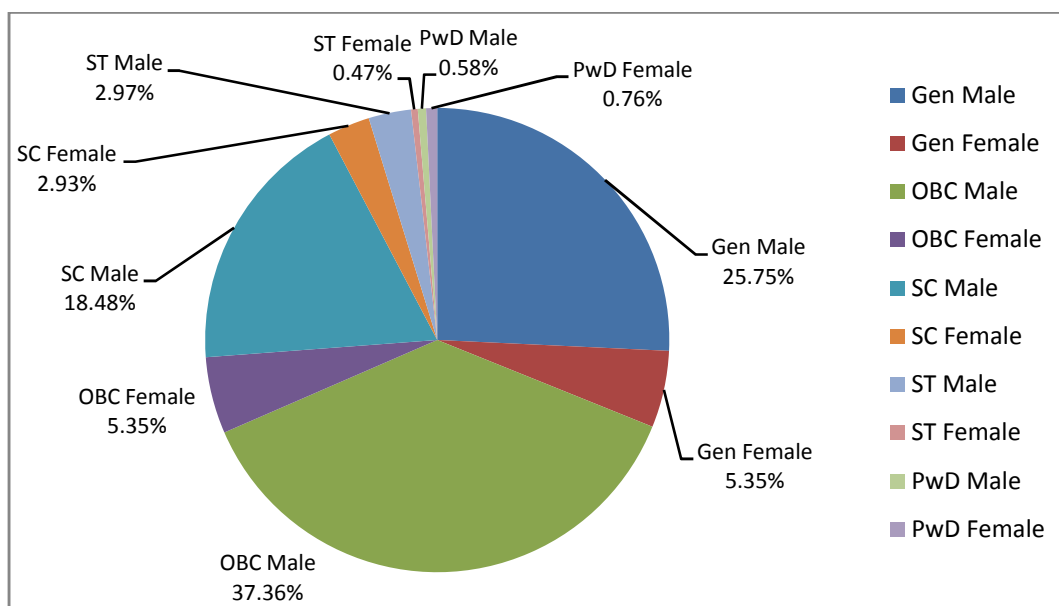

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department of Psychology at Allahabad University was established in 1961 with Prof. Durganand Sinha as the first chairperson and two other faculty members. In 1977, the UGC approved it as a Department of Special Assistance (DSA) and the faculty strength was increased to 20. In recognition of its outstanding contribution to the field of Psychology in India, the Department was upgraded as the centre for Advanced Studies (CAS) in 1984 by the UGC. The Department was evaluated by the UGC and second, third and fourth terms of CAS were sanctioned between the period 1989 to 2008.

In 1989, the Department started an international journal 'Psychology and Developing Societies' in collaboration with the Sage publications which is now in its 31st year. The Department was the first in the University to start Ph.D. with course work as early as in 1979. Semester system in P.G. Programme was started in the Department in 1989 and later on, in 2001, the Department adopted 'Choice Based Credit System' in P.G. Programme. 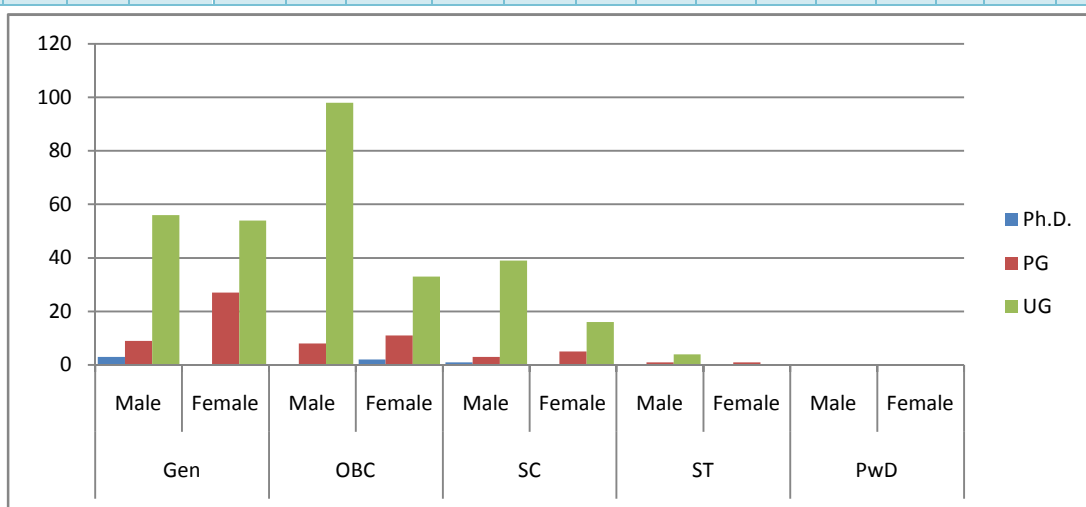

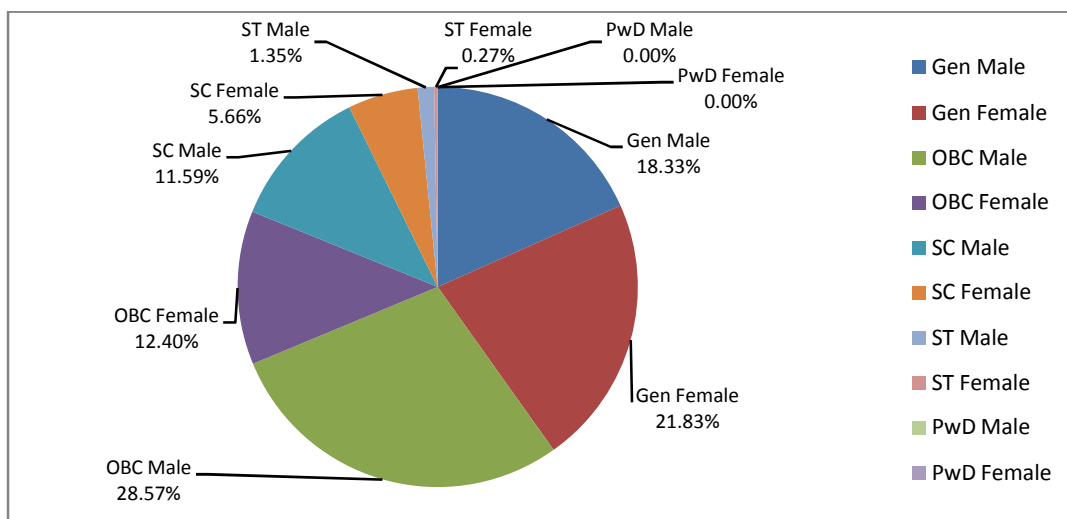

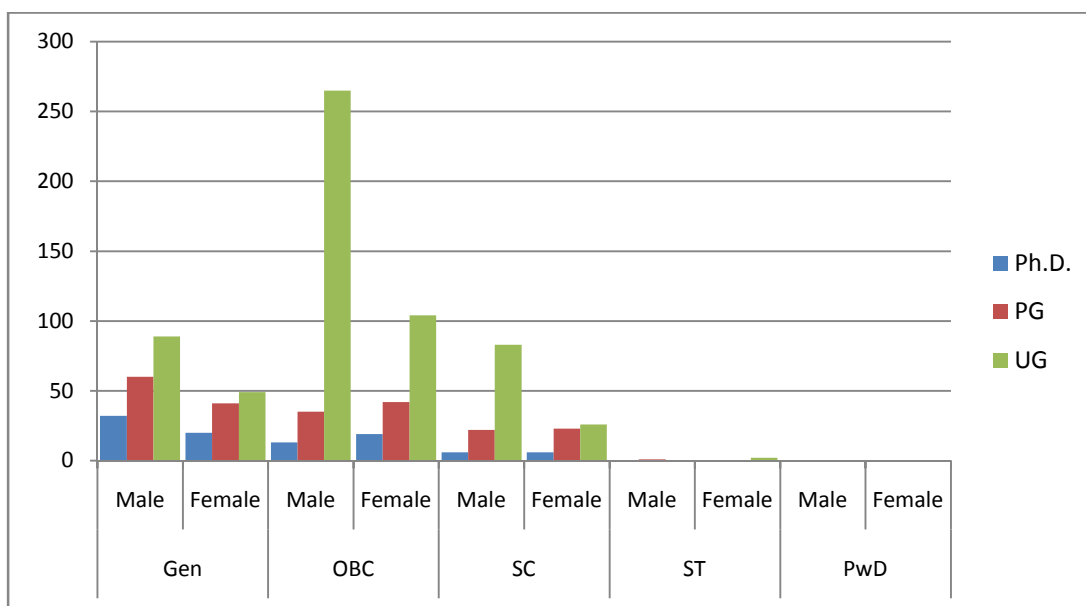

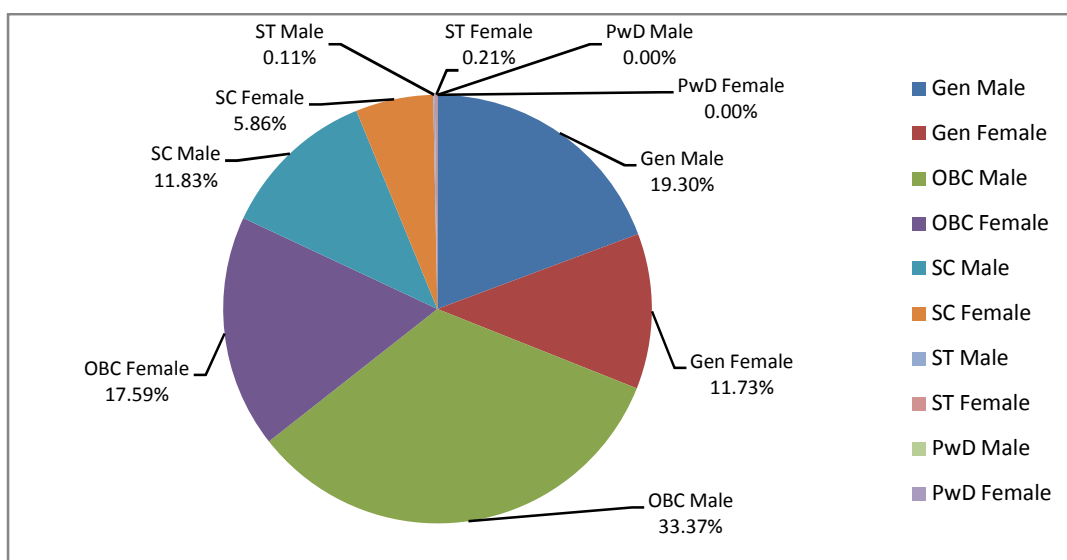

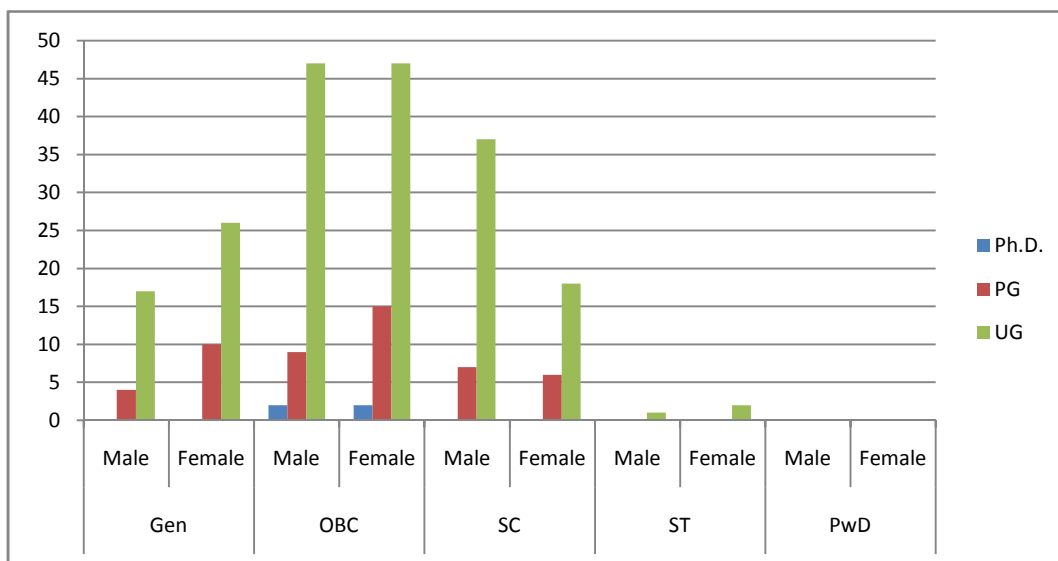

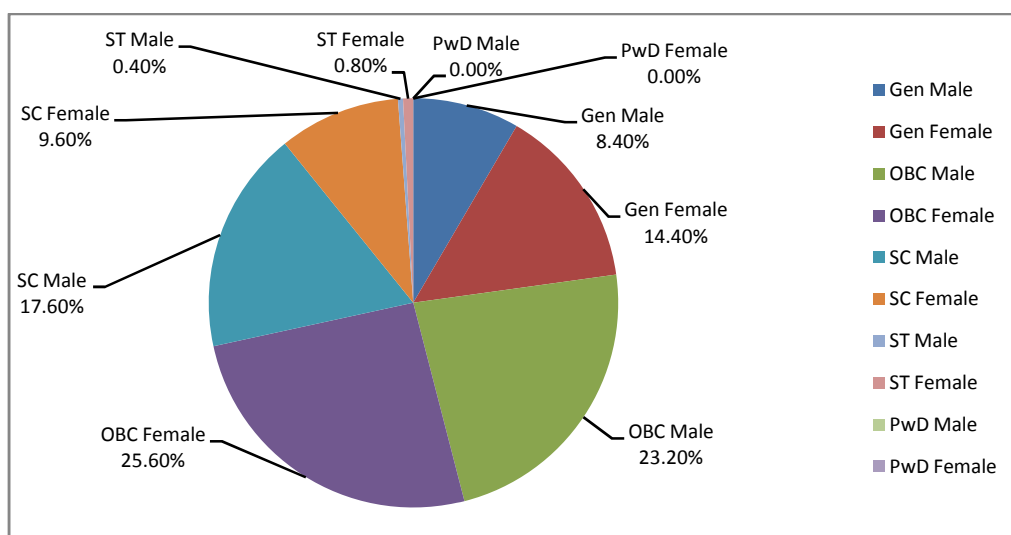

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

Introduction:

The Department of Economics became a truly full-fledged department in 1914, with the appointment of Herbert Stanley Jevons (son of the marginalist, W.S. Jevons) as the first Professor of Economics and Head. A post-graduate course was also introduced the same year, so that the full fledgling department offered both, under-graduate and post-graduate courses. Origins are like riddles which may never be completely solved, and the Department of Economics is no exception. However, some sources also point to the year 1908, when the teaching of Economics as a subject commenced at the under-graduate level, though it remained under the Head of the then History Department. In view of the above, 2014 is taken to be its Centenary Year of the Department. Prof. Jevons also founded the Indian Journal of Economics, in the year 1916, the first economics journal ever to be published in India. This is the oldest existing journal of Economics and is regularly published, even today. In an article, published in its first volume in 1916 and available even today in the Department, Prof. Jevons wrote that his academic purpose was “*teaching to think and to do, rather than of teaching only to know*”.

This legacy of his was faithfully adhered to by stalwarts like Professors C.D.Thompson, A.R.Burnett-Hurst and S.K.Rudra, Mr. B.P.Adarkar, and later by Professors J.K.Mehta, P.C.Jain, S.L.Parmar, Mahesh Chand and many others. Faculty members such as Prof. H.S. Jevons, Prof. C.D. Thompson, Prof. S.K. Rudra and Prof. J.K.Mehta became Presidents of the Indian Economic Association Conferences of 1922, 1934, 1946, and 1968 respectively. Former faculty of the Department who became Presidents were Dr. M.V. Mathur (1967), Prof. Gautam Mathur (1978) and Prof. P.D. Hajela (1980). Allahabad had the proud privilege of hosting I.E.A. conferences in the years 1920, 1929 and 1940.

The Department recently formed an Alumni Association and the first Alumni meet was organized on Feb.14, 2014, the meet was a grand success and it was attended by more than two hundred alumni. The Department is holding meetings of the Association every year since then. The Department has celebrated its Centenary Year and many academic/cultural programmes were held during this 2014-2016.

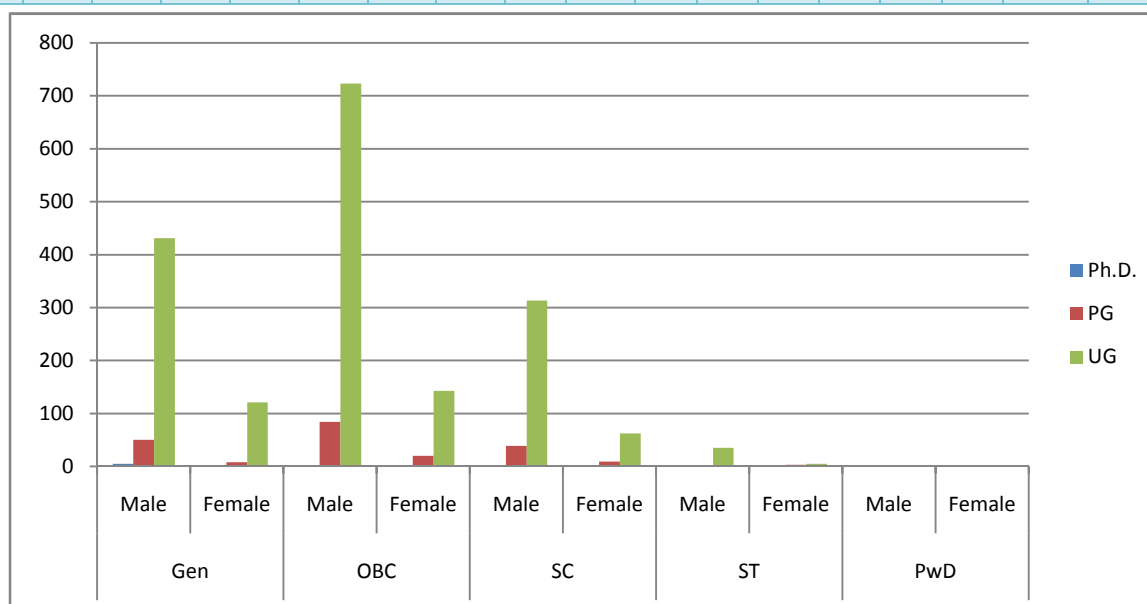

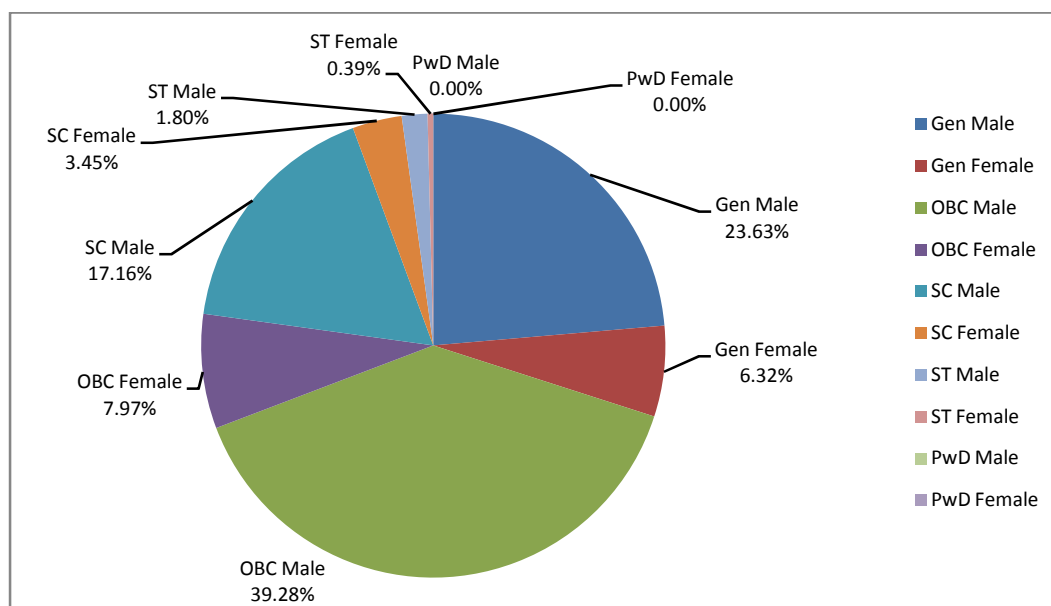

Introduction

Law as a subject was introduced in the year 1872 in affiliation with the Calcutta University. In 1887 the Department of Law was established and in the year 1890, the Department became a separate single Department /Faculty of the University along with the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. Hon'ble Justice D. Straight was appointed as the first president of the Department. The Law Department functioned in Muir College from 1872 onwards till the new building was constructed for the Law Faculty around 1910, adjacent to Senate House. By an Act of the United Province of British India Prof. Weir, a distinguished jurist became the first Head of the Law Department. The Department was sifted to the new building which was constructed by UGC grant in the Chatham Lines Campus of which Hon'ble Mr. A.K. Sen the then Law Minister of India, had laid the foundation stone in 1965

The endeavour at Faculty of Law, University of Allahabad is to provide excellence in legal education. We aim at expanding the horizons of legal knowledge for full growth of human personality and well being of man kind. We also aim at devising, developing and applying new teaching techniques, research methods and also arrange for extension programmes in legal education. We strive to develop better human resources for trade, industry, public administration, departments of law and justice. Our continuous endeavour is to promote studies in law, legal institutions and processes of justice in close context of the knowledge of other disciplines having vital bearing on human behaviour and society in all aspects.

In keeping with its best tradition of reform and excellence in legal education, the University launched a Five Year Integrated Course of Law w.e.f. the academic session 2005-16. Its prime purpose and avowed aim is to fashion new technique of teaching and design courses to cope with the challenges and issues in contemporary society. A separate building for Law Five Year Integrated course has been build in the same premises.

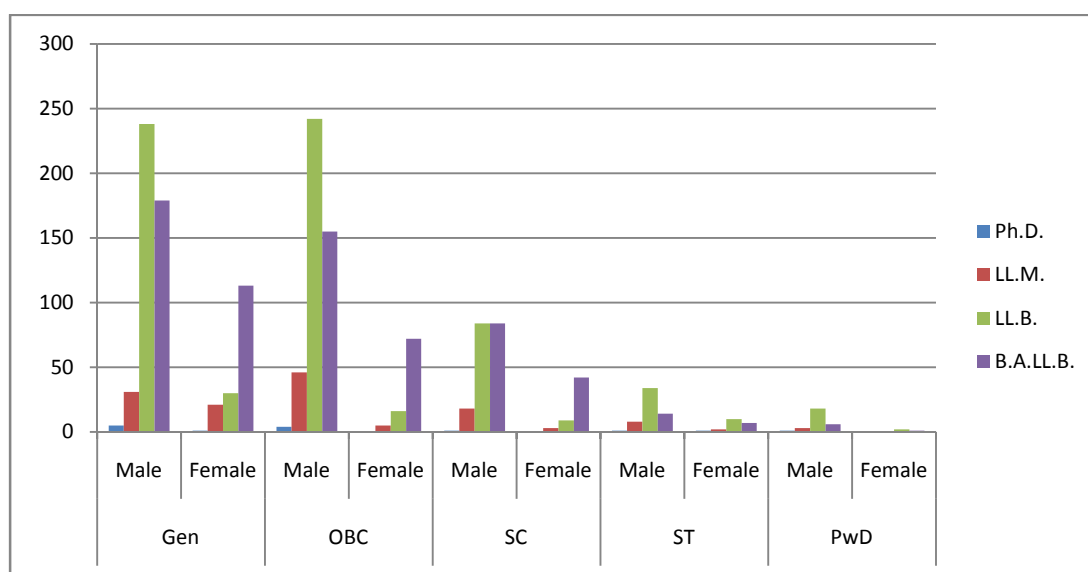

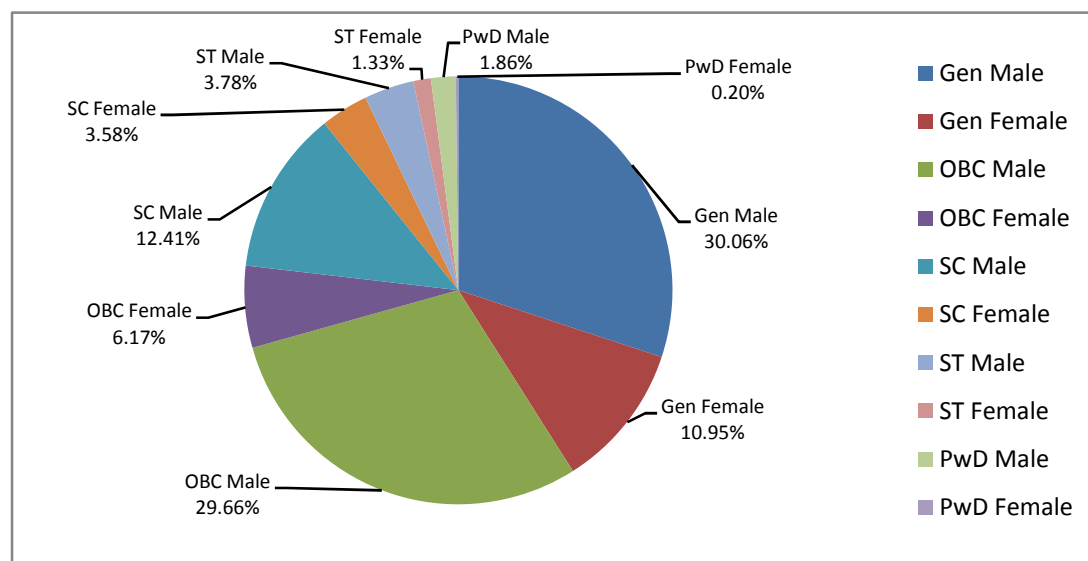

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY

Introduction:

The Department of Biochemistry was established in 1968 by the legendary Professor Dr. Radha Pant. At that time University of Allahabad was one of the few Universities in the country to start a Master's course in Biochemistry. In view of the growing importance of Biochemistry, both as a basic science as well as a broad based discipline, the Department also introduced Biochemistry at the undergraduate level in the year 2000. The Department presently offers a 3-year undergraduate program (B.Sc.) with Biochemistry as one subject, a 2-year Master's program (M.Sc. Biochemistry), and a Doctoral program (Ph.D. Biochemistry). Department organizes weekly students' seminars and frequent invited lectures by leading scientists from across the world with a view to develop quality personnel in the field of Biochemistry. In year 2018, Biochemistry department completed 50 years and celebrated Golden Jubilee year by organizing the first ever Alumni Meet and a National Conference on "Expanding Horizons of Biochemistry" on December 01, 2018. It was attended by distinct alumni from across the World.

The Department has faculty strength of eight members. The research interests of the faculty include: oxidative stress and antioxidants, xenobiotic metabolism, molecular biology of HIV-1, anti-HIV-1 drug design, toxicology, aging research and anti-aging interventions, micronutrients and their role in health, association of polymorphism with cancer and natural product based anti-microbials, hepatoprotectants and anticancer agents. The faculty is engaged in collaborative research with several institutions and universities.

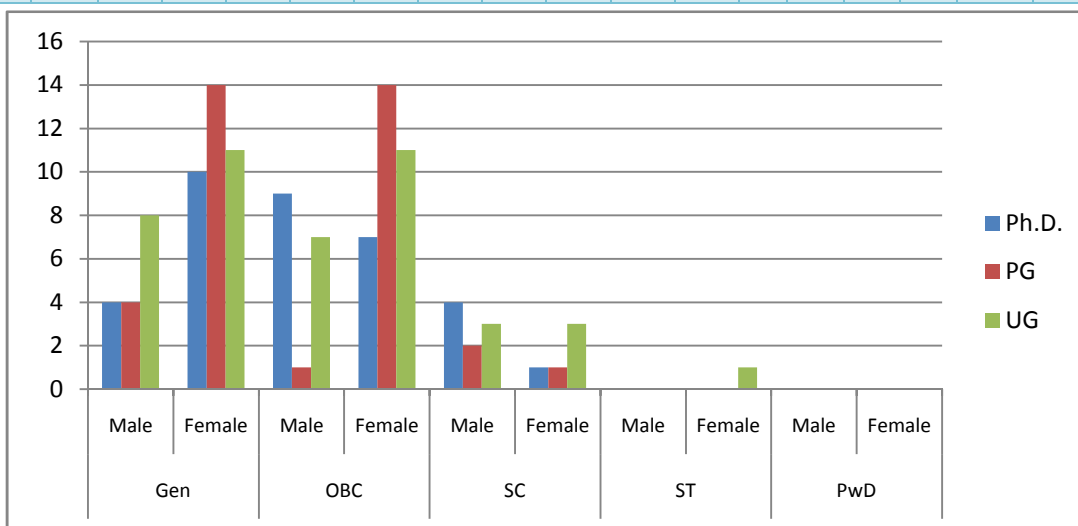

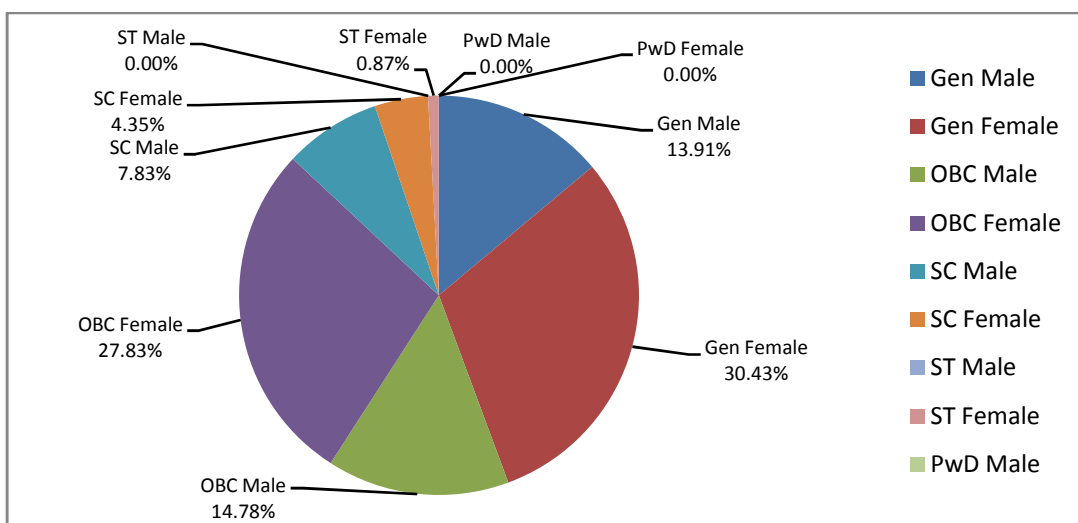

The Department of Botany which was earlier a part of Biology Department of Muir Central College started as a separate entity in the year 1923, with Dr. J.H Mitter as the founder Head of the Department. Now the department has completed 94 years of its glorious existence under the stewardship of eminent botanists like Prof. S.Ranjan, FNI, Prof. R.K.Saxena, FNI, Prof. R.N. Tandon, FNA, Dr. A.K. Mitra and Prof. D.D. Pant, FNA and others who have adorned the professorial chair of the department. All of them maintained the great tradition of excellence in research and teaching. The department is known for multidisciplinary character and has earned international recognition for its standard of teaching and research producing eminent scholars and administrators, who have occupied or occupying high positions in and outside the country. In recognition of its academic excellence, the department of botany was awarded two prestigious programmes by the UGC 1- The special assistance programme (1976) 2- The COSIST support programme (1990).

- ❖ **Roxburgh botanical garden and Experimental farm-** The department is maintaining perhaps the best botanical garden in the country which is famous for the rich collection of rare Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms and Angiosperms. 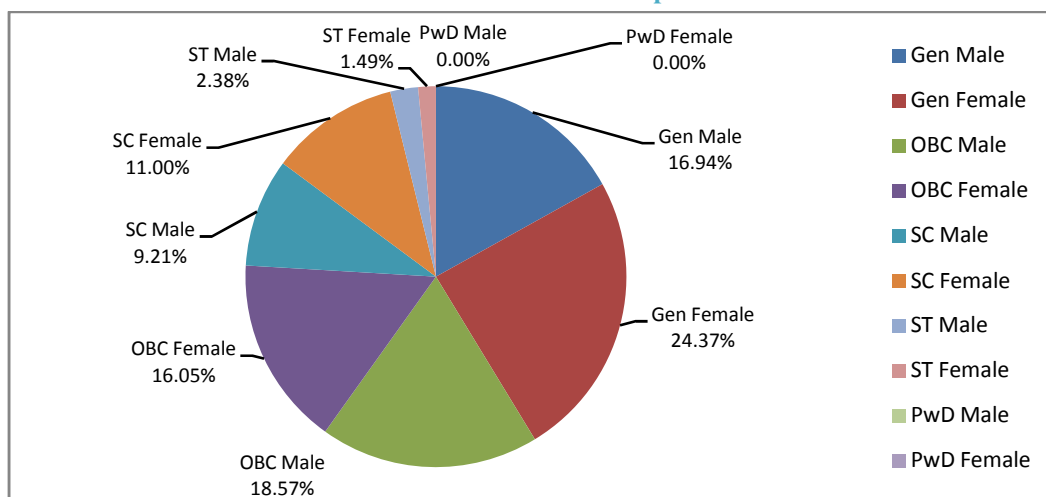

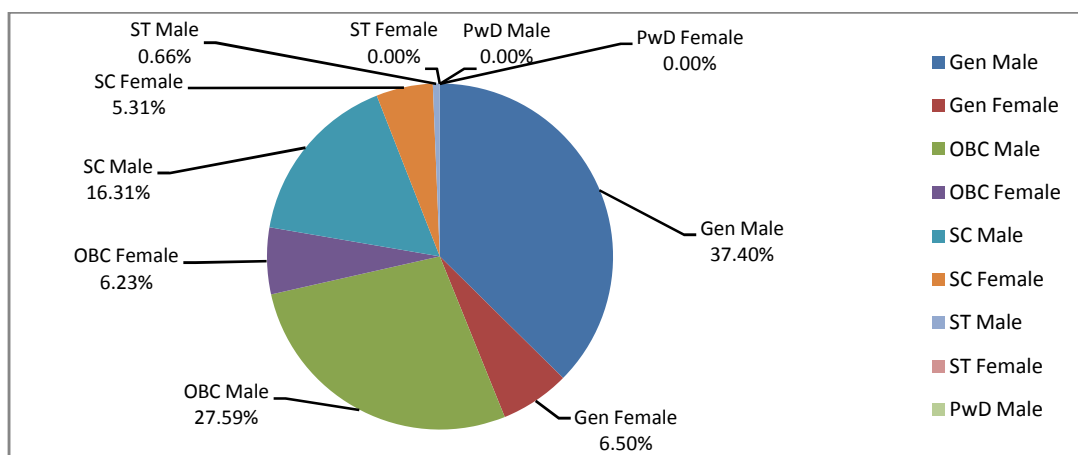

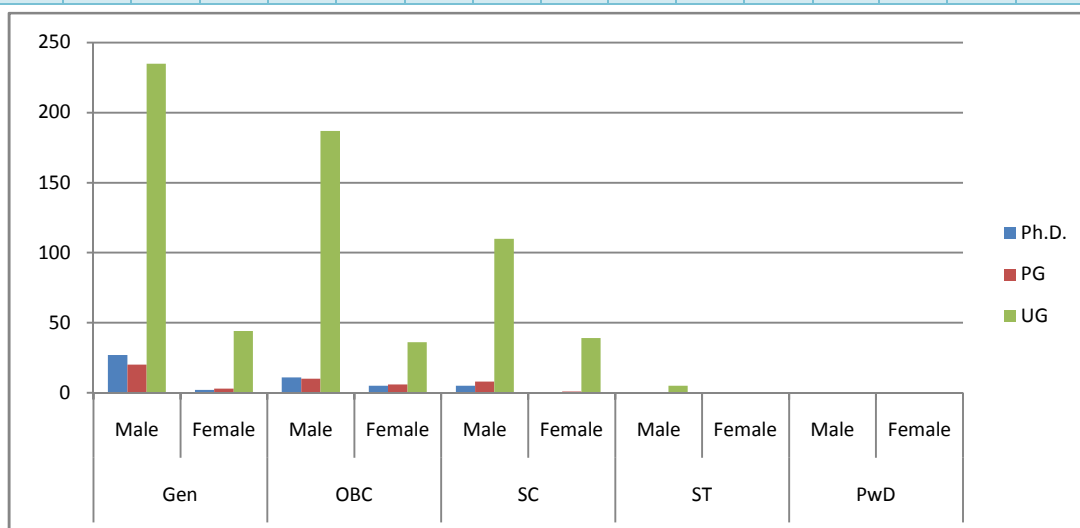

DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS AND COMMUNICATION
J.K. INSTITUTE OF APPLIED PHYSICS & TECHNOLOGY, UNIVERSITY OF ALLAHABAD

Introduction:

Soon after the independence, the first Prime Minister of India, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru realized the need of a pioneer institute in the field of Applied Physics and related subjects. On his initiative an agreement was made between University of Allahabad and J.K. trust, Kanpur on November 22, 1947, to establish the J.K. Institute of Applied Physics and Technology in the premise of Faculty of Science, University of Allahabad. J. K. Charitable trust contributed for the construction of the complete building of the institute.

The foundation stone was laid by late Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, on April 14, 1949. Pt. Nehru also inaugurated the first academic session of the institute on April 4, 1956. Initially a 3 year post-graduate degree course named as M.Sc. (Technology) was started in the department. Later in 1970, on the advice of AICTE, the course was converted to a post B.Sc. – three year degree course (B.Tech. in Electronics and Communication) and a new course in M.Tech. (Electronics Engineering) was introduced. Undergraduate course (B.Sc.) in computer science was started in 1982. The Post graduate course in Computer Science (Software) was started in the year 1986. The Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) had selected the institute as a center to generate man power in computer science (Software). In 2008, a 3-years B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication) course was replaced by 4-years B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) degree course and a new branch in engineering with B.Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) and M.Tech. (Computer science and Engineering) was introduced. Department has started a new 3-years postgraduate degree course MCA from academic session 2018-19. The institute has a very good placement record and the Alumni of University are spread throughout the world and are occupying key positions in their field.

- **Electronics and Communication:** Optical Fiber Communication, Microstrip Antenna, Embedded Systems, VLSI technology, Microwave and Antenna, Milli-meter Waves, Fiber Optic Communication, Soft Materials and Condensed Matter Physics etc.

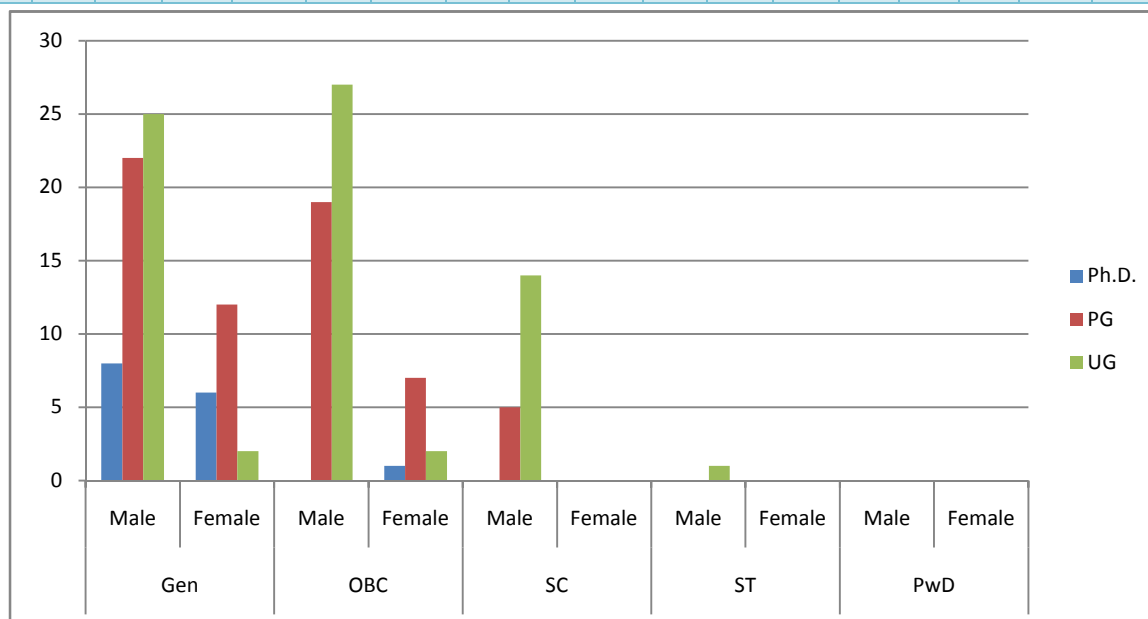

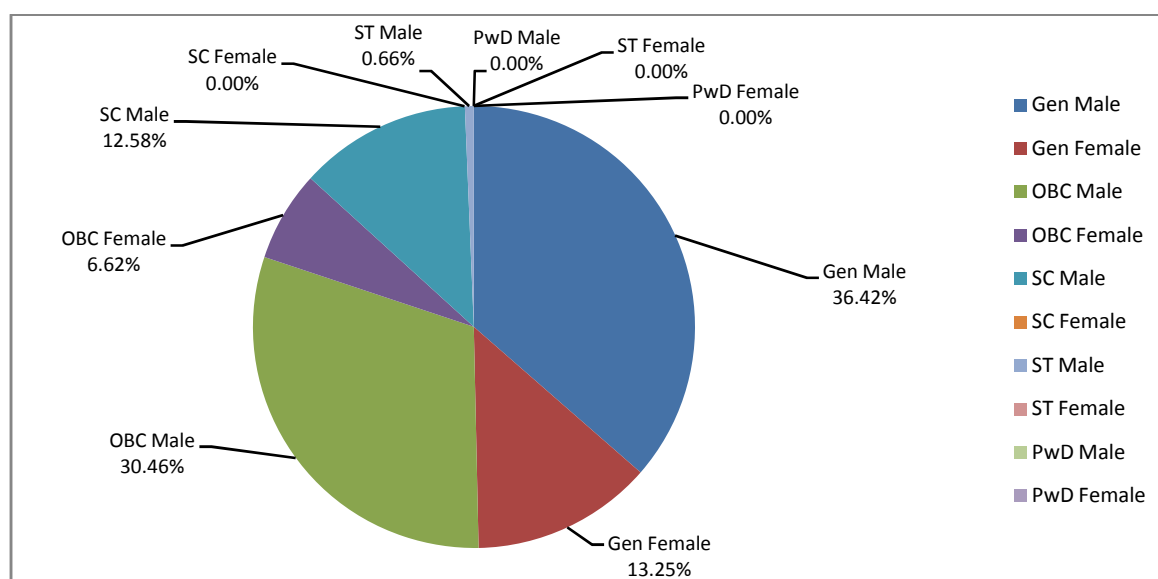

Introduction:

The department of Home Science was established in 1945, in pre independent India, with a two year undergraduate course with the objective to educate women. The department currently has 4 academic programmes - 1 Undergraduate course - B.Sc. Home Science (1945), 2 Postgraduate courses - M. Sc. Textile and Apparel Designing (2009), M. Sc. Food and Nutrition (2019), Ph.D. Programme - In all applied fields of Home Science (2011). Prof. S. Srivastava is currently the Head of Department. The department has 8 permanent faculties comprising of 1 Professor, 1 Associate Professor and 6 Assistant Professors. The department has 10 research scholars, doing research in innovative fields of apparel, dyeing, printing methods, weaving, finishing and fortified product development on foods and clinical investigation of food material using animal model. The department is actively engaged in community development programmes too. The Department comprises of: 1 library, 1 staff room, 2 faculty rooms, 1 seminar room, 3 class rooms, 4 well equipped laboratories which cater to 16 practical's of undergraduate and post graduate course, 1 laboratory for research scholars, Office, Head's room, 4 rest rooms (2 for the students), 1 sitting area for faculty and student interaction.

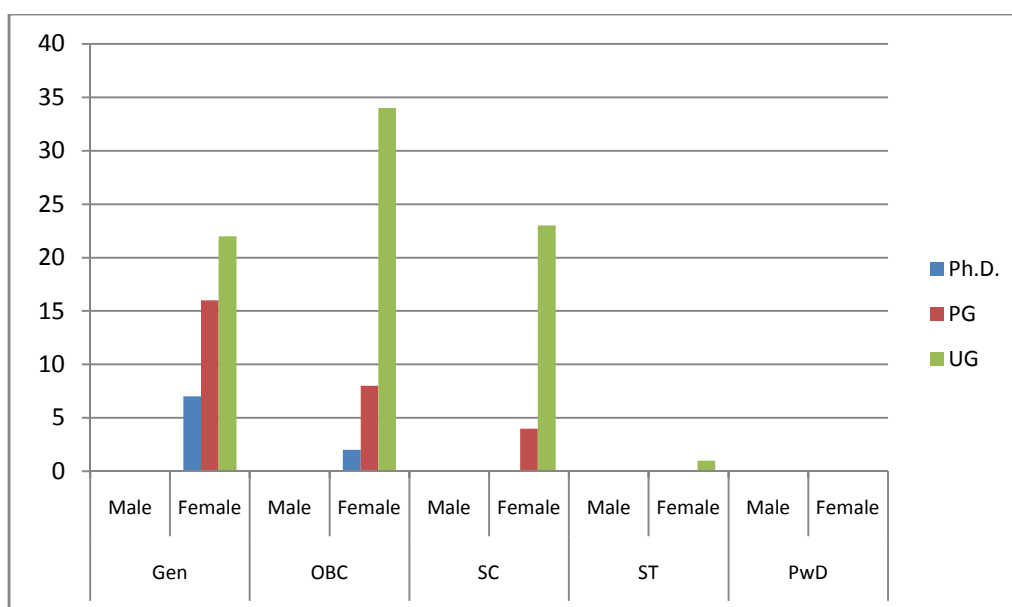

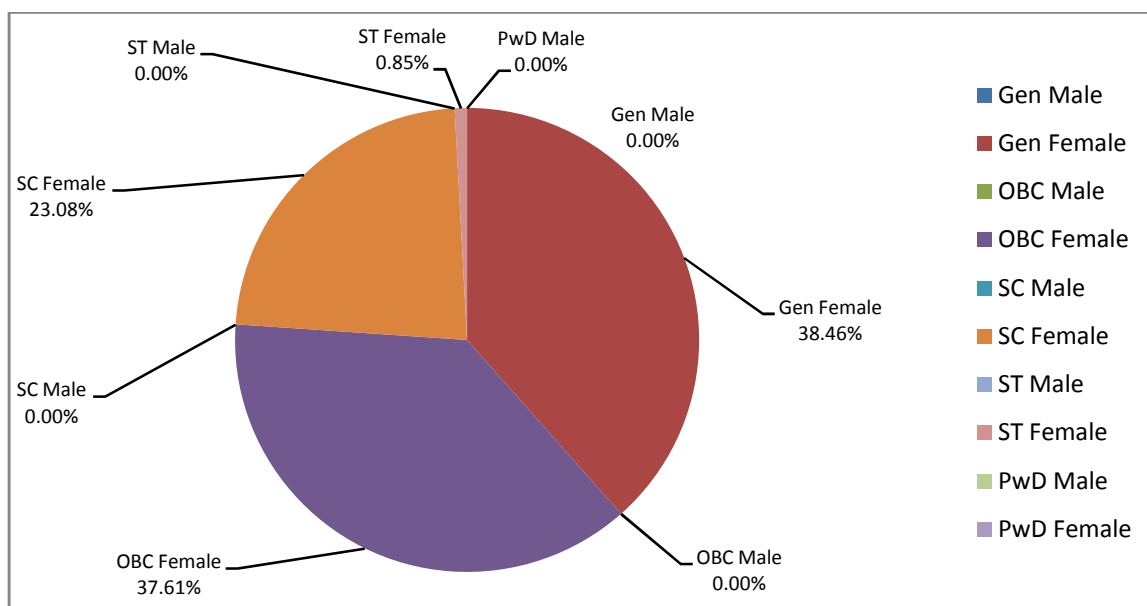

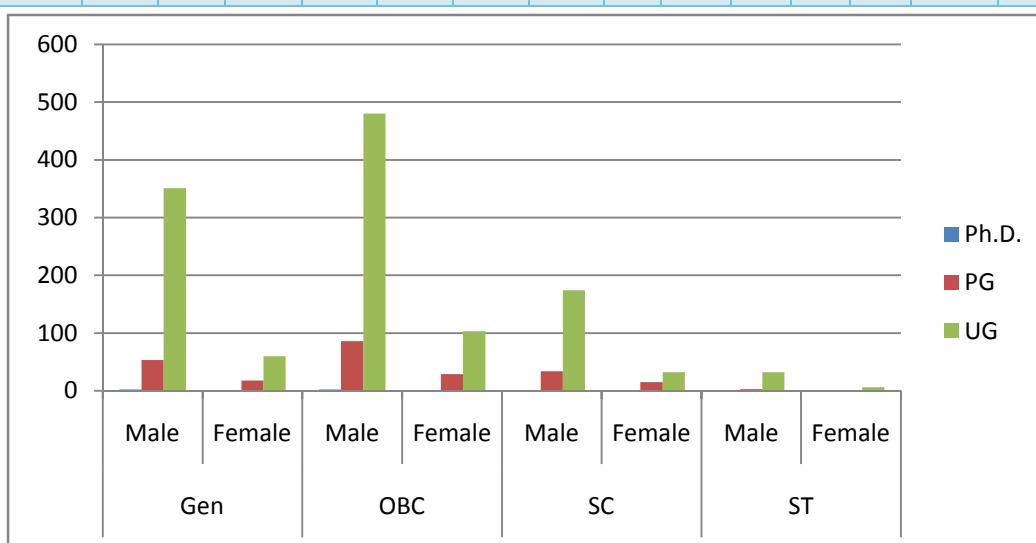

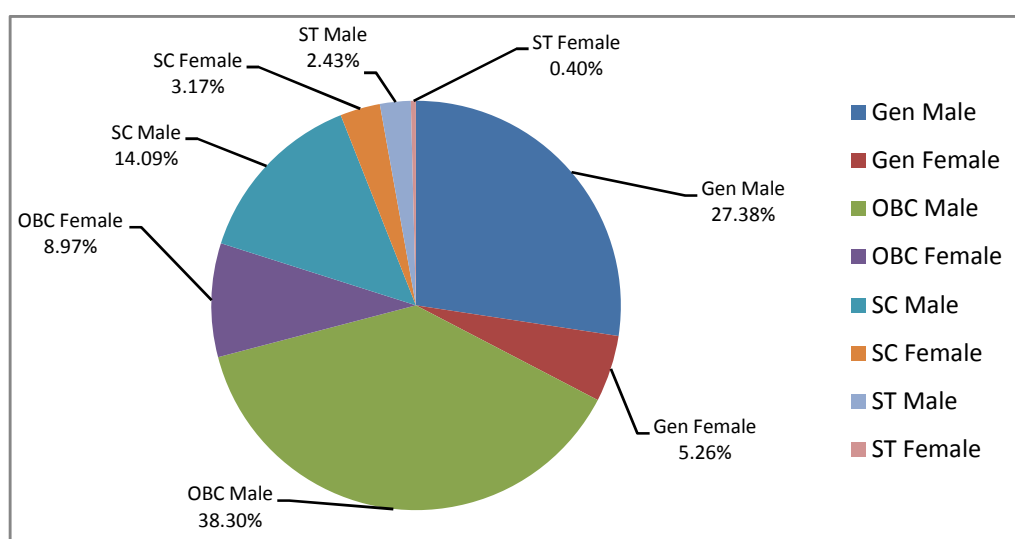

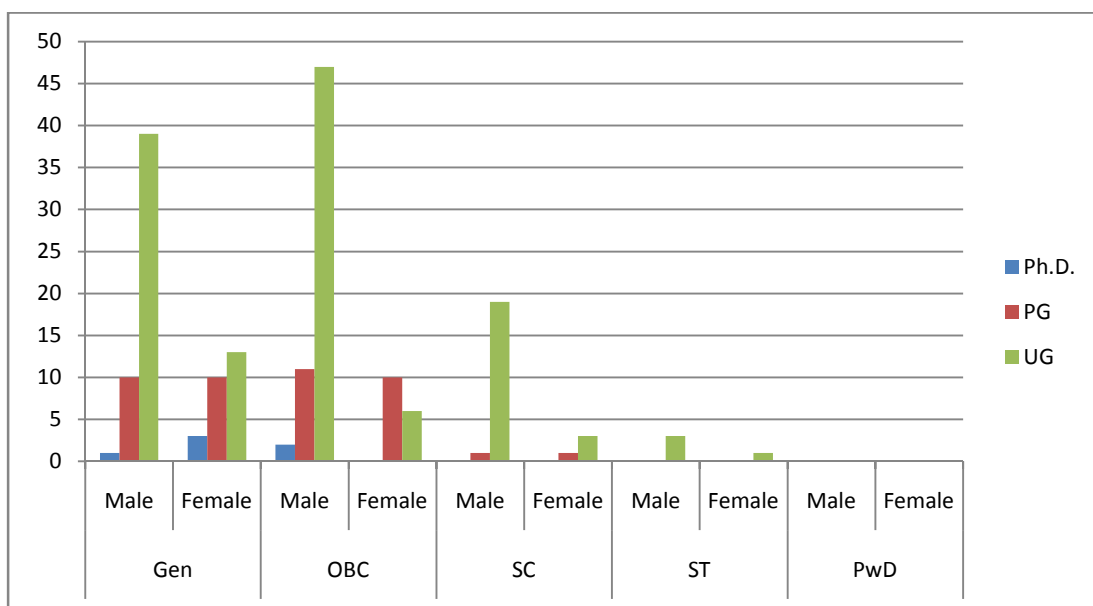

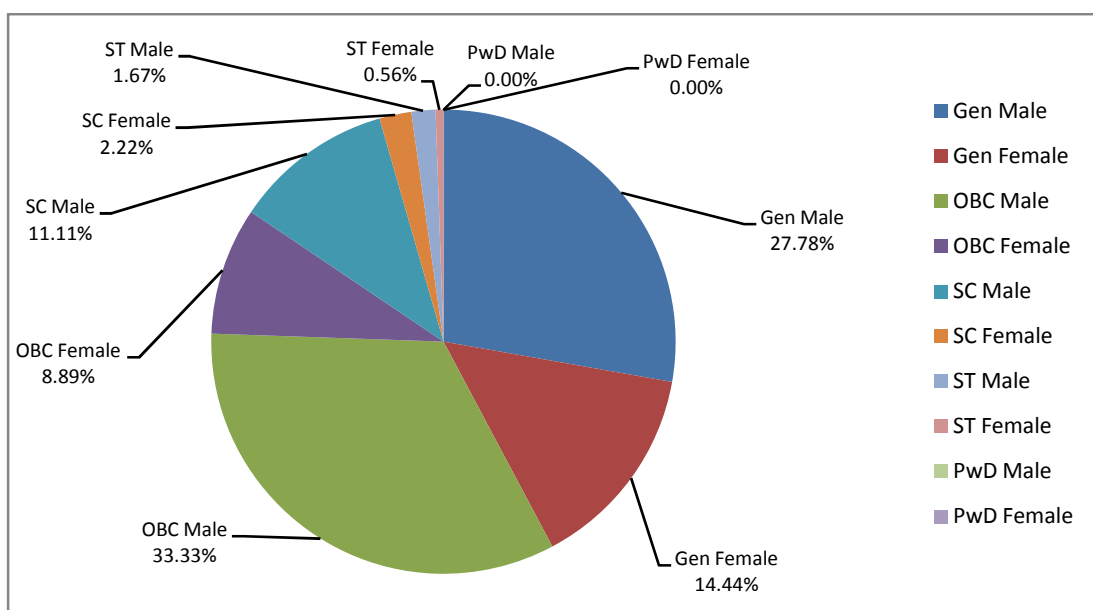

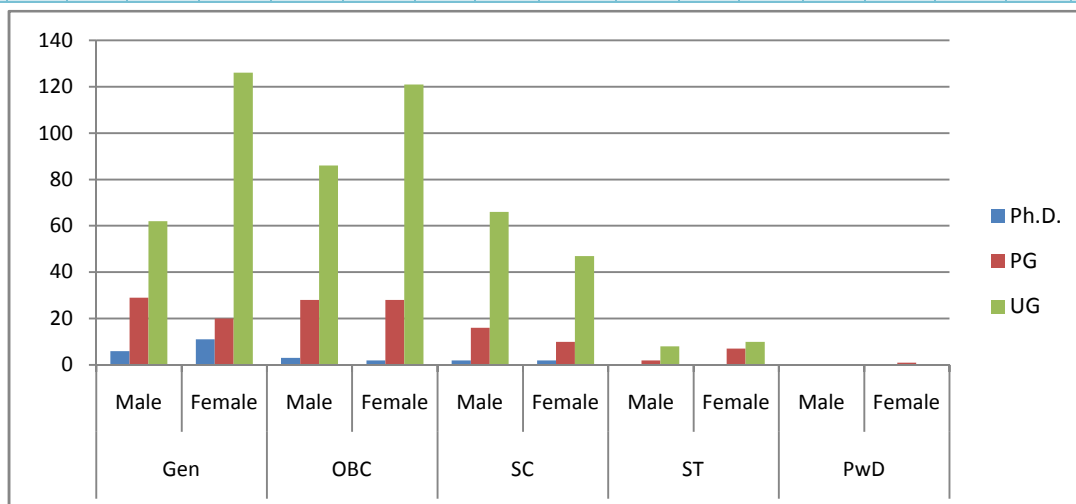

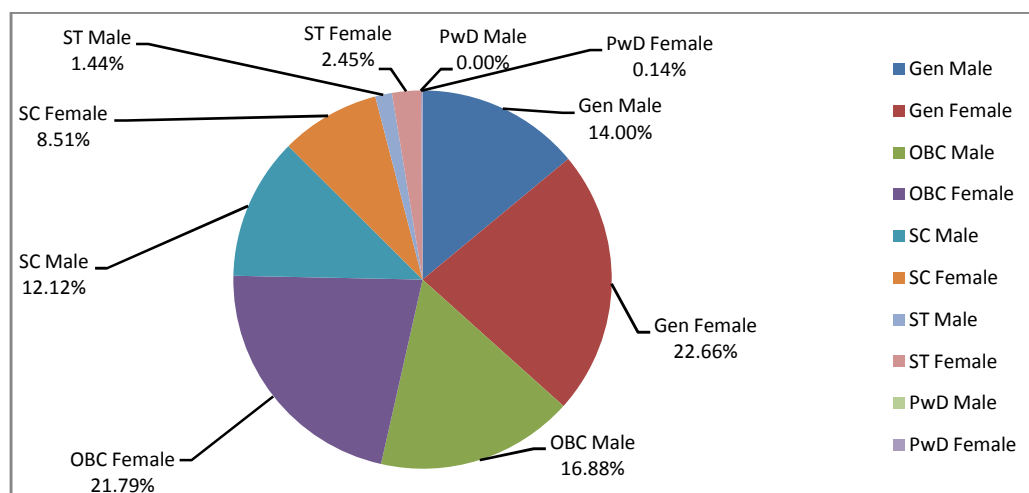

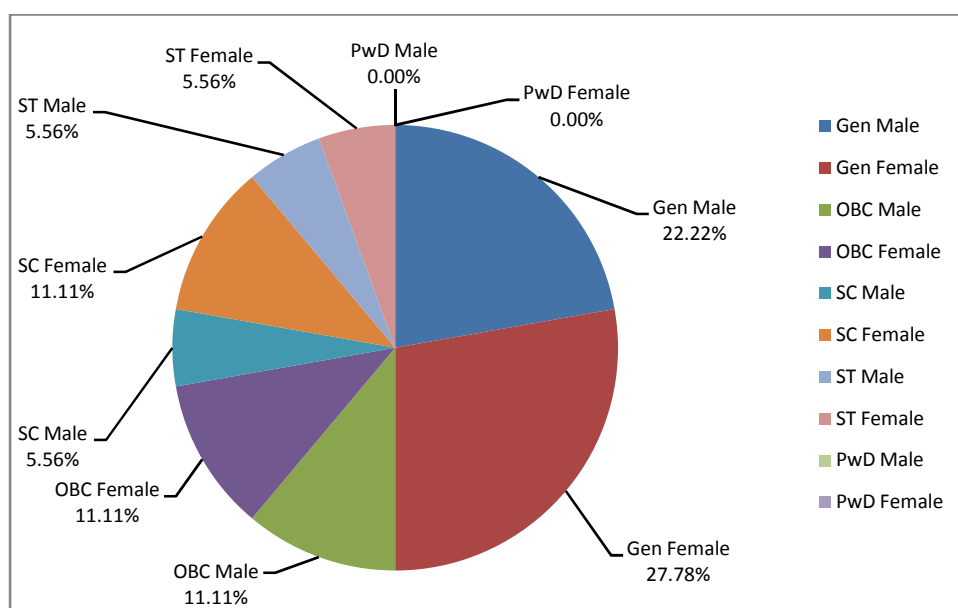

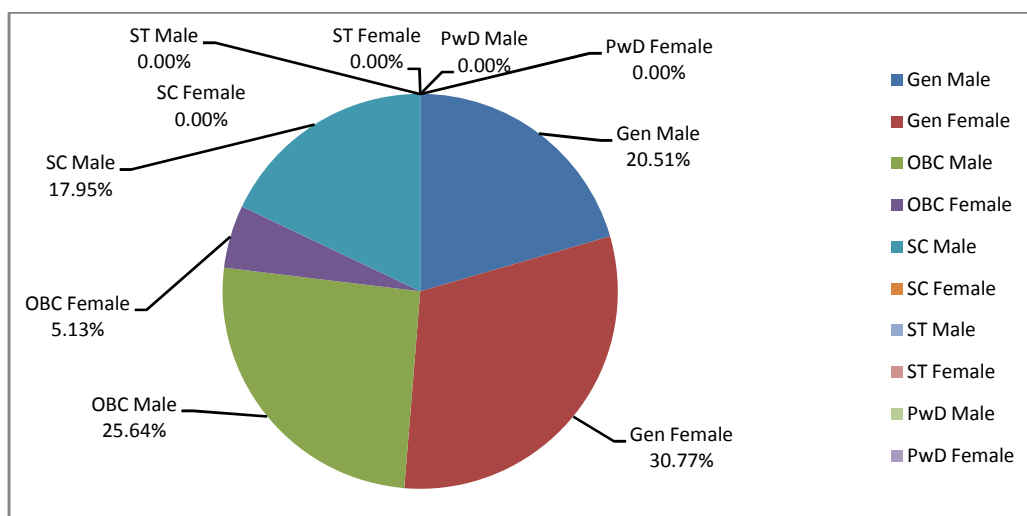

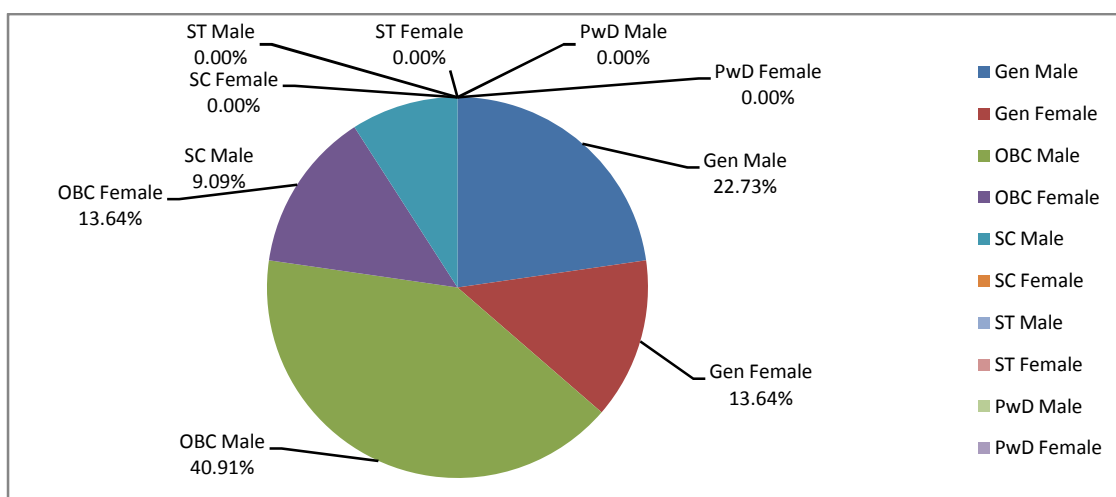

Future Projections

- ❖ To carry out the hydrological impacts investigation of land use/land cover change and climate variability in headwater region of a typical humid subtropical inland river basin.
- ❖ To combine land use models (Markov chain, Dyna-CLUE) with hydrological model (SWAT, VIC) to understand the water availability
- ❖ To perform model based sensitivity experiments to understand sources of errors in the simulation of monsoon and to develop land surface/boundary layer/shallow convection/convective triggering schemes using observations/modeling to reduce such errors.
- ❖ To explore potential impacts of climate change using land use patterns and hypothetical climate scenarios established on the basis of analyzing long-term climatic observations.
- ❖ To develop stochastic climate model for the prediction of extreme rainfall events.
- ❖ To configure regional earth system model (atmosphere-ocean-land-biosphere) over the Indian sub-continent region for improved seasonal prediction of Indian monsoon rainfall.

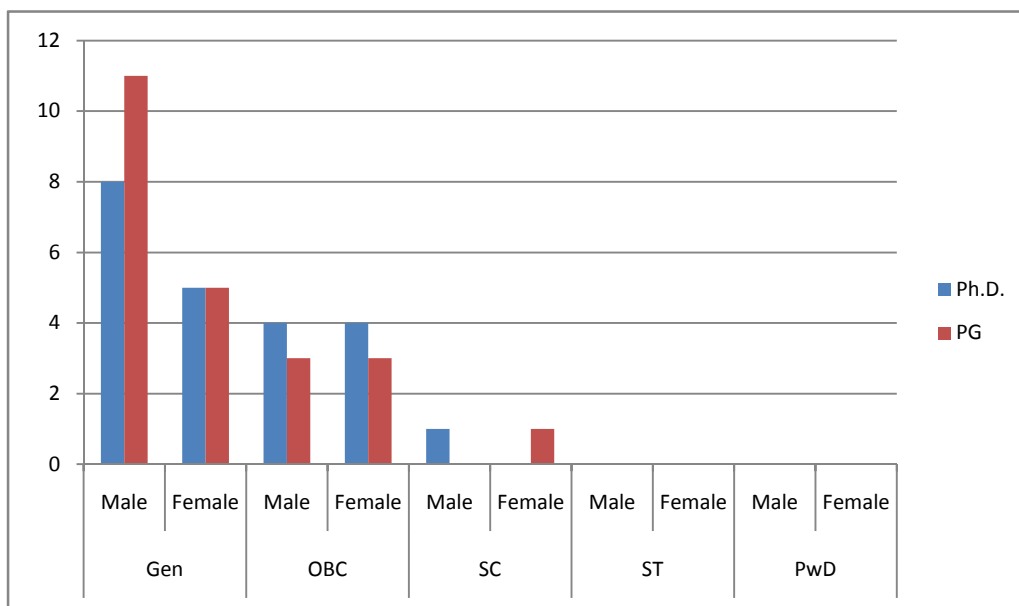

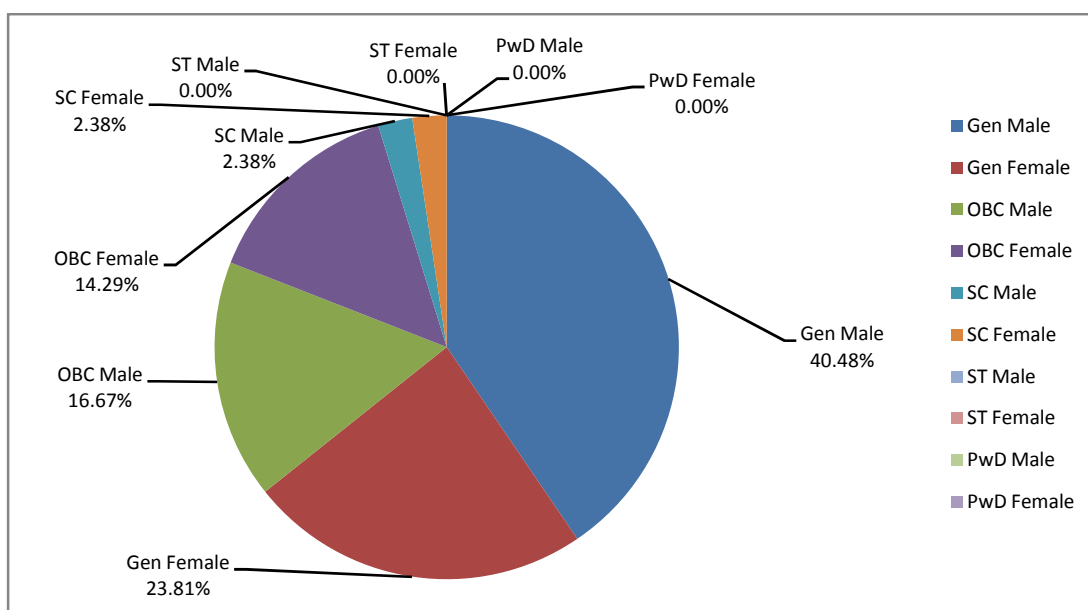

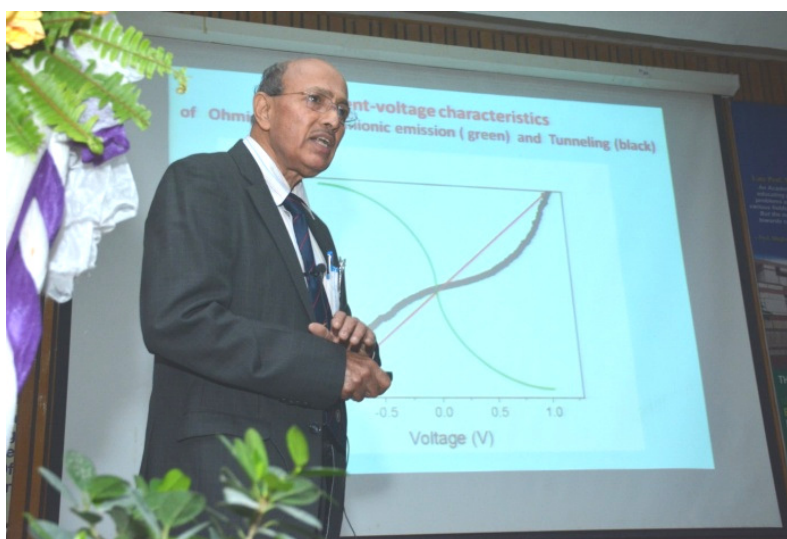

NANO TECHNOLOGY APPLICATION CENTER**High Fluence Ion Beam Facility: Accelerator Center made functional****Introduction:**

The high fluence ion beam facility at University of Allahabad is fully operational and user experiments as well as in-house experiments by one PhD student were performed. The analyses of the experiments are in the process by users. Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi has sanctioned a project titled "Utilization of HIGH FLUENCE ION BEAM FACILITY (UHFIBF) vide letter no. SR/MF/PS-04/2017/G" worth a fund of INR ~4 Crore to run the facility.

Thrust Areas:

- The objective is to run the accelerator based research facility in Allahabad University using ECR ion source to create an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas.
- Accelerator based laboratory will provide best possible environment for training human resource as it encompasses latest technologies such as data analysis, computer control, analog and digital instrumentation, Ultra high vacuum, etc.
- It will be gradually developed for providing opportunity to younger generation to get involved in projects involving state of the art technologies.
- An in-house facility of this type in the university will most certainly help in attracting students towards experimental sciences.

Summary of progress:**Research work done with the facility so far:**

1. Polymer and composites of Au-C₆₀, Au-Ag-C₆₀ deposited on glass, quartz and TEM grid was implanted with Ar⁸⁺ ions with 2.6 MeV energy and varying fluences from 1x10¹⁶ ions/cm² to 5x10¹⁶ ions/cm². The experiment was performed by the group of Dr. Rahul Singhal from MNIT, Jaipur. Total 21 samples were implanted during the experiment.
2. In-house experiment was performed for investigating the ion irradiation induced mutation on rice seeds. The experiment was carried out with Ar⁸⁺ ions with energy of 2.6 MeV and fluence of 5x10¹⁶ ions/cm². There are a number of chemical, biological, physical processes are available to induce mutation but recently ion beam technology emerged as a new form of physical mutagen for the induction of mutation in plants, to produce

new varieties of various plants, in place of X-rays, Y-rays, and neutrons. The main aim of ion beam induced mutation in plant breeding is to modify and develop Novel mutants (such as drought resistance, high productivity, high nutrient use efficiency etc.) and their related genes. This process is made possible due to high RBE (Relative Biological Effectiveness) of ion beams of growth inhibition, fatality etc. Most effective LET value for inducing mutant sectors without causing severe damage of genetic material is lies between (30-110 KeV/ μm). Results suggested that ion beam generate high mutation frequency (mutation causes deletion of several base pair long genetic material which results in irreparable DNA damage) as well as wide mutation spectrum.

The result of present experiment is yet to be analyzed.

3. Au/Si, Au/SiO₂, Ag/Si, Ag/glass, Polymer/Si, Au & Pd alloy/Si samples were implanted with Ar¹⁺, 120 keV; Xe⁸⁺ (~1.4 MeV) ions with varying fluences of 1×10^{14} , 1×10^{15} , 3.3×10^{15} , 1×10^{16} , 1×10^{17} ions/cm². The experiment was performed by the students of Prof. D K Avasthi, Amity University, Noida.

Main features

a) ECR source (Supernanogan)

1. Large area scanning: The beam can be raster scan for the large target area of 30 mmx 30 mm (± 15 mm x ± 15 mm)
2. High flux and high current: Because of high current from the ion source high flux of ions can be implanted in very short time period.
3. Switchability: The switching time between metal ions and gaseous ions is ~2-3 hours.
4. Range of ions: We can produce the metal ions by heating and sputtering techniques depending on element's melting point. Elements with higher melting points can be produced by using sputtering methods.

Below table indicates typical intensities for selected charge states. Beam intensity for various charge states given in μA .

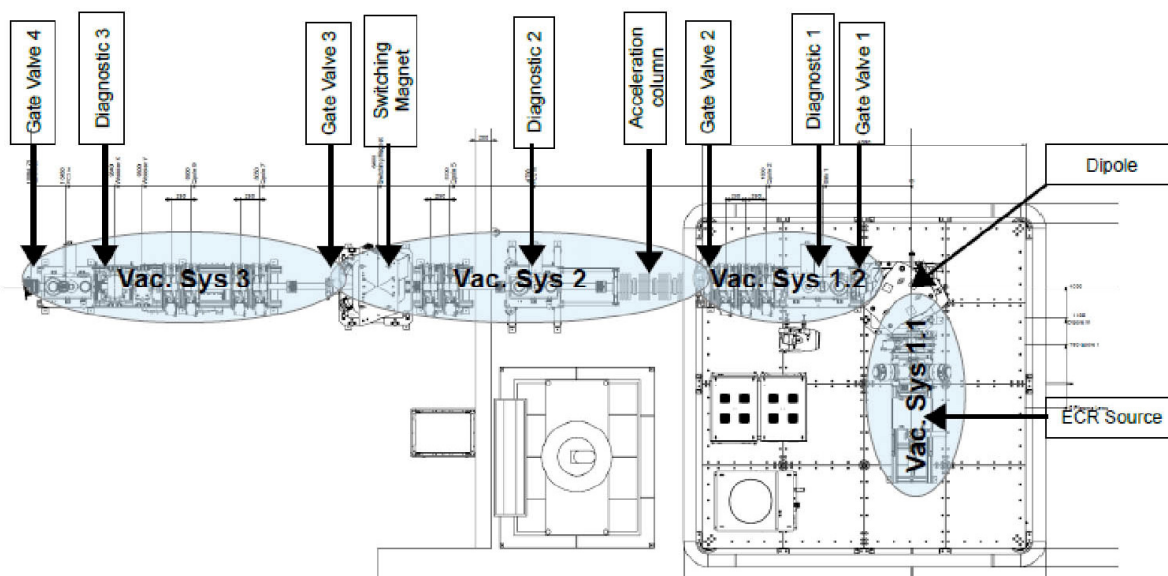
b) Vacuum System:

The pumping system is the set of equipments that produce and manage the vacuum required to produce a beam with good characteristics such as intensity and profile.

This pumping system is composed of: *Primary pumping (Dry scroll pump)*, *Secondary pumping (Turbo molecular pump)*, *Vacuum measurement (Penning and Pirani gauges)* and *valves*.

The facility is divided in to four different areas, separated by 4 *gate valves*:

- **AREA 1 (Vacuum System 1.1):** From the ECR Supernanogan source to the exit of the dipole
- **AREA 2 (Vacuum System 1.2):** From the end of the dipole to the acceleration column.
- **AREA 3 (Vacuum System 2):** From the start of the acceleration column to the exit of the switching magnet.
- **AREA 4 (Vacuum System 3):** From the exit of the switching magnet to the exit of the diagnostic system 3.

Operation:

Each area can be put in-vacuum or vented independently. Gate valves are managed by safety process, the pressure of each side of them must be equivalent to allow the opening of the aperture.

The primary pumping automatically start with the system power on. Secondary pumping starts when set points are activated.

The pumping system is separated in 3 sub-systems :

- 1st : Vacuum System 1.1 + Vacuum System 1.2
- 2nd : Vacuum System 2
- 3rd : Vacuum System 3

c) Beam Diagnostic:

Overview: There are three beam diagnostic systems installed in the high fluence ion beam (HFIB) facility. First one is installed immediately after the dipole, second one is installed after the acceleration tube and last one is installed just before the experimental chamber. The beam diagnostic system consists of following components:

1. The faraday cup: monitoring the beam current
2. Beam profile monitor: Beam profile in x and y direction
3. Slits: To cut the beam size
4. Quadrupole and steerer control: Focusing and alignment of the ion beam with steering in horizontal as well as vertical direction.
5. Wobbling system: Scanning the beam in X and Y direction

The Faraday cup:

The Faraday Cup is a device for measuring charged particle beam currents and charges in real-time. The measurement electrode is electrically insulated inside the cup housing and has to be connected to an electrical vacuum feedthrough by a Kapton insulated wire. The cup housing itself can also be mounted onto an electrically insulating holder in case the current on the housing is supposed to be recorded. Furthermore, the cup setup includes a suppressor electrode to compensate secondary electron emission from the cup surfaces. The cup is made exclusively from materials suitable for ultra-high vacuum conditions down to 1×10^{-10} mbar.

Here, the equipment is designed to monitor the intensity of the ion beam (in terms of current) with a maximum power of 60 Watts.

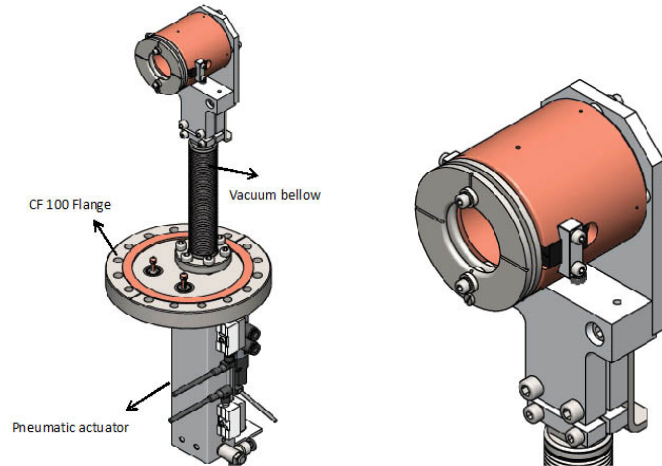
Before entering the copper block, the beam is going through a grounded disk and a biasable disk. The biased disk is for the secondary electron suppression. This can be used with a DC voltage power supply depending of the feature of the measured beam.

The copper block is equipped with two permanent magnets which create a magnetic field that acts as secondary electron suppressor. This is sufficient in most of the measured beam. If needed the effect can be improved by applying a DC bias voltage on the biased disk.

The linear motion is sealed using a stainless steel high vacuum bellow.

Only metal gaskets on CF 100 flanges are used for an optimum vacuum.

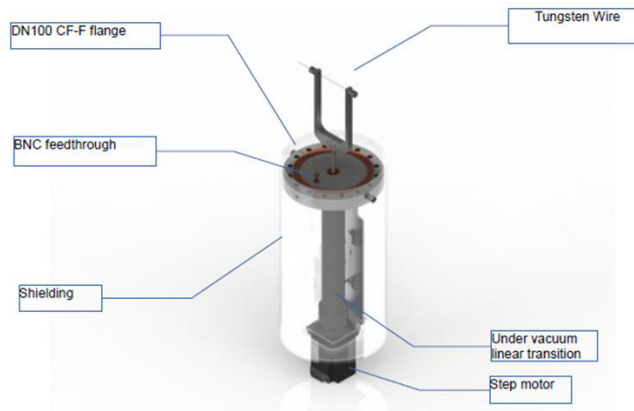
The Faraday cup and its actuator are fully removable for a simple maintenance and parts replacement.



Description of Faraday cup

Beam profile monitor:

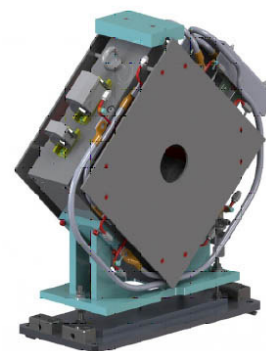
This equipment is designed to acquire the beam profile of a 500 watts ion beam maximum. Only metal gaskets on CF 100 flanges are used for an optimum vacuum. The wire is made of tungsten material and the profile range is 80 mm.



General description of beam profile monitor

Slits: Two double slits allows the reduction of the beam size and the measurement of the emittance. The slits are installed in the first beam diagnostic box after the dipole magnet.

Quadrupoles & steerer : This equipment is an optical equipment for ion beam. It includes a Quadrupole and a Steering magnet which are used to increase the transport efficiency of an ion beam. The quadrupole has 2 Alignment Fiducials Diam 6H7 accurately machined on the mounting plates. Use of spherically mounted retroreflector (SMR) with a laser tracking system allows accurate positioning and alignment of the Magnets. It is recommended that the quadrupoles be positioned within $\pm 1\text{mm}$ of their nominal positions along the beam axis, and within $\pm 0.25\text{mm}$ perpendicular to the beam axis.

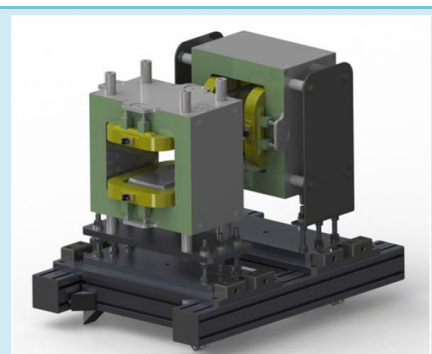

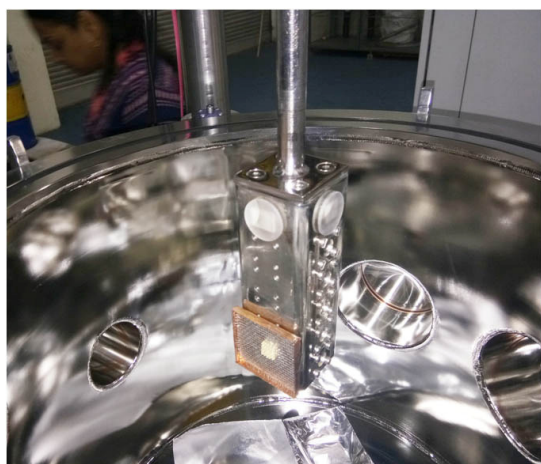

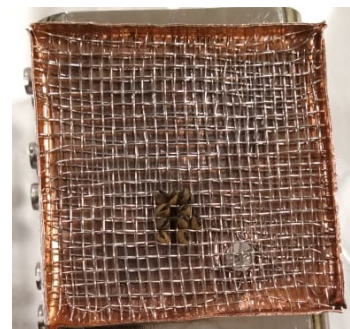


View of wobbler magnet

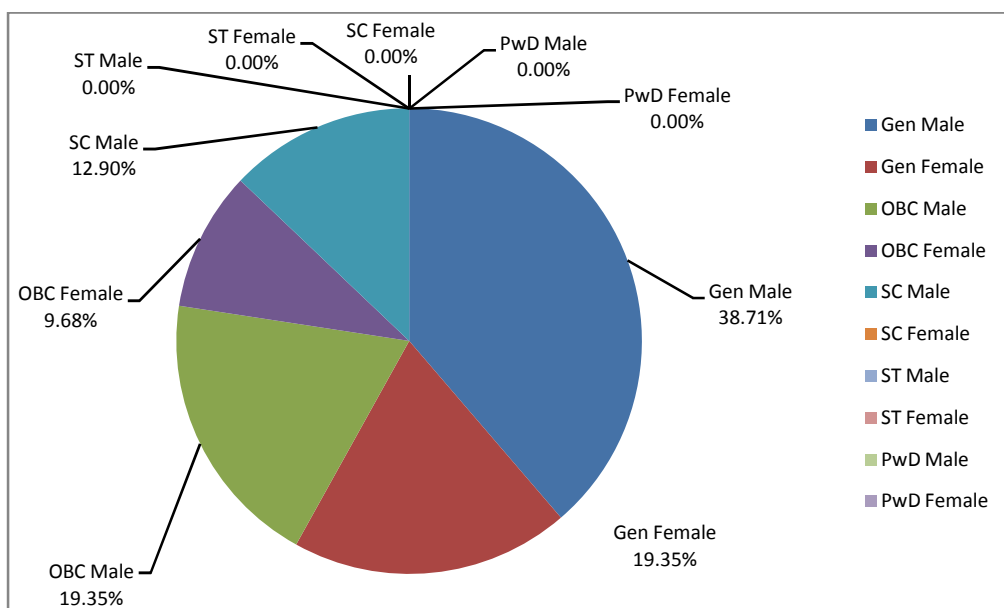

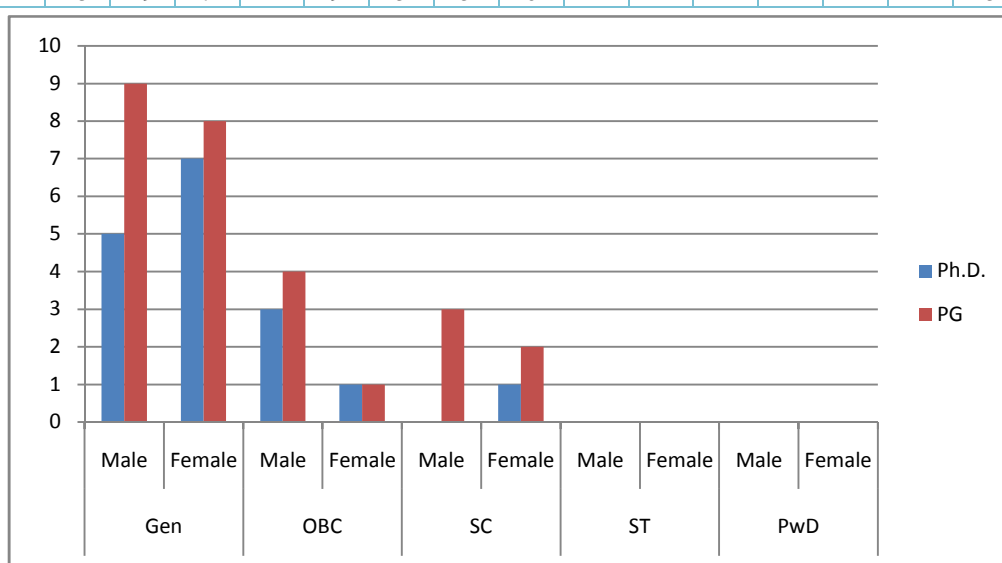

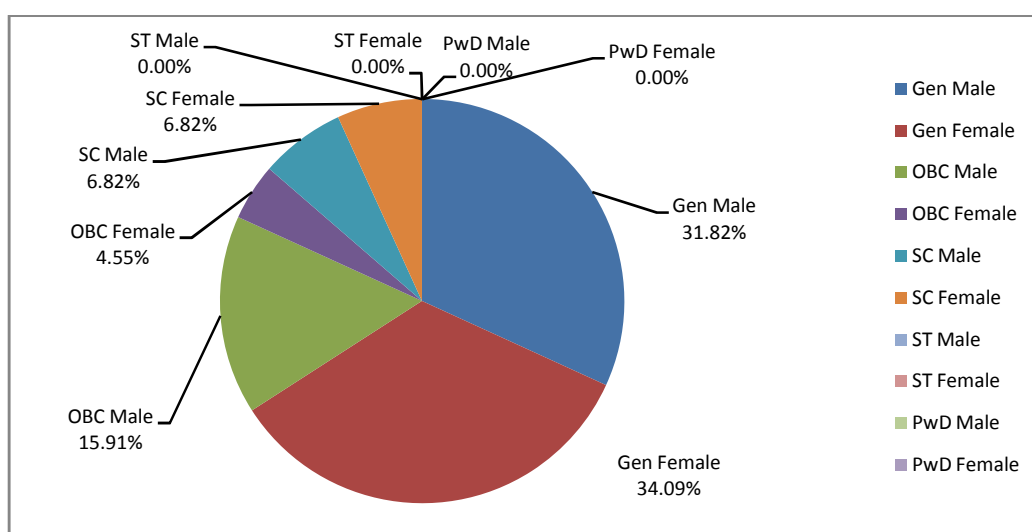

CENTRE OF FOOD TECHNOLOGY

Introduction:

The creation of Centre of Food Technology was done with a vision to encompass food science, food production, food processing, food technology, food safety, food management, entrepreneurship development, food processing and rural development; agriculture and industry linkage through food processing, quality assurance for safe food, research and development on functional foods. M.Sc. Nutritional Sciences was started in year 2000. M.Sc. Food Technology programme was initiated in July 2002 as per the guidelines of UGC and ICAR. This was facilitated by a grant from Ministry of Food processing Industries, Govt. of India under its "Manpower Development Programme".

The Centre is currently offering M.Sc. and Ph.D. degree programmes. In 2015, UGC has also sanctioned about Rs. 90 lakh for offering B.Voc. Food Processing and Technology in linkage with Sector Skill Council which has been started from the year 2015. The Centre has been sanctioned nearly Rs. 1 crore by MoFPI for setting up a commercial quality control laboratory to serve the industry in surrounding areas by providing testing services for quality assurance and food safety. The Centre has established NABL accredited Food Analysis and Research Laboratory for commercial testing of food and water sample which is also given status of Nodal Lab by FSSAI in year 2015. The Centre has been granted externally funded projects from time to time through various nodal organizations such as UGC, DST, APEDA, UPCAR etc.

Thrust Areas:

- Providing education and training for creating strong human resource capacities for the food processing industry and academic institutions in the country.
- Upgrading the skills of academicians, research students and entrepreneurs in field of food science and nutrition.
- Basic, applied and adoptive research and development in post harvest processing, preservation and value addition of food groups.
- Identification of dietary and nutrition problems prevalent among different segments of the population.
- Analytical services to food industries and research institutes for testing the food and other organic samples.

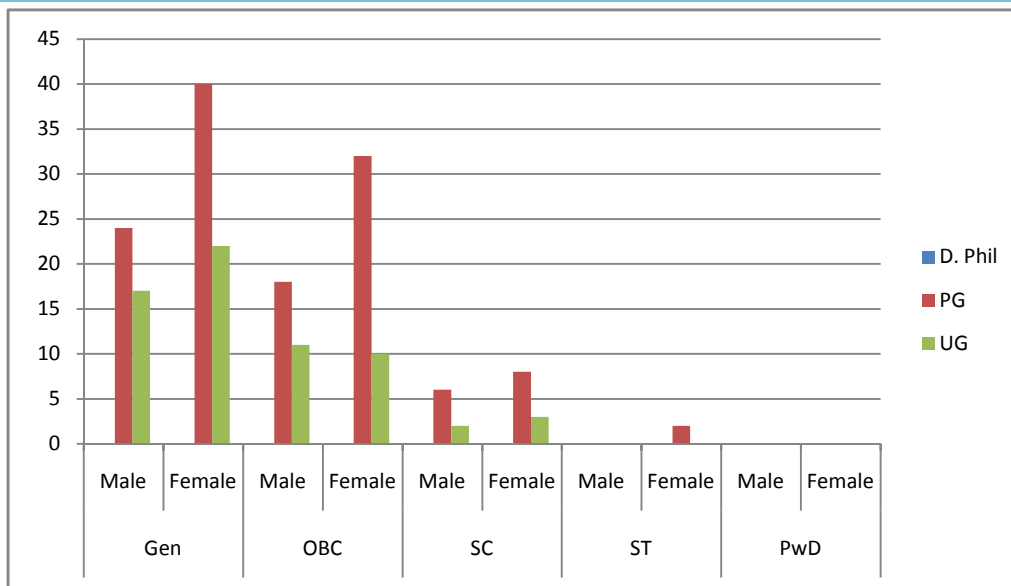

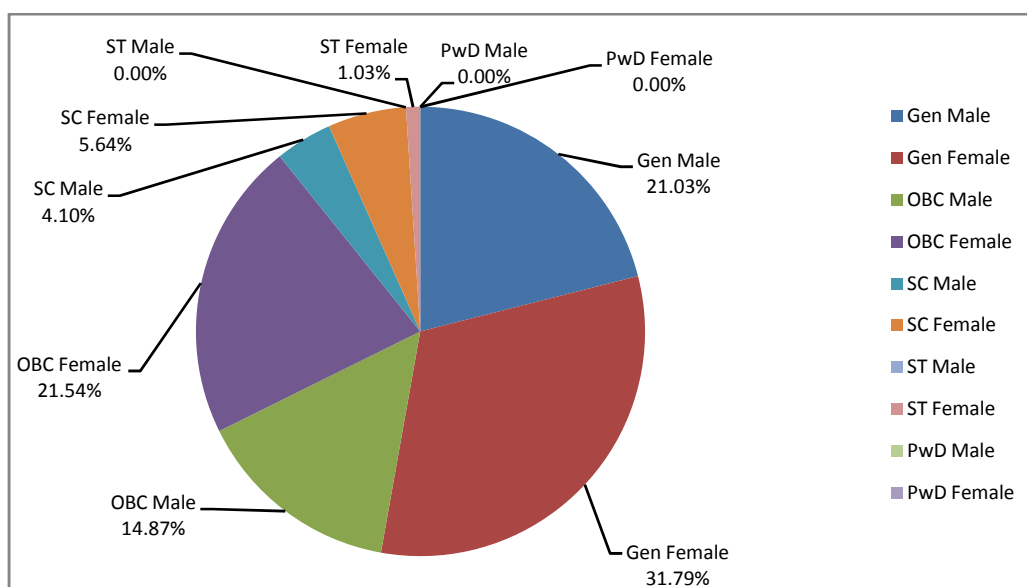

Student Enrollment for the Department



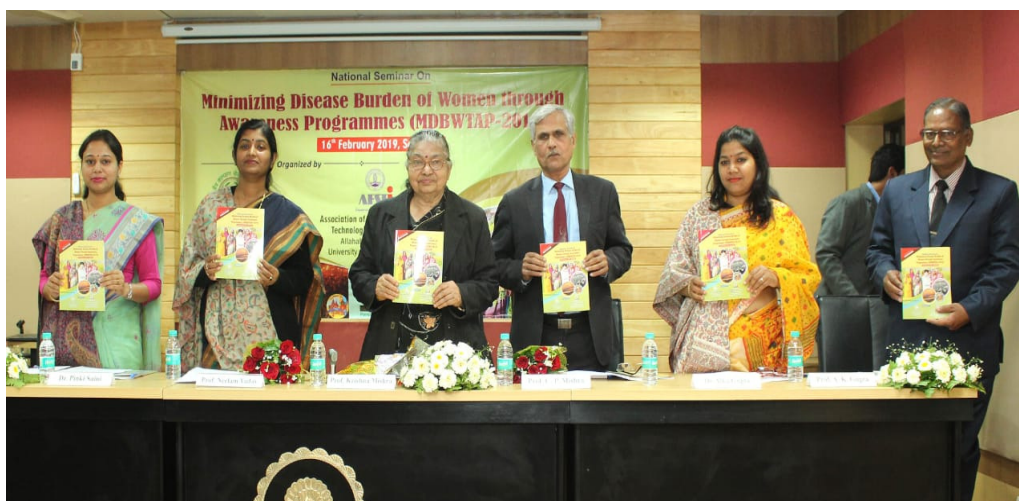
Gender wise distribution of Students

CENTRE OF COMPUTER EDUCATION

Introduction:

The Centre of Computer Education established under IPS in December 2000, is offering BCA, MCA degrees, PGDCA and Ph.D. programmes in computer application. In 2006 the Centre was granted full accreditation by NIELIT (an autonomous body of Dept. Of Information Technology, Ministry of Communication & Information Technology, Govt of India, New Delhi) for a period of 6 years to conduct NIELIT 'O' level computer courses and it is continuing.

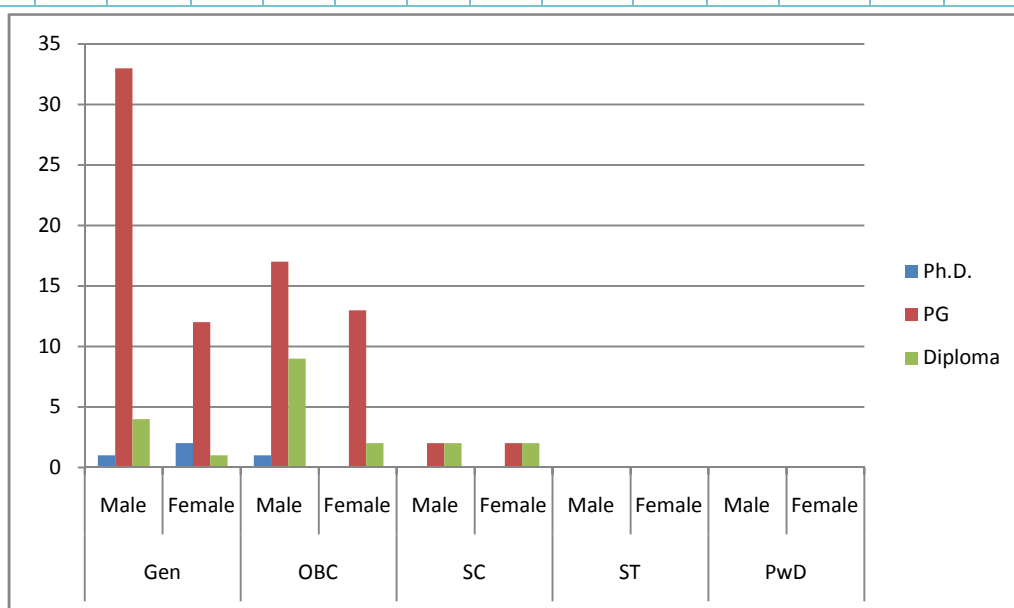
Faculty members and their Area of Research:

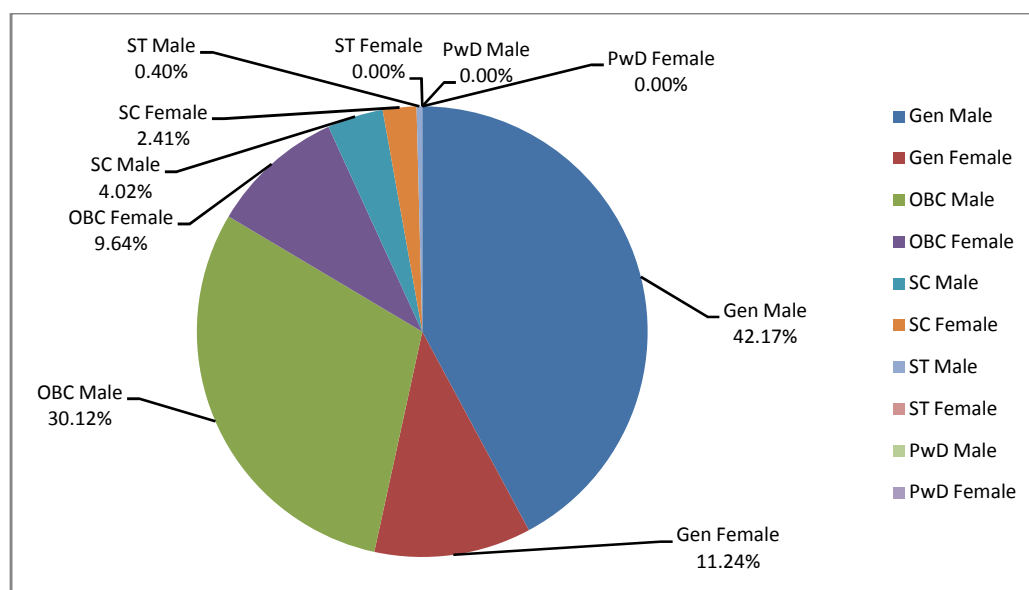

Thrust Areas:

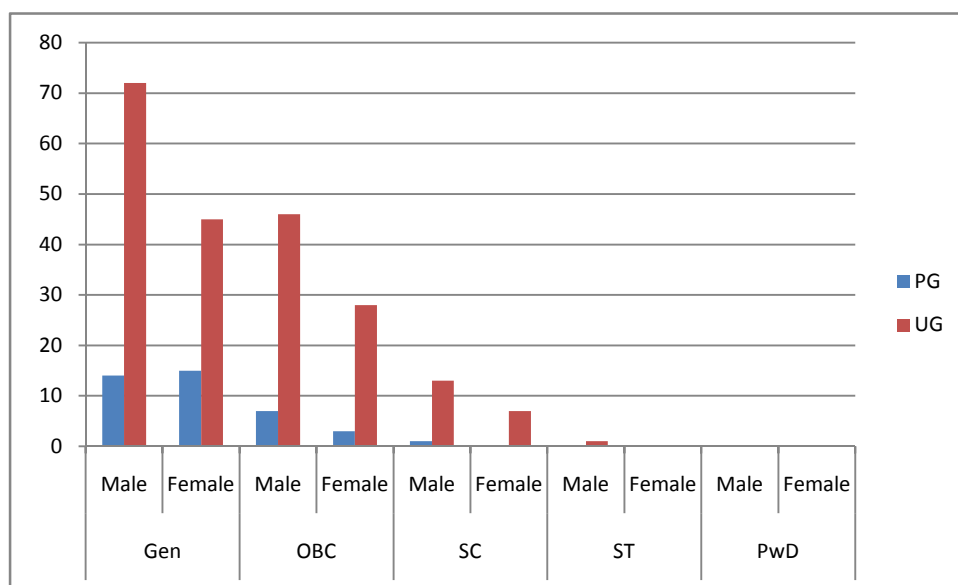

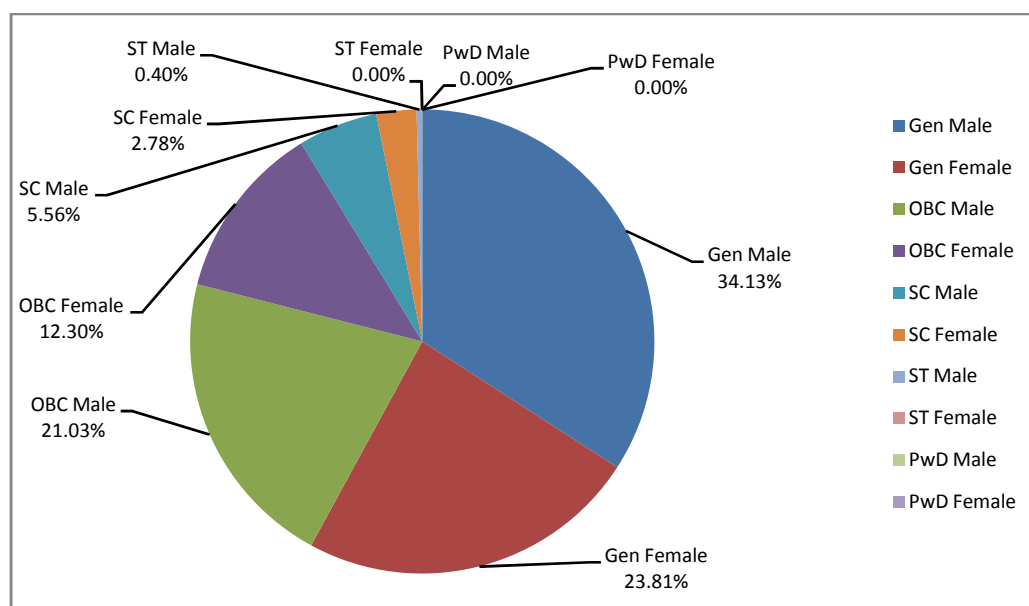

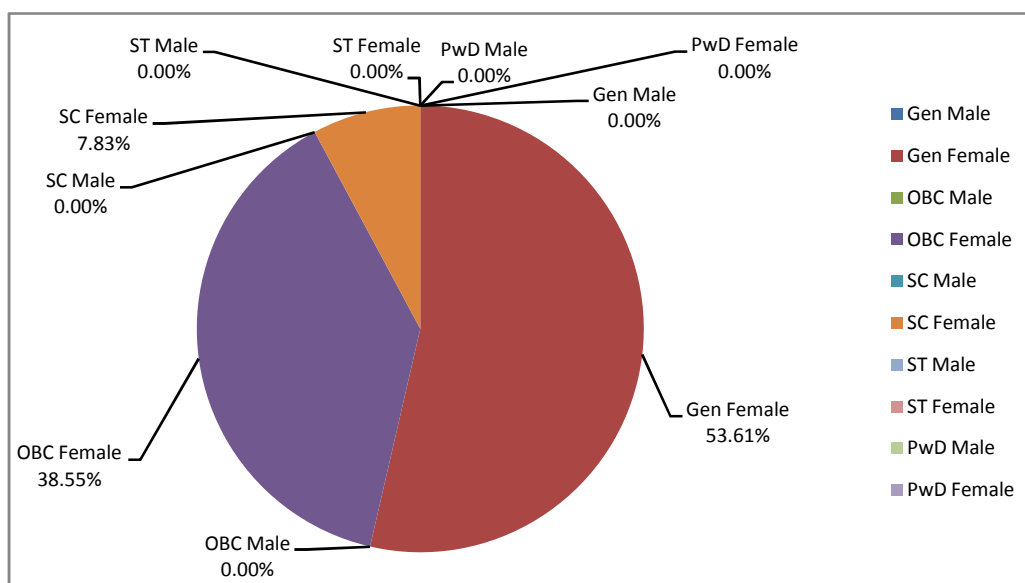

NATIONAL CENTRE OF EXPERIMENTAL MINERALOGY AND PETROLOGY

Introduction:

The National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology (NCEMP) is an Institute of the University of Allahabad and is a Research Unit. The main aim of the NCEMP, A.U. is to conduct high pressure-temperature experimental studies pertaining to the Earth, its interior and various materials. Various experiments for the synthesis of glasses, minerals, rocks and super hard materials, measurement of conductivity and seismic velocity in rocks, phase transformations in minerals, and rate of ascent of magma, etc. are routinely conducted using sophisticated high P-T facilities.

There are different types of High P-T equipments available, such as Multi-Anvil High Pressure-Temperature apparatus, Piston-Cylinder equipment and Hydrothermal apparatus. The NCEMP has sophisticated analytical equipments such as Electron Probe Micro Analyzer and Powder XRD equipments for material characterization. It also has a well-equipped workshop and other technical facilities. The Centre has facilities for synthesis of advanced novel materials such as sol-gel synthesis, melt quenching, hot press and ball milling techniques.

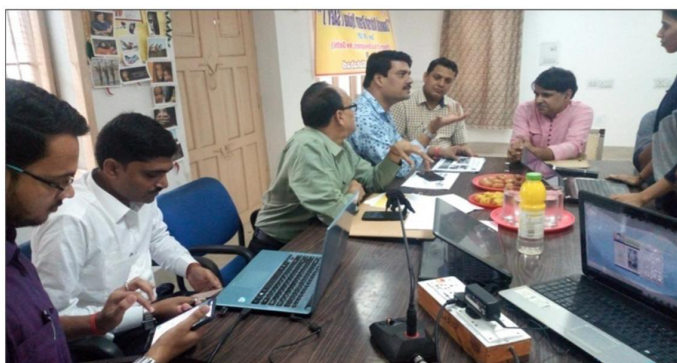

GOVIND BALLABH PANT SOCIAL SCIENCE INSTITUTE

Introduction:

The **Govind Ballabh Pant Social Science Institute** became a Constituent Institute of the University of Allahabad on July 14, 2005, when the University of Allahabad Act, 2005 came into force. Previously it was established as Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) set up in association with the State Governments, in our case, the Government of Uttar Pradesh in 1980. The Institute undertakes interdisciplinary research in the field of social sciences.

The main areas of research at the Institute include development planning and policy, environment, health and population, human development, rural development and management, culture, power and change, democracy and institutions.

The Institute has M.Phil and Ph.D. in social sciences and a MBA Rural Development Programme. In both programmes the degree is awarded by the University of Allahabad.

Thrust Areas:

The Institute research is now focusing on the following three areas:

- **Economic and Social Policies and strategies wherein** the major concerns include agrarian structure, issues related to land, labour and employment; environment, disaster, poverty and climatic change; food security; development related displacement and most importantly institutions and development. Social policy concerns include population growth and resource constraints, which are of utmost importance to the most densely populated state of Uttar Pradesh.
- **Culture, Politics and Society:** Concept of power, popular cultures, memory and past, orality and printed knowledge of Dalit, subaltern and other marginalised communities, local knowledge, structures and forms of subaltern cultural consciousness and linkage between cultural resources of the communities and process of development..
- **Democratic Processes and Institutions:** concept of justice in democratic processes, relationship between social justice and marginalities, governmentality, new modes of participatory governance, popular aspirations and new social movements, formation of civil societies, state, power and citizenship and public sphere as space of democratic deliberations of post colonial Indian society. Issues of human suffering, forced displacement and migration, human rights and women dignity in contemporary globalisation induced developmental democracy..

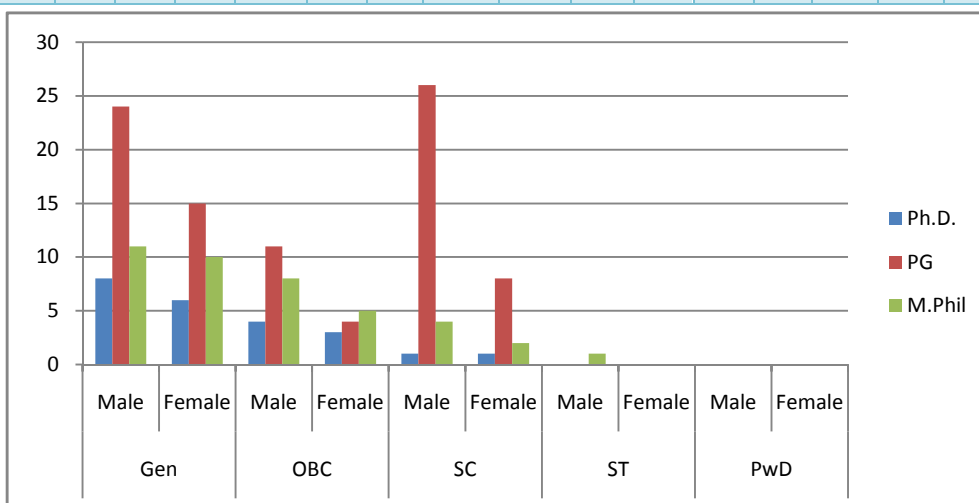

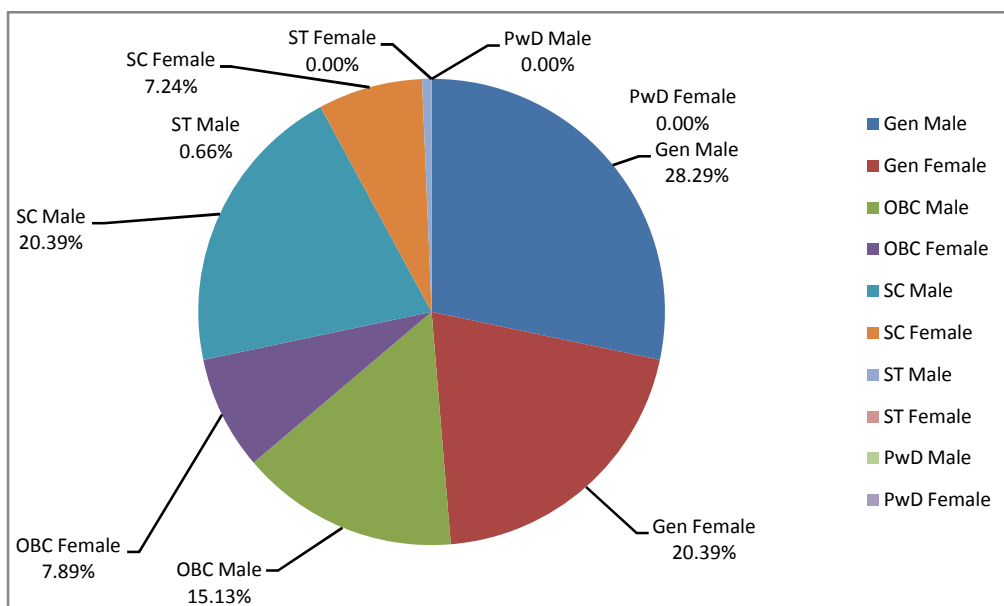

STUDENTS' WELFARE ACTIVITIES

OFFICE OF DEAN STUDENTS' WELFARE

The year that has gone by was marked with the DSW set up making tangible gains by way of consolidation and giving thrust to its major initiatives. The year also erased the shadows/pangs of transition in a large measure. Better amenities, larger financial allocation in assistance to students, better healthcare, hygiene, spurring sporting activities and, the last but not least, the hard fought and won peace and tranquility in hostels and the campus have been the cornerstone of the multifaceted activities of the preceding year. Progress and development have been at the core of all DSW and his team endeavors. The progress, though slow but surefooted, has instilled yet greater resolve to pursue the unfinished agenda of growth. Unquestionably the mood at the DSW set up has been upbeat and triumphant.

Here are some of the modest successes achieved through sustained team spirit and camaraderie to which the DSW Board, teachers, officers, staff, and students have contributed immensely.

Welfare Measures (General)

Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored "Merit cum Means" Based Scheme .

Financial assistance towards meeting partial expenses for medical treatment to students suffering from serious diseases, accidental injuries etc.

Health Facilities of Students:

- University Health Centre is running for the medical welfare of students and employees of the University under the supervision of Senior Medical Officer. One homoeopathy doctor was also engaged by the University. Two ambulance was working for the transport facility of the University.

Students Union Election:

- Election for the student union was held in the session 2017-18 . The students union office -bearers given encouragement, aid, and guidance, to organize various student related activities. As such, a large number of seminars , conferences, and, Departmental cultural program were held under the auspices of student union .

Welfare of Physically challenged students.

Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently Abled Students has been the nodal Centre for facilitating and supporting academic and digital inclusion for the differently abled students of the University of Allahabad. In the session 2016-2017, it continued to provide the necessary academic resources for the students. It is equipped with computers, scanners , several screen reading software's (specially meant for visually challenged) etc. The Centre was established in 2009 and, therefore, it was a high time overhaul these facilities. In pursuance of this 11 computer systems were overhauled for their efficient functioning. Further, the problem of access and the provision of barrier free environment for the differently abled students was addressed. It was declared by the University Administration that barrier free buildings are a necessary pre-condition for facilitating the educational inclusion of differently abled students and, in pursuance of this, designs for railing and ramps etc have been cleared for the old departmental building of the University. At present the work for provision of barrier- free building is at an advance stage. The grievances of the differently abled students regarding hostel allocation were addressed and they were allotted room in the University hostels on a priority basis. Also, given the constraint of space in the hostel, the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for the Differently Abled Students was activity involved in facilitating the admission of students in the hostels for the visually-challenged students run by the State Government. Due to the support and facilitation by the Centre even some visually challenged student could do well in the competitive examination for professional courses and jobs. The differently abled students who could not be get admission in University hostels were accommodated in State Government hostel through the efforts of the centre.

Admission of physically challenged students

DSW office is continuously working with the Director, Admissions to facilitate physically challenged candidates to get admission in different courses of the University(UG+PG+Law+Professional) by organizing medical board for examining

disability of the candidates seeking admission under physically challenged category, and recommend genuine candidates for admission

Hostels (Boys and Girls)

- In compliance of the order passed by the Hon'ble High court, all the University and Trust hostels were vacated with the help of District & Police administration.
- The internet Wi Fi facility of the hostels of the university was upgraded.
- Installation of Water purifiers to ensure supply of pure drinking water for the residents of the hostels and students at large on the campuses.
- Pure drinking water and sanitation for hostels and University departments

Measures to enforce discipline, law and order in the Hostels and the Campuses

- Setting up of anti ragging cell to monitor/redress the menace of ragging in hostels and campuses. Teams made massive surprise checks and succeeded in containing incidence of ragging. Thankfully constant vigil resulted in no serious cases of ragging.
- Periodic raids/strict vigilance of combined teams of DSW/Proctorial board and Warden/Superintendent of the hostels carried out to evict anti social elements/ students with criminal records. Tough measures to enforce discipline yielded positive results.
- Organized Meditation/Yoga and health check up camps in the hostels & University Health Centre in collaboration with various prominent NGOs working in this area. Health check up camps for girl students organized on Sundays in collaboration with Women's Advisory Board (WAB) were largely attended

Scholarship and financial assistance to the students by the DSW office

- Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Government of India sponsored Merit cum Means Based Scheme. The scholarship awarded to 400 students of UG/PG/ IPS/ Professional courses @ Rs. 5000/- per student for a session. For the session 2017-18, 353 eligible students were awarded McM scholarship.
- Financial assistance towards meeting partial expenses for medical treatment to students suffering from serious diseases, accidental injuries etc.
- Financial assistant for the purchase of books to the poor students out of Poor Boys Funds account. For the session 2017-18, 136 eligible students were awarded assistance.
- Financial assistant for the cultural programme in the various departments & University hostels of the University were granted .
- Financial assistance was also given to students of different units of the University for organizing their annual functions. The Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently abled students organized International Day for persons with disability under the aegis of DSW office.

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU CENTRE FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED STUDENTS

Established in 2009 Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently abled Students is an enabling unit for the differently-abled/ *divyang* students. In 2018-19 38 students were enrolled with it. The Center has a computer lab with e books as well as screen reading software like NVDA for the visually challenged persons. The upgraded infrastructure involving equipments worth more than Rs.5.00 lakh acquired in preceding was inaugurated and became functional in 2018-19. Sixteen more e-books were added to the center's existing learning resources which consist of 392 books in 12 different subjects as well as Braille books available in the Central Library of the University. A total of 623 visits were made by students to use the learning resources of the center. Like last year more than 30 students got accommodation in State Government Hostel (Rashtriya Ucha Siksha Adhyanrat Dhristibadhith Chatravas) especially designed for the *divyang*.

Jawaharlal Nehru Center for Differently Abled Students JNCDS of University of Allahabad (A.U) organized White Cane Day Function on 15 October 2018 in order to spread awareness for the rights, needs and capabilities of the visually challenged. Also, on December 3 2018 it organized a programme at Nirala Art Gallery Sabhagar to celebrate International Day for Person with Disability for 2018. The theme for this programme, as mandated by United Nation, was Empowering the Disabled and Strengthening Equality with Social Inclusion The Chief Guest of function was Vivek Prakash (Chairman, Railway Recruitment Cell, NCR) and Ms. Manisha Goyal (DY.CME, NCR). In the first segment a Debate Competition on 'National Swachh Bharat Mission : Successes and Challenges' was organized wherein Prof Ashish Saxena (Head , Sociology Deptt) Dr, Sanjay Kumar (Urdu Deptt.) and Dr. Saroj Yadav (Education Deptt.) of A.U judged the participants. Dr. Alok Prasad (Coordinator, JNCDS) anchored the function while Suman Yadav (Research Scholar, Music Deptt.) presented vote of Thanks. Devendra Gupta (Researcher, Music Department, AU) and his musical group presented *ghazals* of famous poets and singers. In Debate Competition Aditya Tiwari, Mukesh Vaishya and Pankaj Bhai Patel secured First, Second and Third positions respectively.

A special intervention in 2018-19 was that a supernumerary for the *divyangs* in all the department for the PhD admissions was created in order to give them adequate representation in research.

SPORTS BOARD

Introduction:

The aim and object of the Sports Board are to promote physical well being of the University students in general, by providing facilities for game and sports and by organizing competitions and tournaments. Keeping in mind, the aims and objectivities, the activities of the Board are planned. In spite of the infrastructural deficiency and resource crunch, the Board has been able to achieve National level achievements. A brief report about the achievements of the Board are as follows:

Mission and Objectives

The Mission of the University of Allahabad is to be a global, socially conscious Center of Excellence in the conservation, creation, advancement and dissemination of knowledge, equipped to take up challenges of the enormous change taking place all around and committed to empower its faculty and students to contribute meaningfully to economic, technological, social development and progress. In order to have a Global outreach, the University is committed to advance the same facility to International Students and impart quality education to them as well.

The living ambience and social milieu of the campus is also reflected in an integrated, with a new focus on an interdisciplinary approach in teaching and research. There is freedom to define and design course content or start new courses. Research themes evolve with new developments in the area and the interface between different areas of study. Everyone at the university competes with himself/herself to excel in their own field of research. The University of Allahabad is academically and socially a vibrant place where all have space to express their views.

The four faculties and thirty five departments along with special centres of the university produce high quality research publications, books, working papers and Ph.D. theses. The University alumni occupy important positions, in academics, government, private sector, and in fact in all walks of life.

The University through its International Students Advising and Services (ISAS) will continue to play a major role globally in the field of higher education, by seeding new ideas and creating knowledge, and by imparting high level of training with values and social commitment to all its International Students as well. Since its inception on July 14, 2005 as a Central University, the University has reaffirmed to live up to these ideals. We believe that the University is responsible not just for imparting knowledge, but for disseminating knowledge in society; so as to build a better Society at national and international levels in future.

Present International Student Advisor & Board:

The University has a separate International Students Advisory Board under the International Student Advisor with the Vice Chancellor as the Chairperson to advise and facilitate the International Students.

International Connection

The University stands for humanism and tolerance, for reason, for adventure of ideas and for the search for truth. It stands for the forward march of the human race towards ever higher objectives. The Universities proposes to discharge its duties adequately, and aspires to provide to its International Students the following facilities:

With a view to assist international students, University has established an International Students Office in the University campus. The University of Allahabad model for Internationalization of Higher Education has these unique features:

1. In the age of globalization, the University has set out to make its presence felt globally through internationalization of its programmes and opening new avenues of association for global student community.
2. With the approval of UGC and the Central Government, the International Student Advisors' Office of the University proposes to have a number of MOUs signed with leading Universities whereby sharing of the facilities in the university and exchange of Faculty and students can be made possible.
3. Besides looking after admissions and eligibility, the Office of the International Student Advisor coordinates with ICCR, Ministry of External Affairs, different embassies and consulates for various purposes including grant/award of Scholarships.

Hostel Accommodation Facility:

The University maintains a separate boys' hostel for International Students and female students are accommodated in a separate girls' hostel.

Very soon, the University of Allahabad with the support of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Government of India will construct a new hostel for accommodating 140 students with separate state of the art self sustained apartments adjacent to the present International House.

Sponsored Student Programs

The Sponsored Student Program is a part of International Student Advising and Services (ISAS) at the University of Allahabad with the specific goal of assisting sponsors and sponsored students by:

- Supporting the academic goals of sponsored students and their sponsors.
- Providing records of student's academic standing when requested.
- Facilitating communication between students and sponsors to help with financial and administrative questions.
- Working with the Sponsoring Agencies as well as the Foreign Registration Office to answer sponsored students' questions and to help students maintain and understand their immigration status.

Services for Sponsored Students:

- A special orientation session for sponsored students
- Help with providing medical facilities when required. Facilitation is given to Sponsored Students to avail medical insurance, if the student desires.
- Help sponsored students communicate with Academic Departments, and Sponsoring Agencies.
- Reminders for students with expiring financial guarantee/support letters.

Services for the Sponsor:

- A special orientation session for sponsored students.
- Student transcripts to show academic standing upon request.
- Special campus meetings for sponsors to meet with their students.
- Manage Financial Guarantee for Sponsorship

Activities of the International Student Office:

The University of Allahabad attracts a large number of foreign students in comparison to all other Indian Universities. Apart from offering a multi-cultural and inter-disciplinary learning environment, one of the main reasons for studying in Allahabad is the manageable cost of living and a favourable environment for education. Currently, we have around 145 students, from over 15 countries studying at the University and its affiliated colleges.

The International Students Office of the University of Allahabad assisted the International Students' Community, in acquiring information about the various courses, colleges, tuition fee structure, eligibility, accommodation, health insurance and the accommodation offered by the University. It was also operative in arranging for the students' admissions and their overall welfare.

The International Student Office administered the special over and above quota of International Students, created jointly by the Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) Government of India. The International Student Office acting as the nodal agency that coordinates all the activities related to the admission of International Students, provided facilities through a unique single-window system. Apart from handling the admissions and eligibility procedures, the International Student Office coordinated with the Indian Council for Cultural Research (ICCR), Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) and with different Embassies and Consulates for various purposes including getting scholarships as well as administering MoU's with International Partners of higher education.

The International Student Office acted as a liaison between the students, the various Departmental Heads, and the Heads of Colleges and Institutions affiliated under the University of Allahabad as well as the Heads of Chancery, Embassies, Consulates, their educational counselors and their educational wings, throughout the world or with any other agencies of the Government of India or the Government of other countries.

- In order to improve the procedures and to be versed with the best practices in other Academic bodies and thus boost the efficiency of the ISA's Office, the Vice Chancellor Prof. Rattan Lal Hangloo and the ISA Prof. Sanjeev Bhadauria are constantly in contact with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), New Delhi and other academic Institutions, Institutes and Organizations.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Introduction:

History: The Central Library has started its journey on the path of improvement. It was established to cater the needs of the students, research scholars, and teachers of the University. It not only helps in supporting the class room instructional programmes of the university, but also unfolds the horizon of knowledge with regard to the different research programmes carried out by the university.

The Central Library developed out of the library of the Muir Central College, Allahabad (established in 1872, and affiliated with the university from 1872 to 1922, when it was subsumed in the university upon beginning its career as a teaching university). Foundation stone of the university library building was laid by Sir John Hewett on 17th Jan.1910. The University Library was started in 1916. In 1946-47, Dr.S.R. Ranganathan, Father of Library Science in India, was invited to suggest ways and means of improving the library. He submitted the development plan in March 1947, which was published by the university in the same year. Its contents covered wide range of areas: such as new library building, manpower, finance and other relevant items. A special committee was constituted to review the library development plan submitted by Dr. Ranganathan. The committee pointed out that the central library building constructed in 1913-16 was inadequate. The most satisfactory thing would be to erect a new building designed in accordance with the modern library practice. It recommended the conversion of the Darbhanga Hall into a reading room for 500 under-graduates (250 on the ground floor and 250 on the first floor. A portion of the graduates reading room was to be divided into private cubicles for the use by serious students or research scholars. After some times it was felt that space in Darbhanga hall is inadequate to store the reading materials and provide library services.. The present library building was constructed in 1973. The present library building is more spacious and has potential for further expansion. The old library building is now occupied by the office of the Registrar, as well as Accounts and General section of the University.

Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC) and Anglo American Cataloguing Rules-2nd edition (AACR-2) are followed for the purpose of classifying and cataloguing the documents. LIBSYS-4, Library Management Software is being used for creation of database.

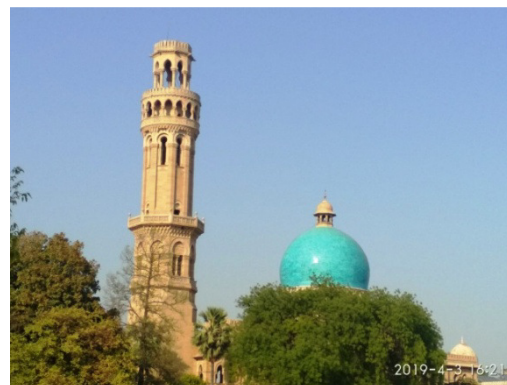
Dilapidated Tilak Bhawan was repaired & maintenance during the period. It will serve as mini auditorium for having seating capacity of 300 persons approximately.

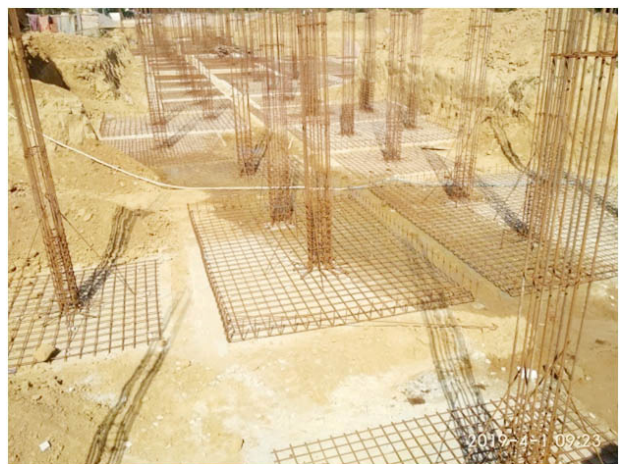
The University installed Solar panels for the capacity of 1.434 Mw during the period

Mushroom Production Training Programme for Farmers

Prof. M.P. Singh, Coordinator, Centre of Biotechnology & Bioinformatics and Nodal Officer, UIIC organized Mushroom Production Training Programme for farmers on 31st January 2019. He along with his scholars provided training to farmers to grow mushroom which can be used as an effective weapon against malnutrition. Prof. Singh told farmers about low cost mushroom cultivation technology on locally available agrowastes to sort out both the problems of agro-wastes accumulation and malnutrition by producing cheaper protein on valueless agro-wastes. This low cost technology can motivate farmers and underprivileged people to go for startup industry. This will mitigate unemployment and improve socio-economic condition of uneducated, unskilled landless poor farmers. This technology can also be used for remediation of heavy metals and toxins from coal washery effluents as well as dye industries

UGC HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Introduction:

The main aim of the Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) has been to facilitate quality education by upgrading the knowledge and performance of teachers serving in Universities and their affiliated Colleges. - Creating Computer Awareness and in this way developing IT trained human Capital for quality education of the future generation, Power point Presentation, LCD and OHP usage
- Revitalizing inputs for Higher education through Teacher empowerment, Inter-disciplinary dialogues, open and flexible Trans-disciplinary subjects, Innovative teaching Methodologies, Collaboration with Academic, Research and Specialized Institutes
- Creating awareness about the higher education System, Rules, Regulations, Statutes and Policies, Motivation for Research, Project Writing, Funding Agencies and Avenues
- Weaving Gender Justice and Gender Equality in the system through lectures/ workshops/seminars on Capacity Building, Gender Sensitization and Gender awareness
- Stressing the importance of mental and physical health by lectures and demonstrations by Yoga Experts and practice sessions by the teacher participants. This has become an integral part of all Orientation Programmes
- Organizing programmes and activities related to Social and Communal Harmony, Secularism and National Integrity such as lectures and Literary programmes, Essay Writing Competitions, Cultural Evenings, Group Discussions and Seminars
- Inviting eminent Resource Persons and Subject Experts for both OPs and RCs and giving teachers the opportunity to interact with them.

“NAAC” review of Human Resource Development Centre took place from February 27 -29, 2012 under the chairmanship of Prof. Sunil Gupta, the former Vice Chancellor of H P University, Shimla. Human Resource Development Centre is determined to work in accordance to recommendations given by the NAAC Peer Team and Academic Advisory Committee under the chairmanship of Hon’ble Vice Chancellor Prof. A K Singh.

During the session 2018-2019, for which the report is being submitted, the UGC-HRDC has successfully completed most of the programmes allocated by the UGC for the session. It has organized 4 out of 4 Orientation Programmes with 197 participants and 08 out of 09 Refresher Courses (Including Summer and Teacher Educators programme) with 302 participants. Besides the subject Refresher Courses conducted by the concerned department, 3 Interdisciplinary Refresher Courses were organized successfully by the HRDC. This included 1 ID in Human Rights, 1 ID in Media Studies and Governance and 1 Special Summer School in Social Science. It is my pleasure to report here that this HRDC has been ranked amongst the first ten HRDCs of the country based on the OPs and the RCs conducted by the HRDCs. (Detail attached Session 2018-2019)

OFFICE OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The office of the Professor In-charge Academic Programmes has been in the vanguard of the development activities of the university in the year under review as well. Keeping the momentum gained in the preceding years going, it lent support in speedy disposal of academic and other related matters through the committees constituted by the order of the Vice Chancellor. The major tasks entrusted were handled successfully and capped effectively are as follows:

1. As Coordinator, organised courses in various university departments by foreign expert under the auspices of MHRD sponsored scheme called Global Initiatives for Academic Network (GIAN)
2. Acted as Chairman of admissions of the courses of study of the university and completed entire
3. admission process for academic programmes on time. Introduced online component successfully for several courses
4. Acted as Chairman of the Advisory Committee of the AU Students' Union. Oversaw the smooth conduct of elections free from violence and ensuring compliance with the Lyngdoh Committee Recommendations
5. End to end processing of NIT for deployment of Security Agency and present before the Vice Chancellor for award
6. Processing of limited tenders for award of contract to operate canteen and mess in the campuses and hostels for welfare of students
7. Committee to prepare a report relating to academic, research, financial and infrastructural audit of the university (work in progress)
8. Governance of Ewing Christian College in the capacity of Special Officer on Duty. Ensuring effective academic, administrative and financial functioning of the College in the wake of the suspension of the College Managing Committee on charges of having indulged in gross mismanagement.
9. Chairman of the high Power Committee to make recommendations in respect of the management of the hostels owned by the trusts recognized by the university.

In addition to the above several other committees to inquire into the affairs involving students' indiscipline and hostel mismanagement were constituted under the chairmanship of Professor Incharge, Academic Programmes.

The office was also assigned the onerous task of holding Allahabad University Students' Union (AUSU) election for 2018 as the Chairman of the Students' Advisory. Traditionally considered to be a highly surcharged and sensitive event, efforts were successfully done to keep the entire election process peaceful and free from controversy.

The office also adroitly and successfully discharged its mandate to accomplish tasks under the ongoing projects of MHRD, GIAN Phase II and as a Spoke Partner with BHU-IIT as Hub for Design & Innovation Project (DIC), both schemes launched by Government of India.

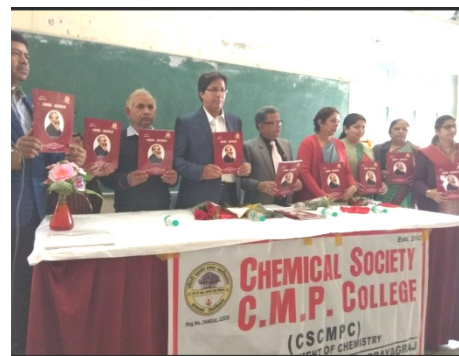
